

Contract Proposals

The following document provides a detailed overview of the collective bargaining proposals currently under discussion between the WSC and the WTA. This snapshot is intended for public awareness and includes summaries of the proposals, the School Committee's responses, and the current status of each item (e.g., Open, Denied, or Tentative Agreement). Updated: 3/18/26

Note: In this document, Union Proposals are identified as "UP" & the School Committee as "SC."

Compensation Proposals

The compensation proposals represent the most significant financial considerations in the collective bargaining process.

UP 1: Teacher Compensation

WTA Proposal: 14-19% Salary Increase: A cumulative raise of up to 19%, depending on the step, over 3 years, costing approximately \$4M.

SC Response: \$1M+ Package. The SC offered a total of \$1,061,494 over 3 years: **Year 1:** 3%, **Year 2:** Steps and 2%, **Year 3:** 2%

Status: Open

UP 2: ESP Compensation

WTA Proposal: Base Salary Floor: Increase starting pay to \$35,000 and top pay to \$50,000 (approx. 44% increase) to provide a living wage. The Union's proposal would likely cost the district between \$1.8 million and \$2.5 million over the 3 years.

SC Response: 3% Annual Raises. The SC proposed 3% yearly increases (Steps 1-6), ~\$200k.

Status: Open

UP 3: Secretary Compensation

WTA Proposal: New Pay Scale: A new salary structure reaching up to \$70,054 by Year 3 to reflect cost of living (an approximate 36% total increase).

SC Response: A 3% increase each year, plus the addition of a new "Step 9" to the top of the scale.

UP 4: Nurse Compensation

WTA Proposal: Teacher Scale Alignment: Eliminate the separate "Nurse Salary Scale" entirely. Move the nurses currently on that scale (those without Bachelor's degrees) to the Teacher Salary Scale

SC Response: The SC proposed targeted step increases to bring salaries to approximately \$68,000, but maintain separate pay scale. Year 1: Add new step 8 at \$64,000 Year 2: Add new step 9 at \$68,000 Year 3: 3% GWI Step 9

UP 5: Academic Credentials (Teachers/Nurses)

WTA Proposal: Credits earned for the initial Masters degree beyond the initial thirty (30) credits may be used for further advancement along the pay scale

3/18 SC Counter: Allow these extra credits only if the specific degree program mandated more than 30 credits, subject to the Superintendent's sole approval

Status: Open

Stipends and Substitute Differentials

These proposals address compensation for additional duties and coverage, and its impact on staffing and financial planning.

Sick leave is primarily accrued to protect the employees health and income. Workload and professional practice proposals address teacher and staff working conditions, including overtime compensation, classroom setup time, class size limits and preparation time.
