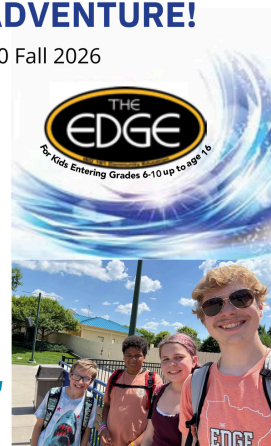

Important Dates

March 1, 2026: Registration opens for students currently enrolled in ISD 191.

Registration Process

You can register online through the ISD 191 Community Education website via the Arux Community Portal. The process includes:

Selection: Choose your desired child care program.

Information: Enter emergency contacts and answer required questions.

Scheduling: Select specific schedules and contracts.

Payment: Submit required payment information.

Status & Approval

Pending Status: After submission, you will see a confirmation page. Your request will remain in "pending approval" status while being processed. Processing may take up to 5 business days.

Official Notification: Registration is only complete once you receive an automated email confirming that your contract has been approved. The registration fee will be processed at the time of approval.

Note: Registration is typically accepted on a first-come, first-served basis, space permitting.

Inclusive Opportunities for Adults

River Valley Project Explore

Project Explore is a Community Education program designed to serve adults with physical and developmental cognitive disabilities by encouraging inclusion in community activities and providing customized learning, social and recreational opportunities. Project Explore serves Minnesota cities south of the Twin Cities metro including Apple Valley, Burnsville, Eagan, Farmington, Lakeville, Randolph, Rosemount and Savage.

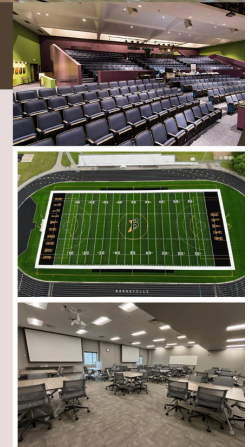
