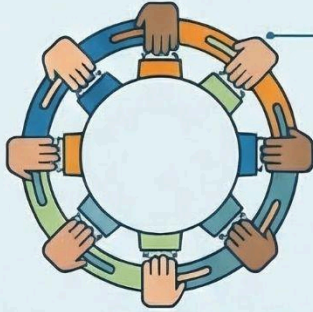


2026 Bozeman Public Schools Election: Supporting Our Educators with Revenue-Neutral Funding

Current staff pay has not kept pace with the area's rising costs; these levies provide the necessary funding to ensure Bozeman remains a competitive place for teachers to work and live.

WHY ISN'T IT \$0 FOR HOMEOWNERS?
Because Big Sky is now a separate school district, they no longer pay into these levies, slightly shifting the distribution among remaining Bozeman taxpayers.
