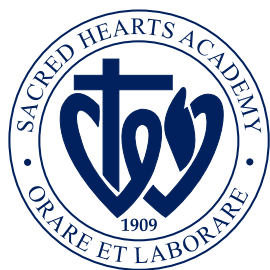

SESSION + CLASS OPTIONS

The **ACADEMY'S SUMMER EXPERIENCE** spans two sessions, both three weeks long:



SESSION I ▶ JUNE 8 TO 26

SESSION II ▶ JUNE 29 TO JULY 17

Students in **PRESCHOOL** to **GRADE EIGHT** can opt to attend:

- ▶ Only one of the two sessions
- ▶ Or both sessions.

Those in **GRADES NINE** to **12** can enroll in:

- ▶ Courses that span one session (*three weeks*)
- ▶ Classes that span two sessions (*six weeks*)
- ▶ Online courses with flexible completion dates.

PRESCHOOL (AGES THREE + FOUR)

The **ACADEMY'S PRESCHOOL SUMMER** experience is tailored just for *boys and girls ages three and four* and features themed classes full of discovery, laughter and hands-on fun!

Preschoolers will grow their knowledge and build key foundational skills in reading, mathematics, science and more as they navigate the themed sessions – having **“Fun in the Sun!”** and **“Camping and Caring for the ‘Aina.”**

Summer at the **ACADEMY'S PRESCHOOL** also features:

- ▶ Self-contained classes.
- ▶ A special **STEM WEEK** filled with exciting experiments and intriguing project builds.

KINDERGARTEN TO GRADE EIGHT

Key features of the **SUMMER PROGRAMS** for boys and girls in **KINDERGARTEN** to **GRADE EIGHT** include:

- ▶ A **Half-Day Program** from 8 a.m. to 12 noon.
- ▶ Choice of attending two classes of their interest per **SESSION** – built on the *Arts, Mathematics, Reading and English or Science*, and **SIXTH** to **EIGHTH GRADERS** can benefit from taking an **ENRICHMENT CAMP**.
- ▶ Continuing the dynamic and intriguing explorations began during the **HALF-DAY SESSION** into the **SUMMER EXTENDED PROGRAM**, which runs until 5:30 p.m. and features a wide array of activities on the agenda, ranging from STEM activities to sports and hula.

GRADE 9 TO 12

During the **SUMMER PROGRAM**, boys and girls in **GRADES NINE** to **12** have the option of enrolling in:

- ▶ **ON-CAMPUS** and **ON-CAMPUS HYBRID** courses for **Credit** or **Non-Credit** plus special **ENRICHMENT CAMPS**.
- ▶ Flexible, **ON-CAMPUS ONLINE** and **ONLINE** courses through **Pearson** for **Credit Recovery** with study from June to August.
- ▶ **Dual Credits** classes through **Accelerate ASU**. These students will earn high school credits and college credit that appears on their transcript.

TUITION + FEES

TUITION + FEES

Tuition and fees vary, based on the number and type of courses taken.

A refund, minus a \$50 registration fee may be obtained if a student withdraws on or before April 14.

A refund minus a \$100 fee will be given if a student withdraws from April 15 to May 31.

Fifty percent of tuition paid will be refunded if a student withdraws from June 1 to 7.

No refunds will be given after June 7.

**Available only to those purchasing a meal plan*

Students may order lunch and snacks from Sodexo, the school's food service provider using a Mealtime account.

These accounts can be purchased after registration is complete and students receive identification credentials.

In addition to snack costs, six-week meal plans to pay for hot lunches only are also available for purchase.

Offerings meet USDA nutrition guidelines. These must be purchased before June 8.

Students are encouraged to bring their own water bottles and must never share drinks, utensils or food.

Refills for water bottles will be done by their teachers and staff as needed.

ADDED HEALTH REQUIREMENTS

Students currently enrolled and attending **PRESCHOOL** to **GRADE 12** in Hawai'i and the continental United States* do not need to submit health examination requirements to attend the **ACADEMY'S SUMMER PROGRAMS**.

