

What is PBIS?

PBIS is the system we use to teach our students the expectations we have in our building. It is a proactive approach to promote positive behavior. There are three overall expectations that we have our students follow: **Be Safe, Be Responsible, and Be Respectful.** Each of these are then reviewed and discussed for the various areas in our school (hallways, restrooms, before and after school, playground, lunchroom, and assembly expectations).

Attached is our “Expectations by Setting,” for our school and the terminology we use with our students. Please review these expectations with your child at home. We review and practice these expectations at the beginning of each quarter, and at times, daily. This is so students have clear expectations, therefore should be able to follow them with success. Paws, our school mascot, has even made us videos to demonstrate and reinforce these behaviors!

You will see posters with our expectations posted throughout the building. To reinforce these rules, your child(ren) will earn "Tiger Praise Tickets".

Tiger Praise Tickets

Part of our plan is to reward students for following expectations in all areas of the school. In doing so, students can earn Tiger Praise Tickets.

PBIS Store

At least once a month, students may shop at the Avery store, with their tickets, or save them for the next month. There is a wide variety of items in the store.

Whole School Rewards

Each quarter, we celebrate how the students have followed the expectations all quarter long with a whole school reward. In the past, there have been bounce houses, extra recess, movie days, and more.

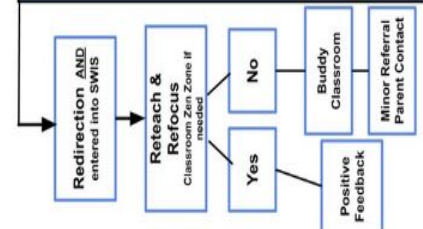
Classroom Rewards
