The Minnesota State Amateur Baseball Tournament

Coming to Chaska, Jordan, New Prague and Shakopee!

The Minnesota State Amateur Baseball Tournament is celebrating its 103rd Anniversary in 2026. Chaska, Jordan, New Prague, and Shakopee will be hosting the 32 team Class B and 48 team Class C Tournaments. Teams will be vying for the title of State Champion for ten days over three long weekends starting on August 16, 2024. After approximately 70 games, the tournament culminates with championship games on Labor Day weekend.

The tournament is expected to draw between 25,000 and 30,000 spectators, 80 teams and over 1,400 players. It is a fabulous opportunity for communities around the state – from rural to urban – to come together for a summer activity that is part of a century and generations – old tradition.

There will be various options for volunteering during the state tournament to make this a great tournament. Please see the dates below for the weekend dates of the tournament.

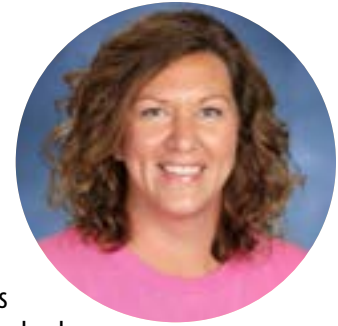

Along with our *Parent Aware Rated* preschool and ECFE programs, **we also offer early intervention services to families with children birth to Kindergarten**, ensuring even our youngest are reaching their milestones and receive help *when extra help is needed*.

Birth to 3 Intervention

Our Early Intervention staff will provide a system of services that help babies and toddlers with developmental delays or disabilities. Based on the family needs and priorities, the school staff will help the family problem solve and give information and ideas of activities they can do to enhance play and daily routines. They also help to connect families with community resources and supports as needed.

Age 3-6 Intervention

The **Early Childhood Special Education (ECSE) Preschool Program** provides learning experiences in all areas of development including social, self help, motor, communication, and cognitive skills. Children who have been identified with a developmental delay can benefit from many types of services within the ECSE classroom including speech, occupational, physical and vision therapies and assistive technology. ECSE services can also be provided in an inclusive setting within the regular preschool program offered in our Elementary School (Jordan Preschool).

Has your three year old been screened?

The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance.

Jordan Preschool, a Parent Aware 4-Star Rated Program, is a caring, warm and happy place for preschoolers to learn and grow. Our preschool offers an expanded traditional curriculum in a preK-4 setting. This means learning beyond the traditional preschool room! To prepare for Kindergarten and beyond, **your child will be oriented to the amenities of our elementary school - art, music, gym, media center, outdoor STEAM exploration, and a hot lunch option for full-day preschool.**

Preschool has a literacy-based curriculum that incorporates the SMART room, Handwriting without Tears and SMART board activities, meeting State Indicators of Progress, Kindergarten Readiness, and field trips through the year. Personal and social wellness is nurtured through the Pyramid Model – a positive intervention strategy supporting social-emotional well being of child. Our inclusive classrooms recognize the diversity of students, enabling all students to access the curriculum, fully participate in learning activities and demonstrate their knowledge and strengths at assessment.

Early Learning Services is located on the west end of Jordan Elementary School at 815 Sunset Drive, Jordan, MN 55352. Please enter using the Jordan Early Learning Services (ELS) doors on the back side of the building (near the ELS Playground).



REMINDERS

- A **\$20.00 administrative fee** will be charged for withdrawing from a class. Refunds for classes or special events must be requested 5 working days prior to the start of class or event. No refunds will be granted after this date. Please register at least one week prior to the start of class or special event.
- Phone registrations will be guaranteed only after payment has been received.
- Classes are filled on a first-come, first-serve basis. In order to hold a class, a minimum of five families must be registered. **You ARE registered unless notified otherwise.**
- Jordan ELS **requires all students to have a current birth certificate, immunizations, photo release, and state enrollment forms on record.** These forms must be filled out before the second class in a series.

Scholarships Available Sliding Fee Scale

Fees help cover the costs for each class. No family will be turned away due to inability to pay. Reduced rates and scholarships are available. Call (952) 492-3233 for information on scholarships or reduced fees. If your income is less than these guidelines, you are eligible for waived or reduced fees.

Early Childhood Screening

Has your 3 year old been screened? The early childhood years from birth to the start of kindergarten are an important time of rapid learning and growth. Early Childhood Screening is a quick and simple check of how your child is growing and developing. Between the ages of 3 and 4, screening can detect possible health or learning concerns so that children can get help before they start school. Screening is required of all children in Minnesota prior to Kindergarten entrance. The earlier the better! Early Childhood Screening is not a Kindergarten readiness test or IQ test. Waiting until your child is 4 or 5 to screen may be too long.