However, **INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS** currently attending school in a country outside of the United States are required to submit additional documents before attending the **ACADEMY** during the **SUMMER**. These documents must be in English or have an English translation:

- ▶ Current TB test result from an evaluation conducted in the United States (**Requested for out-of-state students*).
- ▶ A complete physical.
- ▶ Immunization records (*from country of origin for details only acceptable*).

CONDUCT STANDARDS

Students at the **ACADEMY** are expected to uphold the following standards:

- ▶ Be respectful and kind in their relations with others at all times and be respectful of authority.
- ▶ Complete all required class work and assignments promptly.
- ▶ Take care of school property and the property of other students and teachers.
- ▶ Refrain from the use of abusive and offensive language, verbally as well as online.
- ▶ Turn off and put away cell phones during class time, unless specified by the instructor as needed for classroom projects.

- ▶ Be truthful and honest at all times.
- ▶ Keep classrooms and campus areas clean.
- ▶ Dress modestly and neatly at all times (*Refer to Attire Standards below*).

ATTIRE STANDARDS

Uniforms are not worn during the **ACADEMY'S SUMMER PROGRAMS**, and student attire should be neat, clean and modest.

All boys and girls must wear shoes or sandals – with or without socks – that have backstraps. Swimwear, tank tops, bare midriiffs, tees with inappropriate language or designs and extra-short shorts are not acceptable at any time.

Students not adhering to the dress code will be sent home and required to change.

PRESCHOOL PROCEDURES FOR DROP-OFF + CHECK-IN

Preschoolers attending the **ACADEMY'S SUMMER PROGRAMS** must be checked-in by authorized adults.

Students can be dropped-off at the **PRE-SCHOOL** facility starting at 7 a.m.

Authorized adults completing check-in and drop-off procedures can park in designated stalls in the parking lot fronting Waialae Avenue.

