



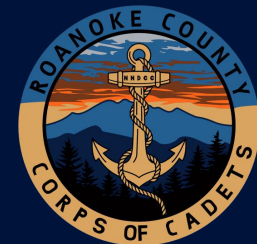

# NJROTC / NNDCC History

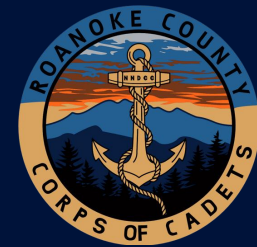


## Program Overview

- Established by Public Law in 1964 under Title 10, U.S. Code, Chapter 102.
- Offered in accredited secondary schools nationwide.
- The Navy created the **Navy National Defense Cadet Corps (NNDCC)** in 2011 as a pathway for schools not yet meeting NJROTC requirements.
- Led by carefully vetted, retired or service members with 8+ years of service. These are U.S. Navy and Marine Corps officers and senior enlisted instructors selected by Naval Service Training Command.



# Why NNDCC?



## Builds Better Students

- Higher **GPA, attendance, and graduation rates** than the national average
- Fewer **discipline issues and suspensions**

## Develops Character & Leadership

- Built on Navy Core Values: **Honor • Courage • Commitment**
- Builds confidence, discipline, teamwork, and responsibility

## Citizenship & Service:

- Community service, veteran support, school and local events

## Creates Real Opportunities

- College scholarships and ROTC pathways
- Service Academy nominations
- Free SAT/ACT and college prep resources

## Provides a Future Advantage

- Eligible for **advanced enlistment up to E-3 pay grade**, if they decide to enlist after high school
- Leadership experience that strengthens **college and job applications**

# Who Can Join NNDCC?



NNDCC is open to students who are ready to challenge themselves, grow as leaders, and represent their Roanoke County with pride. To participate, students must:

1. **Be enrolled and attending classes** at any Roanoke County High School.
2. **Be physically able to participate** in the school's physical education program.
3. **Be accepted into the program** by the NNDCC instructor with approval from the school administration.
4. **Maintain good academic standing**, with a minimum **2.0 GPA**.
5. **Demonstrate good conduct and character** (cadets who do not meet standards may be placed on probation from activities or dismissed from the program).
6. **Follow personal grooming and uniform standards** required of all cadets.