¿Se ha examinado a su hijo de 3 años? Los primeros años de la niñez, desde el nacimiento hasta el comienzo del jardín de infantes o kinder, son un momento importante de rápido aprendizaje y crecimiento. La evaluación en la infancia temprana (Early Childhood Screening) es una verificación rápida y sencilla de cómo está creciendo y desarrollándose su hijo. Entre los 3 y 4 años, la evaluación puede identificar posibles problemas de salud o de aprendizaje para que los niños puedan recibir ayuda antes de que comiencen la escuela. 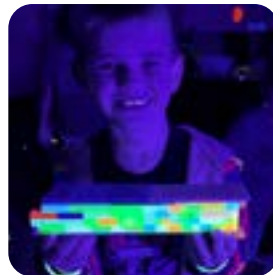

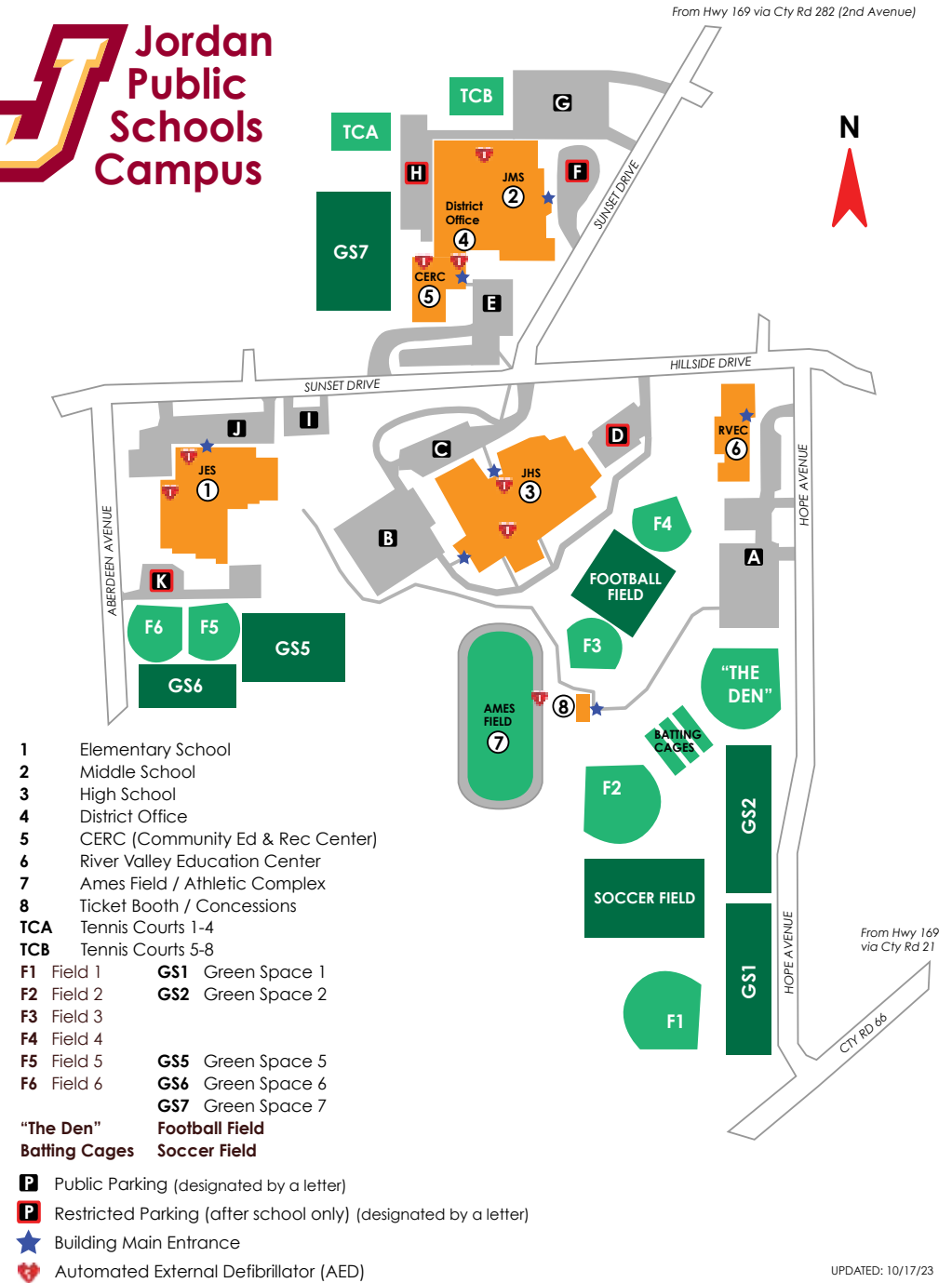
