- F. **RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING SUBMISSION OF FY2026 LOCAL RECREATION IMPROVEMENT GRANT (LRIG) APPLICATION NEW JERSEY DEPARTMENT OF COMMUNITY AFFAIRS**

**WHEREAS**, the Rockaway Borough Board of Education seeks to apply for funding under the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs FY2026 Local Recreation Improvement Grant (LRIG) Program; and

**WHEREAS**, the proposed project entitled "**Rockaway Borough School District Baseball and Softball Field Rehabilitation Project**" consists of the rehabilitation of the district-owned baseball and softball fields located at Thomas Jefferson Middle School; and

**WHEREAS**, the project will improve the safety, accessibility, drainage, grading, and overall usability of the baseball and softball fields through removal and replacement of infield materials, professional grading and leveling, reconstruction of pitching areas, repair of transition areas, and replacement of bases and related equipment; and

**WHEREAS**, the total project cost is **\$80,000**, consisting of a **\$75,000 grant request** from the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs and **\$5,000 in local in-kind staff support** for project oversight and follow-up; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rockaway Borough Board of Education certifies that the project will be completed on district-owned property and that the Board has the administrative and fiscal capacity to comply with all applicable state regulations, reporting requirements, and grant conditions; and

**WHEREAS**, the Rockaway Borough Board of Education commits to providing the required local share and to ensuring that no duplication of funding occurs;

**NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED** that the Rockaway Borough Board of Education hereby authorizes the submission of the FY2026 Local Recreation Improvement Grant application to the New Jersey Department of Community Affairs in the amount of **\$75,000**; and

**BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED** that the Board authorizes the Superintendent of Schools and the School Business Administrator to execute all documents necessary for the submission of the application and, if awarded, to execute any grant agreements and related documents required to implement the project in accordance with grant guidelines; and
