Cereal Box Book Report Directions

Students will decorate a real cereal box with the illustrations and information related to the book they read using the directions below. I expect a lot of time, effort, and hard work to be put into these reports, not for them to be completed sloppily in one night. I also expect all directions to be followed, so a copy of the rubric that will be used to grade the book report has been attached.

FRONT OF BOX: Use a piece of white or light colored paper to cover the front of your cereal box. (You will probably want to create the cover before gluing it on your box.) Include the name of the cereal and a picture. Invent a name for the cereal that is related to the title of the book and sounds like a cereal. Do not use the exact title of the book. You may want to look at the attached page of real cereal boxes to get some ideas. Choose a shape for the cereal as well as colors and ingredients that all relate to the book. For example, for Harry Potter and the Sorcerer's Stone, you might invent a cereal called Wizard Wands, a toasted oat cereal in the shape of miniature lightning bolts.

RIGHT SIDE: Make a list of ingredients that includes the story elements CHARACTERS and SETTING. Under the heading "Ingredients," list the main character and write a sentence about each one. Then describe the setting. You can use the template on the website or cover the side with white/light colored paper and do this your own way.

LEFT SIDE: Write a summary that describes the book. Try to use words that will "grab" readers' attention and make them want to buy your cereal. You can use the template on the website or cover the side with white/light colored paper and do this your own way. Your summary must be three to five sentences.

BACK OF BOX: Design a game that is based on the book. It can be a puzzle, a word search, a word scramble, a maze, a crossword puzzle, a hidden pictures illustration, or any other fun activity that might be found on the back of a cereal box. Make sure it includes information from the book.

TOP OF BOX: Include the title, author, number of pages, and number of stars you would give this book if you were a book critic. Also, include your name. The maximum number of stars would be 5. Use the template on the attached sheet.

PRIZE: Cereal boxes often include a prize. Your prize must be something related to the topic of your book. You can even include a picture of the prize on the front of your box to let the reader know what is inside the box.

