Mr. Silva shared an update on each of the four goals, which were increase student learning through challenging academics, CTE programs, and consistent instructional practices across all school sites; cultivate positive relationships between staff, students, families, and the community; and by 2026-27, San Joaquin County Community School's graduation rate will improve by 10% as a result of expanded tiered interventions that address the academic, behavioral, social-emotional, health and well-being needs of English learners, long-term English learners, Homeless, Socioeconomically Disadvantaged, Students with Disabilities, African American, Hispanic, and White students.
