## Scholarship Applicant:

These local scholarships are an important source of financial aid for your education after graduation. Therefore, it is vital that you complete your applications with care for consideration by the group(s) or individual(s) that offer them to our students. **The use of AI or ChatGPT is highly prohibited and will disqualify you from the scholarship.**

Things to consider when completing the application:

1. Make a rough draft of the information and the essay that you are asked to write.
2. Be sure to fill in all questions/blank spaces. If you are not sure of Class Rank, GPA, ACT/SAT, etc., please check in IC or see Mrs. Johnson. You CAN view this information when you view your transcript online via Infinite Campus. (*Documents > LHS Transcript*)
3. Make sure the essay is appropriate to the topic given and to the spirit of the scholarship. A well-written essay will not compliment your application if it does not answer the question/essay prompt. Essays should be at least 200 words in length unless otherwise specified.
4. Type the application carefully. Correct any misspelled words. Watch your grammar and organization. Appearance does count for something! Have someone proofread your application to check for errors!
5. **The applications are Google Docs. Open each one, make a copy of it, then save a copy to your own Google Drive for editing/printing. All applications need to be typed and printed.** Be sure that each application has any “extra” requirements with it (FAFSA, essay, signatures, etc.).  
**Do not staple, PLEASE paperclip each application.**

- Letters in one varsity sport
- Unweighted GPA 3.0+
- Financial need
- At least 4 years in the Ludlow Youth Football Program  
(Including cheerleading)

Priority will be given to those planning to earn a Teaching Certificate (at EKU). Students must already be accepted to their college; an acceptance letter must be attached to the application.

- Must attach letter of acceptance to their college.

- Completed at least two years of varsity football
- Must have worked hard to overcome some type of obstacle in life (personal, family, physical, academic, or spiritual)

## GOETZ-KITSON MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: Wesley United Methodist Church and  
The Wesley United Methodist Women

BACKGROUND: This scholarship was established in 2003 in recognition of the 150th anniversary celebration of the founding of the Methodist congregation in Ludlow. It is named in memory of Mary A. Goetz and June Kitson. Both women were outstanding teachers and role models in the Ludlow Public School system; Miss Goetz taught in the elementary school for 51 years, and Mrs. Kitson taught high school math during the 1960s and early '70s. Both women were faithful members of Wesley United Methodist Church, and Mrs. Kitson was a leader in the United Methodist Women's organization. We provide this scholarship as a tribute to the service-filled lives of these two female Christian educators.

- Academic achievement
- Service to school/community (may include religious and service organizations)
- Effort and character
- Financial need
- Written essays

VALUE: \$500.00

BACKGROUND: This scholarship is given to remember the spirit of Jordan Logan, LHS Class of 2005. Jordan was a Substitute Teacher and Football Coach at Ludlow Independent Schools in 2010, when his untimely death occurred. This scholarship is awarded to remember Jordan's enthusiasm, his strong faith, his service to his school and community, and his drive and dedication.

CRITERIA: This scholarship will be awarded to someone who emulates Jordan's school and community involvement, his work ethic, and his integrity.

## LUDLOW ATHLETIC BOOSTERS SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: Ludlow Athletic Boosters

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS: Varies (Selected by Sponsoring Organization)

VALUE: Varies – To be determined each year

CRITERIA: The following criteria will be used to select scholarship recipients:

One male athlete meeting the following criteria for \$500:

- GPA 2.5+
- Two years of varsity play in two different sports/teams
- Verification by two varsity coaches
- Essay detailing how athletic involvement has impacted your life.

One female athlete meeting the following criteria for \$500:

- GPA 2.5+
- Two years of varsity play in two different sports/teams.
- Verification by two varsity coaches
- Essay detailing how athletic involvement has impacted your life.

**Sharri Ostendorf Singer Top Scholar Athlete Award** for \$1,000

- Minimum 3.0 GPA
- More than 2 years in 2 different sports – the more the better
- 4 Year Athlete Award – may be 1 sport for 4 years

## THE RITA WOFFORD DICKMANN MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: Rita Wofford Dickmann Memorial Scholarship Fund

BACKGROUND: This scholarship is awarded annually in honor of Rita Wofford Dickmann, a 1985 Graduate of Ludlow High School. She exhibited pride for her alma mater and the Ludlow community in general and took special interest in the Basketball Program.

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS: Varies (Selected by Sponsoring Organization)

VALUE: Varies

CRITERIA: The criterion for this award is as follows:

- Students must be enrolling in a 2 or 4 -year College or University in the Fall, a Trade School, or the Military
- Student must be a letterman in the boys or girls basketball program at Ludlow High School for at least two years
- Minimum 2.5 cumulative GPA required to apply

## LUDLOW EDUCATION FOUNDATION SCHOLARSHIP

CRITERIA: Based on overall school and community involvement and commitment, citizenship, and school pride

## LUDLOW NATIONAL HONOR SOCIETY SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: The Ludlow High School National Honor Society

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS: Varies (Selected by LHS Faculty Committee)

VALUE: Varies – Determined by funds available

CRITERIA: Student must be a member of NHS in good standing and be involved in school and/or community activities. Participation/involvement in NHS activities will be considered.

