Jay has a total of twenty-nine years of theatrical experience (twenty-eight of those with UIL OAP) and is or has been involved with such groups as TETA, ACTF (Irene Ryan Award Nominee) and Texas Theatre Adjudicators and Officials (TTAO). He has also served on the UIL OAP Standards and Practices committee and, since 2009, has served as a UIL adjudicator and contest manager. Regarding UIL OAP, Jay believes first and foremost that OAP should be a learning experience for all involved.

Adjudicator

Travis Springfield

Travis Springfield graduated Summa Cum Laude with a BFA in Acting from Texas State University in 1991. He has been involved with educational theatre for the last 30 years as a classroom teacher, fine arts administrator, director, clinician, contest manager and judge. He worked with the campus UIL OAP production each of the nine years he taught theatre and has advanced to every stage of the contest including three trips to the State competition with a State Championship in 1997. Mr. Springfield is the founding Chair of the Texas Theatre Adjudicators and Officials (TTAO) and past member of the UIL Advisory Committee. He currently serves as Past-President of the Texas Educators of Theatre Association. He has adjudicated at all levels of competition including multiple state contests in 2009, 2012, 2013, 2017, 2018, 2021, 2023, and 2025. Mr. Springfield previously worked as Dean of Students and Lead Counselor for Houston's Kinder High School for the Performing and Visual Arts and served as Manager of UIL Academics for Houston ISD before moving to Fort Bend ISD to become the Assistant Director of Fine Arts for Theatre and Dance where he retired in the summer of 2024. Mr. Springfield also teaches as an adjunct professor for the University of Houston summer Master's program for theatre educators and has taught with the program since its inception. Keeping busy in retirement, Mr. Springfield works with over a one hundred and fifty one act play companies annually through contest and clinic, coordinates an annual conference with the Arts Schools Network as their conference manager, supports teachers in the classroom as a consultant for the Docentus group, and serves as the TTAO Support person. A product of UIL, Mr. Springfield's goal is to make every contest a positive educational experience for all participants.

Adjudicator

Marco Gonzalez

Marco Gonzalez is the Radio/TV/Film teacher at the Treviño School of Communications and Fine Arts. He taught at J.W. Nixon High School for 9 years before moving to VMT. Throughout his tenure at Nixon, Marco was the One-Act Play director and Film sponsor.

He has two State Championships and two State Runner-up prizes in the UIL Film contest. He also has two State One-Act Play appearances for the productions of Twelfth Night (2014) and Mother Courage and Her Children (2017), 4 Region appearances and 9 Area appearances. When not occupied with school activities, Marco is heavily involved in the Laredo arts community. He was Artistic Director for Laredo Theater Guild International from 2015-2023, where he directed several of the company's landmark productions including Frankenstein, In the Heights and Hedwig and the Angry Inch. He also works with the Laredo filmmaking community, most recently as Assistant Director and Casting Director of the HBO produced short film, "The Son Who Can't Play Trumpet."

Adjudicator

Sharna Shirl

Ms. Shirl is a graduate of Oklahoma Baptist University with a degree in theatre and education. She served as a theatre teacher in Houston ISD for 22 years and for 14 of those years directed plays for the UIL One-Act Play contest. Additionally her final eight of teaching she taught IB Theatre Arts--a course that includes theatre culture research, projects, and play dramaturgy. She has previously served two years on the board for the Texas Thespians Festival. Since retiring from teaching, she has filled her time with directing plays for the Fade to Black festival, directing South Main Summer Musicals and ushering at the Hobby Center for the Performing Arts. One of her greatest joys has been seeing her students receive scholarship awards for Texas Thespians and the Tommy Tune awards. Being a part of the UIL OAP family is a great honor and watching students' achievements on stage is a highlight of her year.
