Parents who have concerns with their child’s physical development, learning skills, emotions, behavior, speech, or language, please contact our school district’s Special Education Department.

The Special Education Department can guide you through the steps to see if your child might qualify for special education support. This includes explaining your rights as a parent, how the evaluation process works, and what types of services might be available for your child based on their age and needs.

Services and eligibility depend on your child’s age—whether they are an infant, preschooler, or school-aged. For school-aged children in public schools, teachers and staff will first try all available support through regular education before considering special education services.

If your child attends a private school but lives within Riverside Unified School District boundaries, OR lives in another LEA but attends a private school located within Riverside Unified School District Boundaries, you should reach out to both the private school and the school district’s Special Education Department to learn more about getting support or services.
