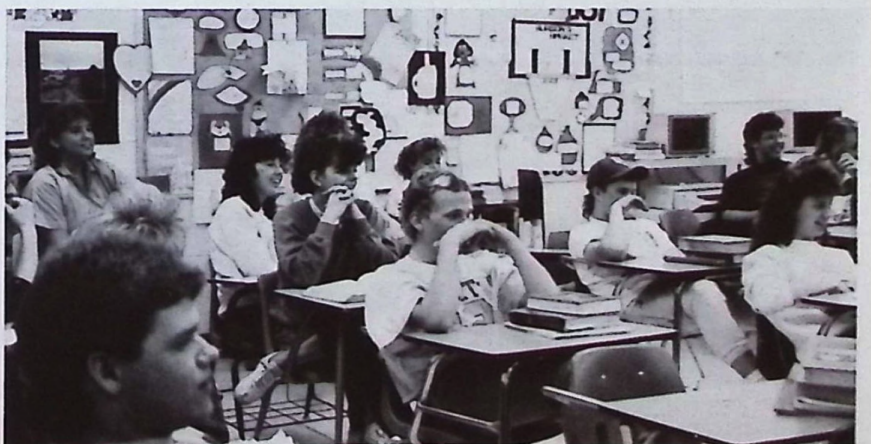
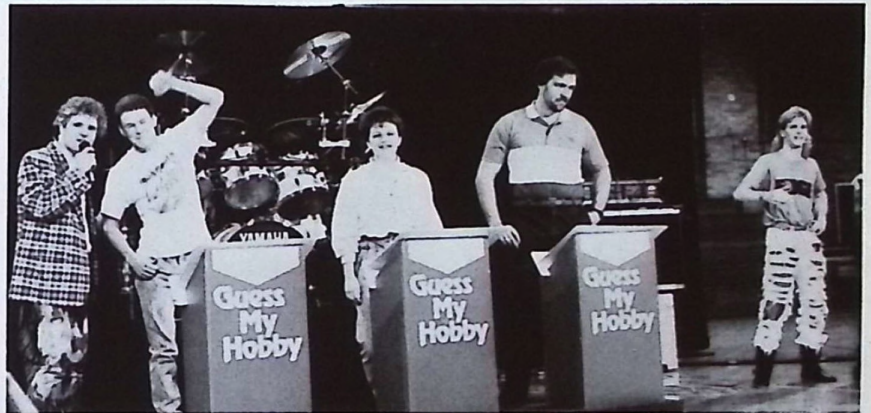


The Berne Union Science Club traveled to Ohio State University on Gibraltar Island in Lake Erie on April 28 and 29th.

