California school districts are required to approve interim financial reports twice each fiscal year. The Fresno Unified School District 2025/26 Second Interim Financial Report is presented for approval and reflects a positive certification of the district's financial condition. The report is based on the January 31, 2026, year-to-date revenue and expenditures as required by state law. The Superintendent **recommends approval** of the Second Interim Financial Report for submission to the County Superintendent of Schools. Fiscal impact: A positive certification reflects that the district's projected reserve for 2025/26 at \$93.2 million exceeds the minimum required reserve for economic uncertainties

(2%).

Additionally, projections indicate a positive cash balance for the current year and two subsequent years. The support material reflects a multi-year projected budget for the Unrestricted General Fund and utilizes the State assumptions developed by the California County Superintendents Educational Services Association. This is in addition to piggyback and cooperative contracts previously approved by the Board and is intended to allow for expedited purchases related to strategic consulting, fuel storage, health and medical supplies, fleet management, digital scoreboards and other eligible goods and services. Use of piggyback contracts and cooperative purchasing agreements are authorized under Public Contract Code §20188 and Government Code §6500, et seq. respectively, and they are recognized as cost effective procurement methods that leverage competitively solicited contracts awarded by other public agencies or purchasing cooperatives. The Superintendent **recommends approval**. Fiscal impact: Estimated annual expenditures for each piggyback or cooperative contract (if utilized) are indicated in the backup material; funding will be determined on a project-by-project basis.
