# How to help my child prepare for kindergarten:

- Practice name writing.
- Read to your child daily.
- Set age appropriate expectations for your child to clean up after themselves. Children this age love to help, but they need to be taught these skills!
- Practice counting items for fun.
- Talk about your daily schedule.
- Encourage independence.
- Give your child opportunities to connect with peers their age.
- Promote sleep (pretty please).

Ages 3-5 years: 10-13 hours (including naps)