## LUDLOW CHRISTIAN CHURCH SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: (Former) Ludlow Christian Church

BACKGROUND: The Ludlow Christian Church, the oldest in Ludlow, was organized in 1840. They initially met in homes of the congregation and a little schoolhouse on Ash Street until 1850. Services were conducted by visiting ministers or members, with baptism in the Ohio River. The first church was erected in 1851 on the site where the present church stands today at Elm and Locust Streets. Mrs. Israel Ludlow, wife of founder of the city presented the congregation with a gift of land. This was in gratitude for her son becoming a Christian. A two-story brick structure, this first building also served as the Ludlow Public School. The Church was on the second floor. The old church also served as a community meeting place, and it was there in 1864 the city of Ludlow was organized. The city administration was housed there for several years. In 1895 the old building was torn down and replaced by the present structure. A new education wing was constructed and dedicated on April 1, 1962. The church has always supported community organizations and activities, as well as the programs of the Christian Church (Disciples of Christ). For many years the church was the meeting place for the Ludlow Rotary Club and Troop 20 of the Ludlow Boy Scouts. The existence, growth and preservation of this church for 165 years is a great tribute to the countless dedicated members, who worked with love and vision to serve the spiritual needs of the congregation and community. It is in their memory this scholarship has been awarded. (Sadly, the Ludlow Christian Church closed its doors in September of 2005.)

VALUE: \$500.00

CRITERIA: The following criteria are used to select scholarship recipients:

- Local church and community service involvement
- Financial need
- Academic achievement: minimum 2.75 GPA required
- Essays

## LUDLOW STUDENT COUNCIL SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: Ludlow High School Student Council

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS: Varies (Selected by LHS Faculty Committee)

VALUE: Varies – Determined by funds available

CRITERIA: Student Council membership, contribution to Student Council activities, involvement in various activities, character, leadership, daily school attendance, and positive influence at LHS are all factors that are considered.

## LUDLOW TEACHER SCHOLARSHIP

**SPONSORING ORGANIZATION:** The teachers and administration of the Ludlow Independent Schools wish to encourage Ludlow High School graduates to become teachers. We are, therefore, awarding an annual scholarship to a high school senior who intends to enter the field of education.

**NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS:** One (Selected by Ludlow District Committee)

**VALUE:** \$500

**CRITERIA:** These factors will be considered:

- 50% Academic achievement
- 20% Financial Need
- 10% Community involvement
- 10% Written essay
- 10% Interview

## THE PANTHER PRIDE SCHOLARSHIP

**SPONSORING ORGANIZATION:** Various Individuals and Families of Ludlow

**BACKGROUND:** These are awarded each year to one student per grade level (elementary and high school). To encourage students to stay in Ludlow Schools through the 12<sup>th</sup> grade, the scholarships will accumulate until they become a senior and earn their Ludlow High School diploma.

**NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS:** One per Grade Level (Selected by LHS Faculty Committee)

**VALUE:** \$200.00 each

**CRITERIA:** Based on academic achievement, daily school attendance, school involvement and spirit, positive attitude, and good citizenship.

## THE LUDLOW PTO SCHOLARSHIP

**SPONSORING ORGANIZATION:** The Ludlow Parent / Teacher Organization

**NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS:** One (Selected by Sponsoring Organization)

**VALUE:** \$500.00

**CRITERIA:** Student academic performance, extra-curricular participation, and community involvement will be considered. An essay concerning community involvement will be evaluated. A letter of recommendation from a teacher will also be required.

## TRUE CHARACTER SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: Friends of Ludlow High School

NUMBER OF SCHOLARSHIPS: One (Selected by the sponsors)

VALUE: \$500.00

CRITERIA: The scholarship committee will consider:

- Character traits: selflessness, humility, responsibility
- Overcoming adversity
- One letter of recommendation from a non-family member and a short-essay

## JOE AND CONNIE KLEIER TOOLS OF THE TRADE SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: The Family of Joe and Connie Kleier

BACKGROUND: The Joe and Connie Kleier tools of the trade scholarship is to be awarded to a senior planning to attend trade school or directly enter the work force in a trade related industry. This scholarship is to help with out-of-pocket expenses related to your trade such as clothing, equipment, and tools. This scholarship is not intended to be used for education costs but rather the supplies needed for the education and trade itself.

**BACKGROUND:** The Ludlow High School Sports Hall of Fame honors outstanding student-athletes, coaches, and contributors, often featuring an induction ceremony and dinner in the fall. Established to celebrate the rich, century-long history of the Panthers, the hall includes a dedicated museum room within the school's football stadium. Each year a 12-member board selects senior student-athletes and awards each a \$1,000 scholarship to assist with post-secondary education.

# DALE “BEAR” WAITE MEMORIAL SCHOLARSHIP

SPONSORING ORGANIZATION: Family and Friends of Dale “Bear” Waite

BACKGROUND: Dale” Bear” Waite, class of 1953, was an outstanding multi-sport athlete at both Ludlow High School and the University of Kentucky, excelling not only in competition but also in leadership and teamwork. Beyond athletics, he was deeply committed to the Ludlow community, serving for over 35 years as manager of the Ludlow-Bromley Swim Club where he positively impacted countless members of the community and employees. In recognition of his dedication and accomplishments, he has been inducted into the Ludlow Sports Hall of Fame and the Northern Kentucky Sports Hall of Fame, leaving a lasting legacy both on and off the field. Upon his passing in January 2026, Dale’s family established this scholarship in order to honor his love of athletics and the Ludlow community.