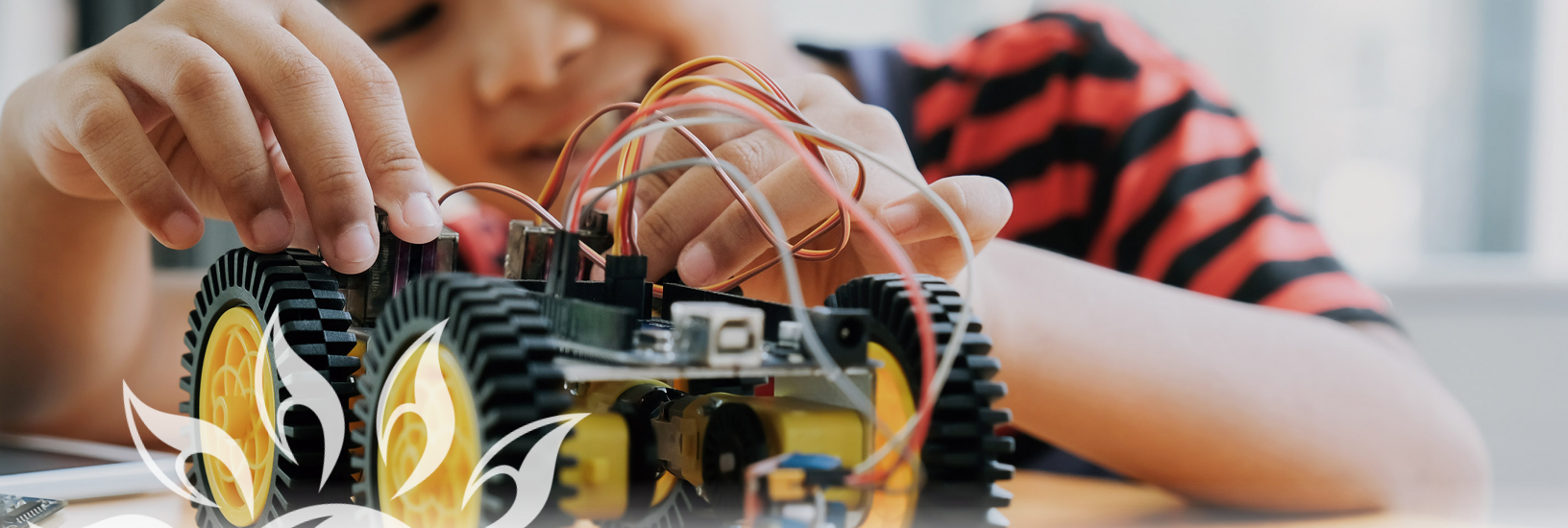

Through this partnership, students can enroll in flexible online credit-recovery courses in *English, Math, Science and Social Studies* which help them meet graduation requirements while reinforcing core academic skills.

Recovery courses are typically accessible from June to August, and students interested in these classes must coordinate their enrollment with their counselor.

ONLINE DUAL CREDIT COURSES

Through **ACCELERATE ASU**, students can enroll in **ONLINE DUAL CREDIT** courses that enhance and diversify their high school transcripts.

These college-level courses allow students to earn transferable college credit without committing to an Early College program.

Students enrolled in **DUAL CREDIT** courses will receive 0.5 high school credit that appears on the **ACADEMY** transcript, along with an **ASU** transcript with the designated college credit to be transferred to a college or university after graduation.

Students may take only one **DUAL CREDIT** course in the summer.

OPEN LEARNING LAB

During the **ACADEMY'S SUMMER PROGRAM**, students have access to the **OPEN LEARNING LAB** – available daily from 8 a.m. to 2:30 p.m.

This supervised learning space is designed to support students enrolled in online coursework by providing a structured environment for completing assignments, collaborating with classmates and staying on track academically.

Students may also use this time to schedule meetings with an academic counselor or teacher for additional guidance, check-ins, or targeted support.

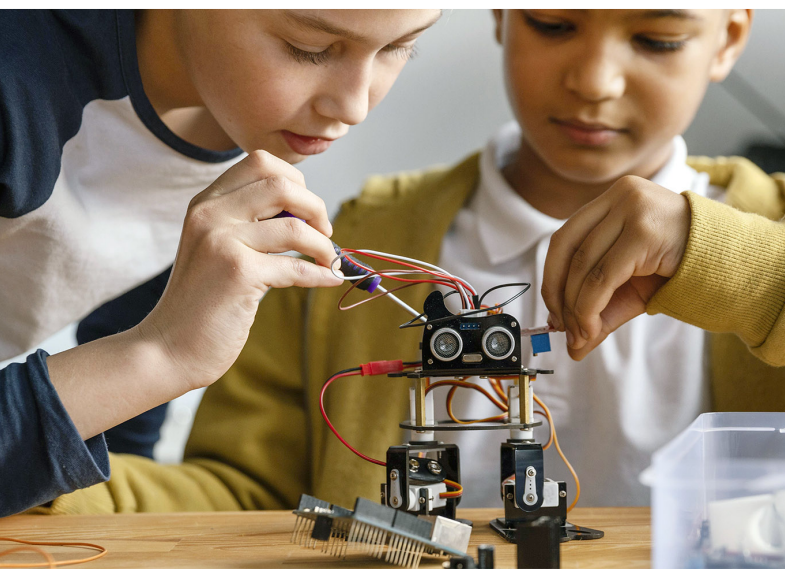

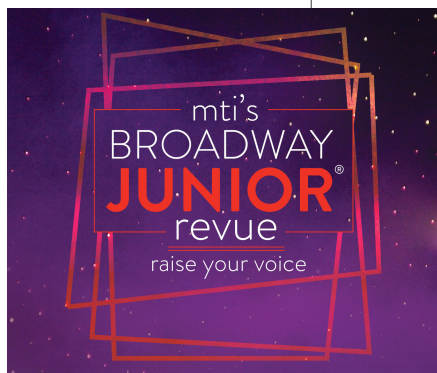

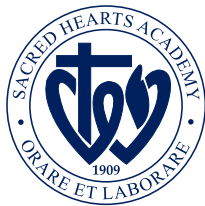
