Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative Fee Schedule Program

Free Behavioral Health Services for Students

Colton Joint Unified School District is committed to supporting the behavioral health and well-being of all of our students. This includes providing school-linked behavioral health services. To sustain and expand these services, our district participates in the Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI) Multi-Payer Fee Schedule program, which allows for reimbursement from Medi-Cal and commercial health plans for eligible services provided to students under the age of 26.

How does it Work?

The Children and Youth Behavioral Health Initiative (CYBHI) will increase the availability of mental health services on school campuses. In order to participate in this program, CJUSD collects health insurance information for all students. The CYBHI Multi-Payer Fee Schedule program allows CJUSD to receive reimbursement from Medi-Cal and commercial health plans for eligible services provided to students under the age of 26. These services include but are not limited to: counseling services, psychoeducation, and anticipatory guidance/health teaching.

Parent/Caregiver Consent

To receive reimbursement for services, CJUSD must have parent/guardian consent to disclose personally identifiable information (PII) for the purpose of processing claims for reimbursement: name, birthdate, gender and medical service (including the type, date, duration, and the name of the service provider). Parents/guardians usually provide consent during data confirmation. If you have not provided consent, you may still do so by contacting your school's Counselor or Wellness Center Associate.

What happens if I don't want to provide this information?

Your child may still receive no-cost mental health services at school. However, if you decide not to provide your child's health insurance information, your school cannot access these critical sources of funding for schools. Your decision to provide (or not provide) your child's health insurance information WILL NOT affect your child's eligibility for these services.