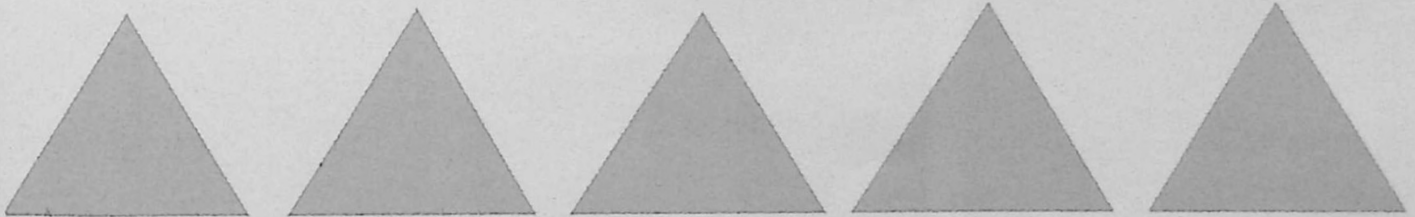

HOMECOMING 1988

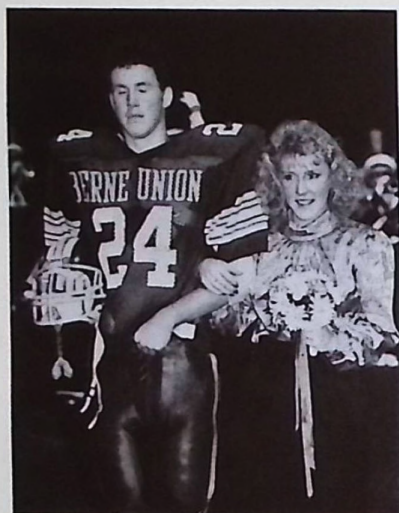

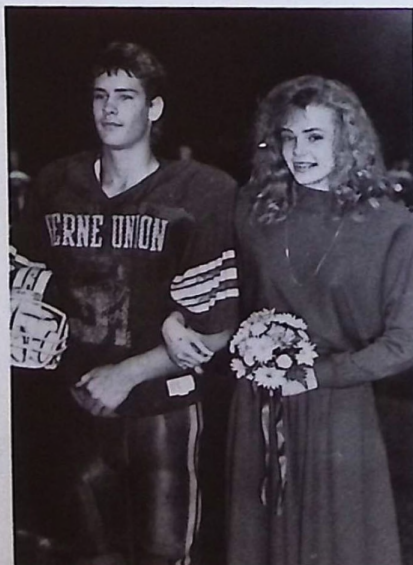

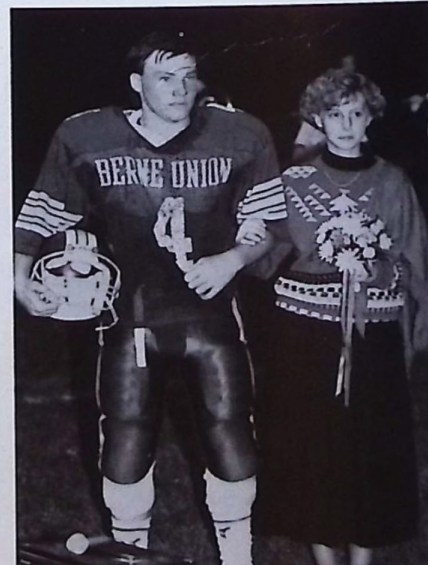

