Dear Families and Staff,

The health and safety of our students and staff are our top priorities. To ensure a safe environment, Danville Elementary recently completed state-required testing for lead in our school's drinking water.

What You Need to Know

In accordance with New Hampshire law (RSA 485:17-a), schools must notify families if any water source shows lead levels at or above **5 parts per billion (ppb)**.

During our recent testing, some fixtures were identified as reaching this level. We are taking immediate action to address these specific areas:

- **Immediate Safety:** Any affected water outlets have been clearly marked "Do Not Drink" or have been turned off completely.
- **Repairs Underway:** We are already in the process of replacing the affected fixtures to resolve the issue as quickly as possible.

This letter serves as one of our two required public notifications. We are committed to transparency and will keep you updated as repairs are completed and the water is re-tested.

Thank you for your continued support in keeping our school community safe.
