2. PURPOSE

The District seeks a qualified painting contractor(s) to provide:

- Interior painting
- Surface preparation
- Minor patching and repairs

This contract is intended to support routine building maintenance projects, particularly summer work performed between school years and during student recess periods.

Projects will be assigned building by building and/or room by room depending on District needs. Work to be assigned will be prioritized by the district's Director of Facilities or Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services in their absence.

Awarding contracts will be facilitated by the Assistant Superintendent for Administrative Services or Superintendent of Schools in their absence.

3. DISTRICT FACILITIES

Work may occur at any of the following locations:

North Tonawanda High School – 405 Meadow Drive, North Tonawanda NY 14120

North Tonawanda Intermediate School – 1500 Vanderbilt Avenue, North Tonawanda NY 14120

Alternate Locations

North Tonawanda Middle School – 455 Meadow Drive, North Tonawanda NY 14120

Drake Elementary School – 380 Drake Drive, North Tonawanda NY 14120

Ohio Elementary School – 625 Ohio Street, North Tonawanda NY 14120

Spruce Elementary School – 195 Spruce Street, North Tonawanda NY 14120

4. PROJECT TYPE

This contract is intended for maintenance painting projects, including:

- Classroom walls at NTHS. This will include required taping around blackboards, technology, door frames, and other windows which will be included in the contract. Most classroom ceilings will not be painted as they are drop tile ceilings.

- Removal of hardware, covers, plates, and similar items already in place that are removable and are not to be painted. If removal is impractical or impossible because of size or weight of item, provide surface-applied protection before surface preparation and painting.
- Hallways at NTI. This will include required taping around tile, door frames, windows, and other fixtures.
- Gymnasiums walls which will include the areas behind the bleachers, wall pads and backboards, **but not the ceiling**. Taping will be done around doorframes.

These projects are routine facility maintenance and not part of a capital construction project.

5. CONTRACT TERM

Initial term:

- **July 1, 2026 – June 30, 2027**

Optional additional classroom renewals by mutual consent:

- **July 1, 2027 – June 30, 2028**
- **July 1, 2028 – June 30, 2029**
- **July 1, 2029 – June 30, 2030**

*Renewal rates for future years will only be applied to per-diem average size classrooms based on pricing at North Tonawanda High School to classrooms throughout the district. Average size classrooms are designated as rooms between 900 – 1,100 square feet. Renewals are **subject to Board of Education approval**.

6. SCOPE OF SERVICES

The contractor shall provide all labor, materials, equipment, and supervision necessary to complete painting projects.

Services include:

Surface Preparation

- Scraping loose paint
- Sanding
- Patching holes and cracks
- Caulking
- Priming surfaces
- Taping

Painting

Application of coatings to:

- Walls
- Trim
- Doorframes

Protection

Contractor must protect:

- Floors
- Furniture
- Technology
- Fixtures

All items must be returned to their original condition after work.

Cleanup

The contractor shall:

- Remove debris
- Dispose of materials
- Clean paint spills
- Restore rooms to usable condition

At the end of each workday, remove rubbish, empty cans, rags, and other discarded materials from the project site. After completing the paint application, clean spattered surfaces. Remove

spattered paints by washing, scraping, or other methods. Do not scratch or damage adjacent finished surfaces.

7. MATERIAL SPECIFICATIONS

Paint products must be **commercial-grade professional coatings**.

8. APPLICATION

- A. Tint each undercoat a lighter shade to facilitate identification of each coat if multiple coats of same material are to be applied. Tint undercoats to match color of topcoat but provide sufficient difference in shade of undercoats to distinguish each separate coat.

- B. If undercoats or other conditions show through topcoat, apply additional coats until cured film has a uniform paint finish, color, and appearance.
- C. Apply paints to produce surface films without cloudiness, spotting, holidays, laps, brush marks, roller tracking, runs, sags, ropiness, or other surface imperfections. Cut in sharp lines and color breaks.