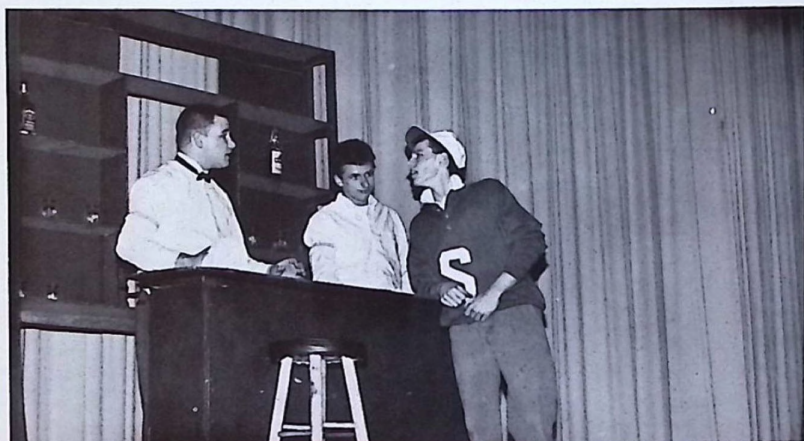

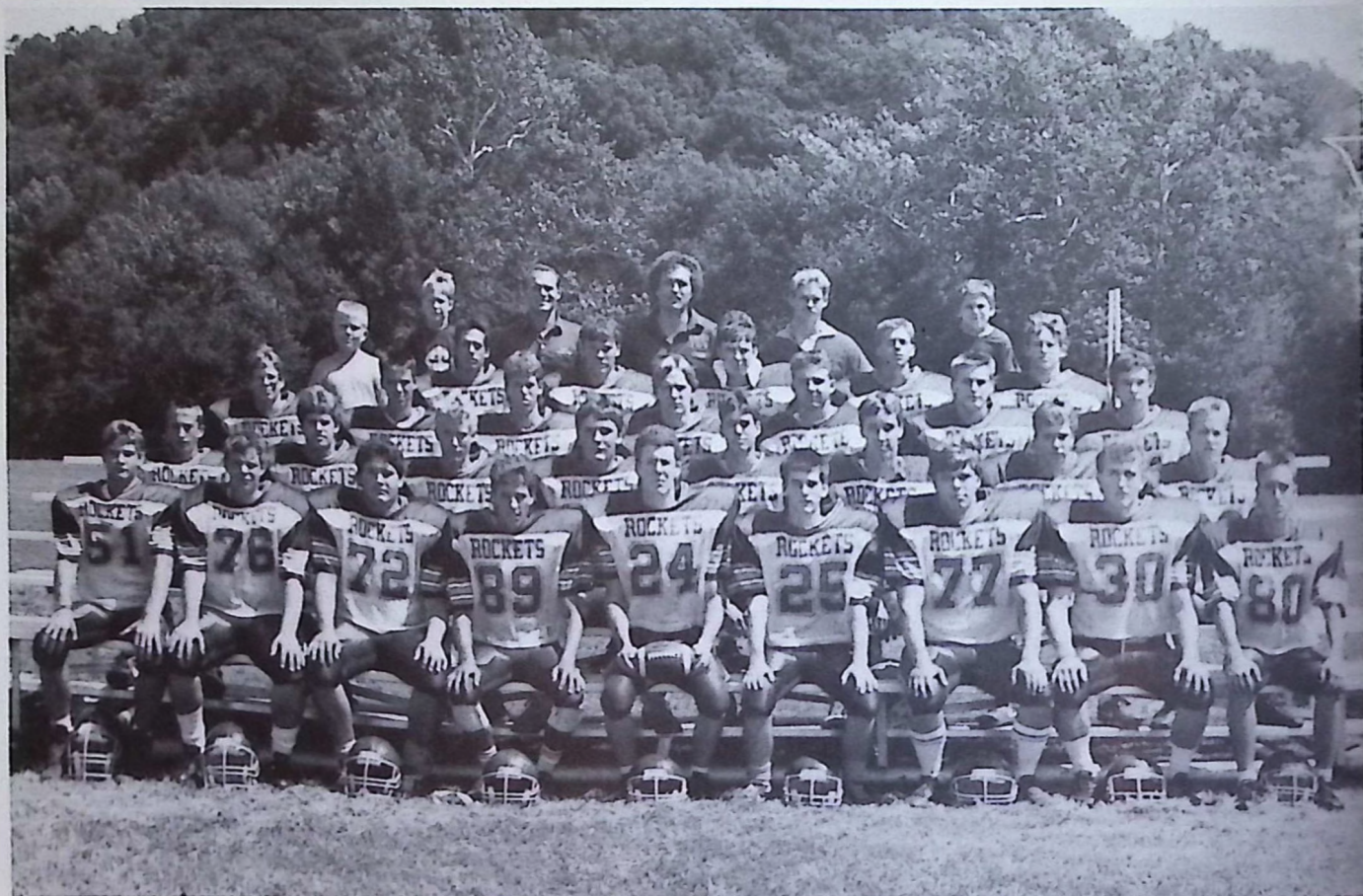

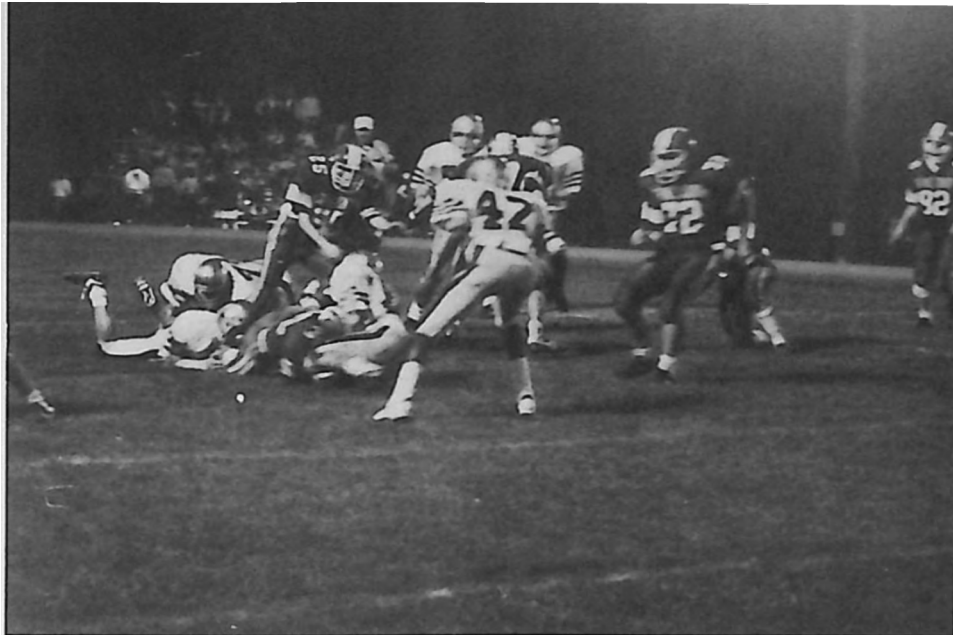

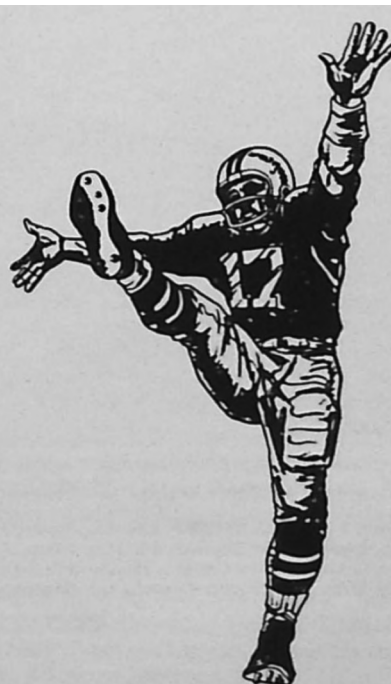

