1. Questions from the last meeting?

Amanda shared that HUES completed a scavenger hunt race to find all of the safety items at HUES during a PD day. It really helped all staff get some extra steps in while also familiarizing themselves with locations of safety items at HUES.

5. Principals – Topics: - Patrick

a. Safety Training Opportunities

i. Stop the Bleed w/ Candice Tierny

Patrick was eager to share that HBMS was trained on medical/ bleeding incident practices at the 3/10/26 PD day. Patrick encouraged other buildings to do this well. Staff felt that it was a good confidence boost when dealing with potential medical emergencies. Patrick has since found that his other staff that could not attend are also interested.

Dan and Patrick shared that they are still working with Mike Trapani to finalize dates and locations for these training sessions this summer. He asked if anyone else wanted to add to this list and no input was given on additional opportunities.

Scott Lambertson shared more about the trainings above and noted some of what makes them specifically strong options for educators. To Patrick's question above, he noted that the state has a lot of training posted online that people can pursue on their own. He shared a link with Patrick that can be made available to staff members to check out. Finally, he was disappointed to hear that SAU41 was not eligible for safety grants at the state level. In the past, that had not been an issue.