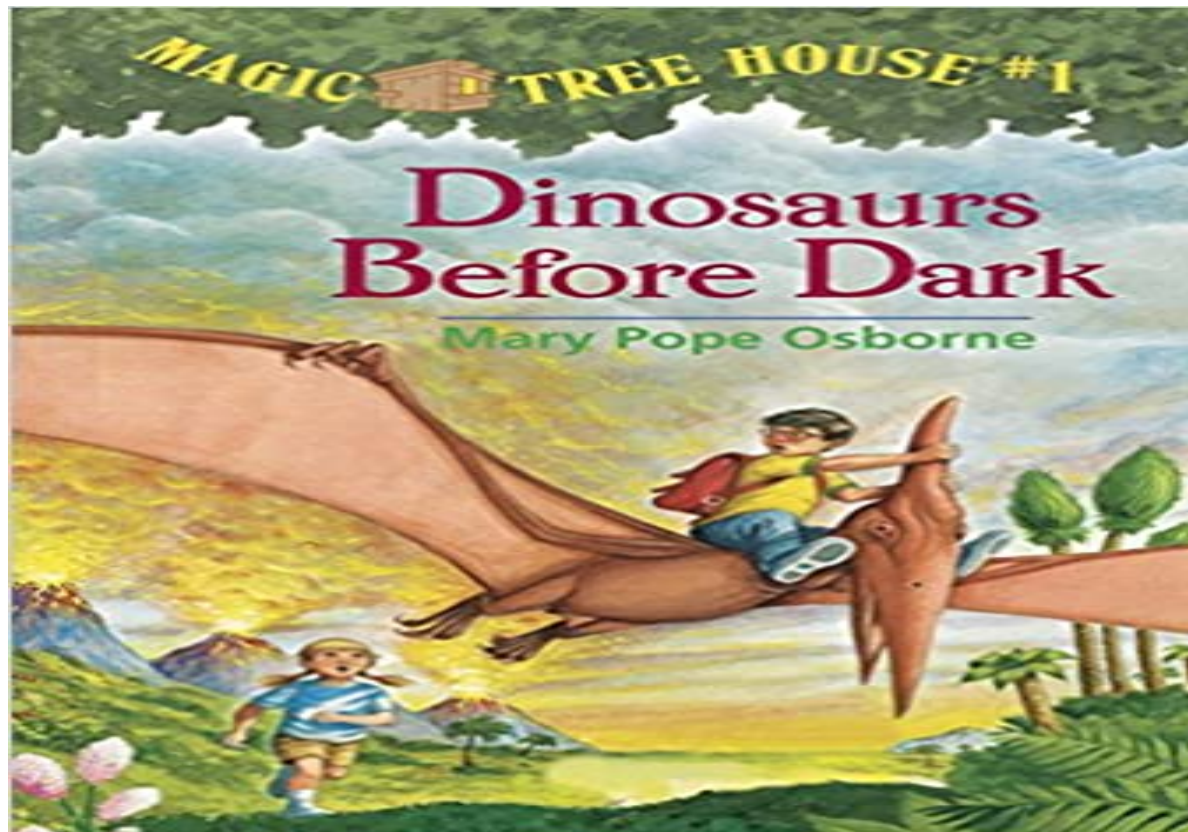

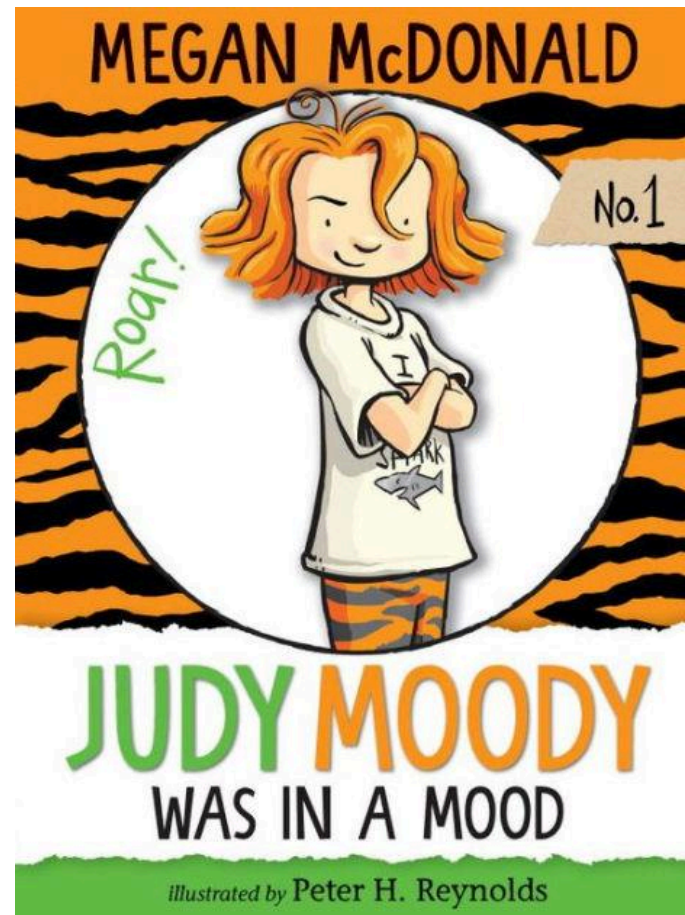

Cereal caja libro informe instrucciones

Los estudiantes decorarán una caja de cereal real con las ilustraciones y la información relacionada con el libro que leyeron siguiendo las instrucciones a continuación. Espero que se dedique mucho tiempo, esfuerzo y trabajo duro a estos informes, no que se completen descuidadamente en una noche. También espero que se sigan todas las instrucciones, por lo que se adjunta una copia de la rúbrica que se utilizará para calificar el informe del libro.

FRENTE DE LA CAJA: Use un pedazo de papel blanco o de color claro para cubrir el frente de su caja de cereal. (Probablemente querrá crear la cubierta antes de pegarla en su caja). Incluya el nombre del cereal y una imagen. Inventa un nombre para el cereal que esté relacionado con el título del libro y suene como un cereal. No utilice el título exacto del libro. Es posible que desee consultar la página adjunta de cajas de cereales reales para obtener algunas ideas. Elija una forma para el cereal, así como colores e ingredientes que se relacionen con el libro. Por ejemplo, para Harry Potter y la piedra filosofal, podrías inventar un cereal llamado Wizard Wands, un cereal de avena tostada en forma de relámpagos en miniatura.

LADO DERECHO: Haz una lista de ingredientes que incluya los elementos de la historia PERSONAJES y ESCENARIO. Bajo el título "Ingredientes", enumera el personaje principal y escribe una oración sobre cada uno. Luego describe el escenario. Puede usar la plantilla en el sitio web o cubrir el costado con papel blanco o de color claro y hacerlo a su manera.

LADO IZQUIERDO: Escribe un resumen que describa el libro. Trate de usar palabras que "captan" la atención de los lectores y les haga querer comprar su cereal. Puede usar la plantilla en el sitio web o cubrir el costado con papel blanco o de color claro y hacerlo a su manera. Su resumen debe ser de tres a cinco oraciones.

PARTE POSTERIOR DE LA CAJA: Diseña un juego basado en el libro. Puede ser un rompecabezas, una búsqueda de palabras, un juego de palabras, un laberinto, un crucigrama, una ilustración de imágenes ocultas o cualquier otra actividad divertida que se pueda encontrar en la parte posterior de una caja de cereal. Asegúrese de que incluya información del libro.

PARTE SUPERIOR DE LA CAJA: Incluya el título, el autor, el número de páginas y el número de estrellas que le daría a este libro si fuera un crítico de libros. Además, incluya su nombre. El número máximo de estrellas sería de 5. Utilice la plantilla de la hoja adjunta.
