New Florida Law Requires ECG Screenings for New FHSAA Athletes Beginning This Year

Who Needs an ECG?

- Rising 2026 – 2027 Freshmen trying out for and/or participating in FHSAA interscholastic athletics in any/all sports
- New Student-Athletes in Grades 10 – 12, those who did NOT play FHSAA sports previously

Note: Returning FHSAA student-athletes are NOT required to have an ECG, however, ALL student-athletes must complete a sports physical documented on the FHSAA EL2 form. ECGs are NOT required for Band, ROTC, Dance, or Flagline.

- All student-athletes are encouraged to receive their screening a minimum of three months ahead of their athletic season start date.