9. MAINTENANCE MATERIAL SUBMITTALS

- A. Furnish extra materials, from the same product run, that match products installed and that are packaged with protective covering for storage and identified with labels describing contents.
 - 1. Paint: 5 percent, but not less than 1 gal. of each material and color applied.
 - 2. Coating Maintenance Manual: Upon Conclusion of the project, the Contractor or paint supplier/manufacturer shall furnish a coating maintenance manual, such as Sherwin Williams “Custodian Project Color and Product Information” report or equal. Manual shall include an Area Summary with finish schedule, Area Detail designating where each product/color/finish was used, product data pages, Material Safety Data Sheets, care and cleaning instructions, touch up procedures, and color samples of each color and finish used.

10. DELIVERY, STORAGE, AND APPLICATIONS

Store materials not in use in tightly covered containers in well-ventilated areas with ambient temperatures continuously maintained at not less than 45 degrees.

- Maintain containers in clean condition, free of foreign materials and residue.
- Remove rags and waste from storage areas daily.

Apply paints only when temperature of surfaces to be painted and ambient air temperatures are between 50 and 95 degrees.

Do not apply paints when relative humidity exceeds 85 percent; at temperatures less than 5 degrees above the dew point; or to damp or wet surfaces.

Excess paint shall not be dumped down drains or sinks.

11. WORK TIME PERIODS & HOURS

- General Aggregate; limit \$4,000,000

Workers Compensation and Employers' Liability

- Each Accident; limit \$1,000,000
- Each Employee; limit \$1,000,000
- Disease; limit \$1,000,000
 - North Tonawanda City School District must have a waiver of subrogation

Professional & Sexual Molestation Liability

- Professional; limit \$2,000,000
- Sexual Molestation, limit \$1,000,000 per Occurrence and \$2,000,000 Aggregate
 - North Tonawanda City School District must be named as an additional insured and have a waiver of subrogation. Certificate must state that coverage is primary and non-contributory.

15. SAFETY REQUIREMENTS

Contractor must comply with:

- OSHA regulations
- NYS workplace safety laws
- District safety protocols

All workers must present valid governmental photo identification daily while on property, sign in through the district's *Raptor Visitor Management System* when clerical staff are present, and wear contractor apparel/visitor sticker while on property. Raptor Visitor Management is a program where governmental identification is run against sex offender databases identifying individuals who should not be present on school property.

If work occurs in buildings built before 1978, contractors must comply with lead paint safety regulations.

30% after completed work and inspection at North Tonawanda Intermediate School including necessary touch up work as deemed necessary by the Director of Facilities.

10% after project has been completed and final inspection at both North Tonawanda High School and North Tonawanda Intermediate including touch up work as deemed necessary by the Director of Facilities.

Package B

100% after completed work and inspection at North Tonawanda High School including necessary touch up work as deemed necessary by the Director of Facilities.

Package C

100% after completed work and inspection at North Tonawanda High School and necessary touch up work as deemed necessary by the Director of Facilities.

18. Payment Reduction

Package A

A 10% per classroom payment reduction will be assessed for each classroom painted between the dates of 8.24.2026 through 8.29.2026 at North Tonawanda High School.

A 25% per classroom payment reduction per room will be assessed for each classroom painted over the designated winter recess period at North Tonawanda High School.

*Painting will not occur between the dates of 8.30.2026 - 12.23.2026 at North Tonawanda High School.

A 1% payment reduction per day will be assessed for uncompleted work between the dates of 8.24.2026 through 9.5.2026 at North Tonawanda Intermediate (up to 10%).

A 2.5% payment reduction per day will be assessed for uncompleted work over the designated winter recess period at North Tonawanda Intermediate (up to an additional 15%).

Package B

A 2% payment reduction will be assessed per student instructional day impacted by uncompleted work upon student return from spring recess.

Package C

A 10% payment reduction will be assessed per student instructional day impacted by uncompleted work upon student return from recess. Given the critical instructional nature of these classrooms, contractors will have continuous daily access to these rooms upon return of students from their designated recess period until work has been completed.
