

Credit Recovery 2026

Credit Recovery - Summer school exists to help students make up a course they failed in the school year and will be held in person at Ryan Middle School. **Summer school students have the opportunity to recover credit for up to 2 semesters over the course of the summer school session to achieve a passing grade.**

Students will work with the summer school teachers to create an individualized plan to get their failing grades from the school year up to the level of passing. Summer school helps students earn credit to stay on track to graduation. Summer school is specifically targeted to students who failed a course with a final grade percentage of 45%- 59.9%, however, other eligible and motivated students may participate.

Credit Recovery course grades consist of students completing work during the summer session that fills in gaps left from the original class, according to their individualized learning plan. Some students will have a lot of work to complete, and others will have less. Students are required to attend daily until they meet the plan to get the credit by earning a passing grade up to a C.

Logistics:

- Credit Recovery will go from 9:00 am to 12:30 pm, Monday through Thursday at Ryan Middle School, 1450 Cowles St. A shuttle bus will be available for students to and from North Pole Middle School to Ryan Middle School. Pickup at NPM at 8:30 am, return to NPM at 1 pm.
- Classes will go from June 1st - June 25th or until the student completes their course(s).
- **Daily attendance is required until the student completes their credit recovery plan.** If students complete one credit recovery course, they may begin work on another with the completion of the plan with the teacher.
- The grade earned in summer school will be posted on a student's transcript.

ACTIVITIES ELIGIBILITY - District-approved summer school courses, when completed by July 10, 2026, will be calculated with the spring semester grades when determining eligibility for the first quarter activities for the following school year. The re-calculation of the student's GPA and determination of eligibility status shall occur immediately upon receipt by the district of documented final grades. The effects of retaking courses and calculation of GPA shall be done according to FNSBSD Admin. Regulation 974.1.
