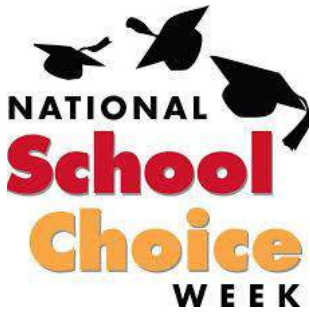

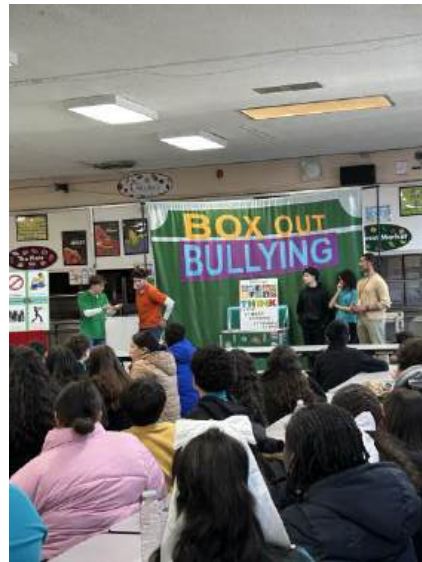


Box Out Bullying Workshop

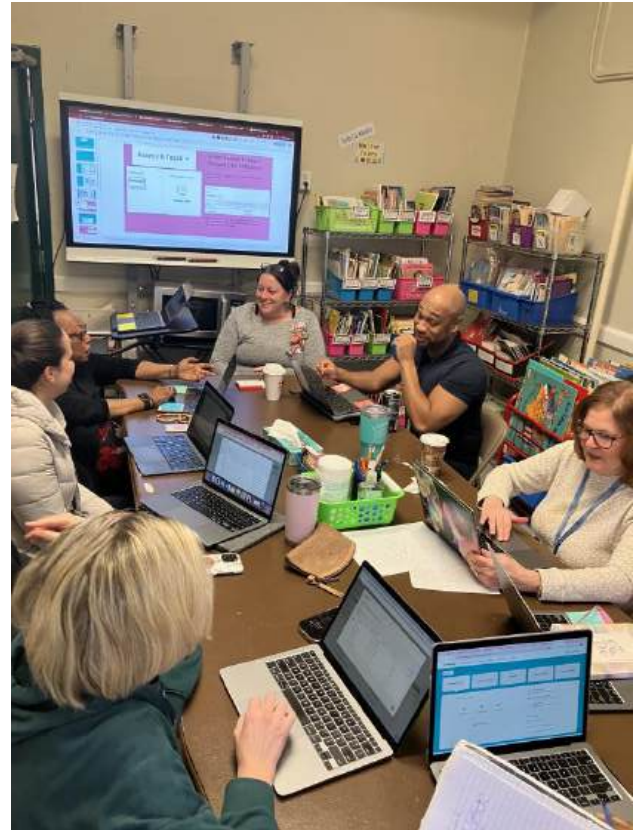
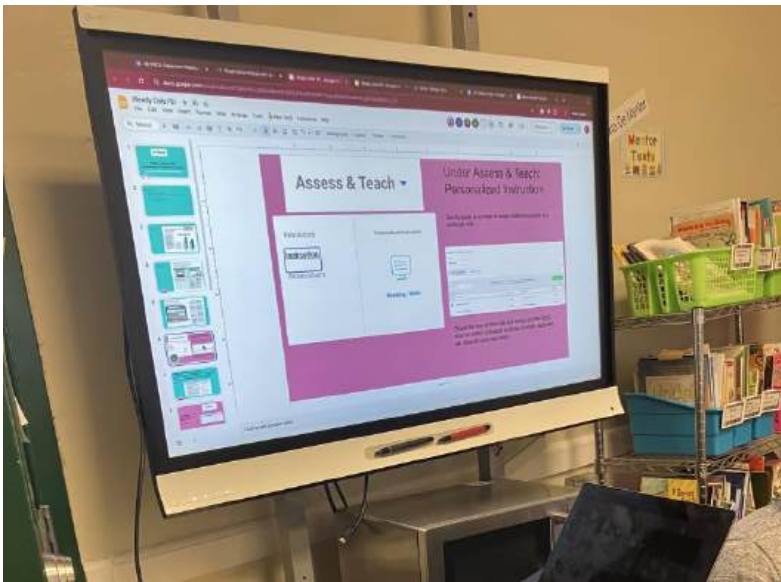


Data Driven Professional Learning Communities
