Previously, Mr. Bonaventura worked as Director of Mentorship at the University of Pittsburgh, where he led a mentorship program supporting more than 150 student-athletes and 200 mentors. While working as a Career Consultant at Pitt, he helped graduating student-athletes achieve a 99% career outcomes rate, connecting them with opportunities for success beyond athletics. Before joining the University of Pittsburgh, Mr. Bonaventura worked at Lamar University and Spurs Sports and Entertainment. Mr. Bonaventura holds a B.S.B.A with a focus in Sport Management from Robert Morris University, and he earned his Master of Social Work from Tulane University while serving as a Graduate Assistant in the Academic Services Center for Student-Athletes. He resides in the South Hills with his wife, Dr. Grace Drnach-Bonaventura, and their daughter, Carmela. Mr. Bonaventura has built a career focused on supporting the academic and personal growth of student-athletes.