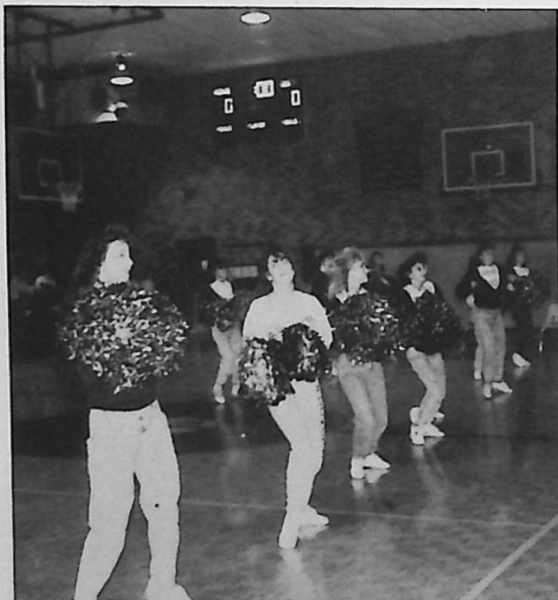

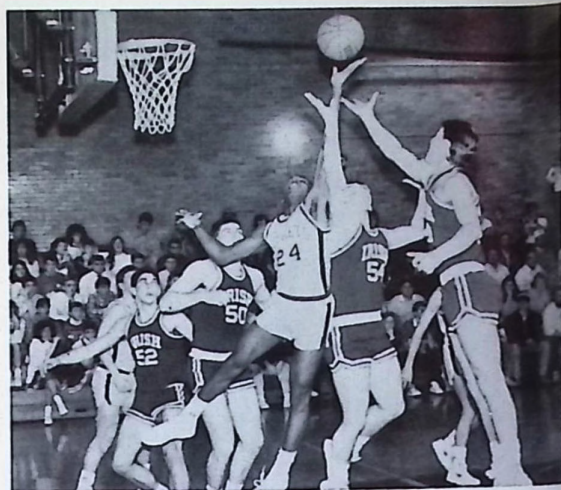

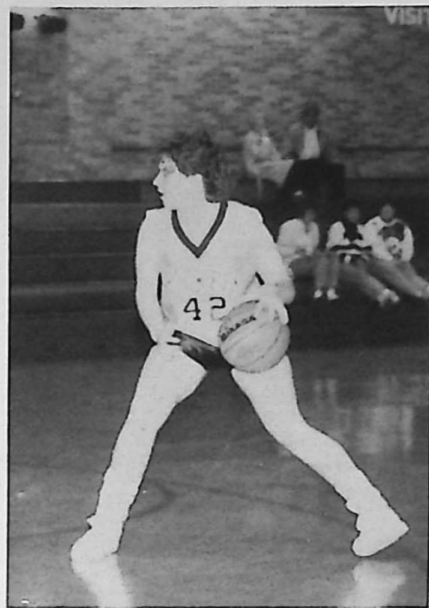

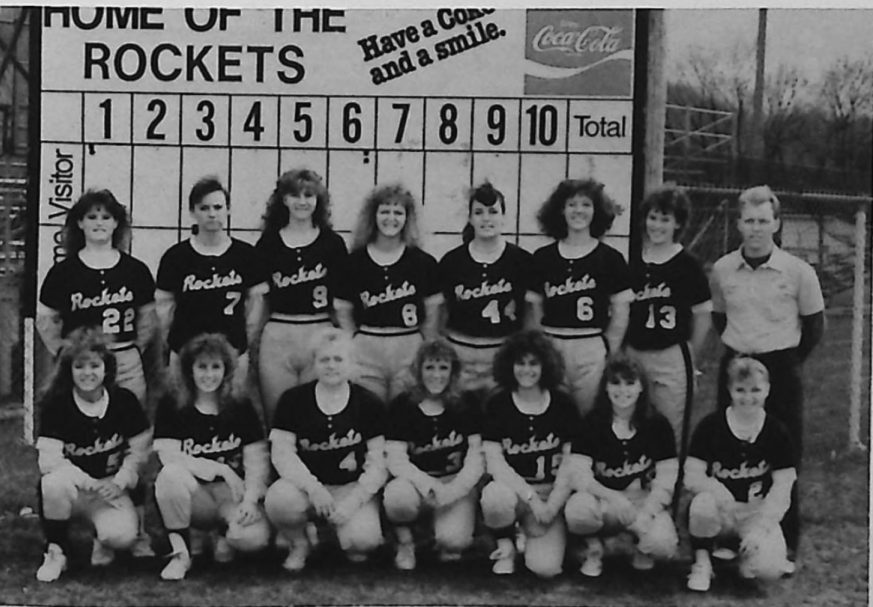

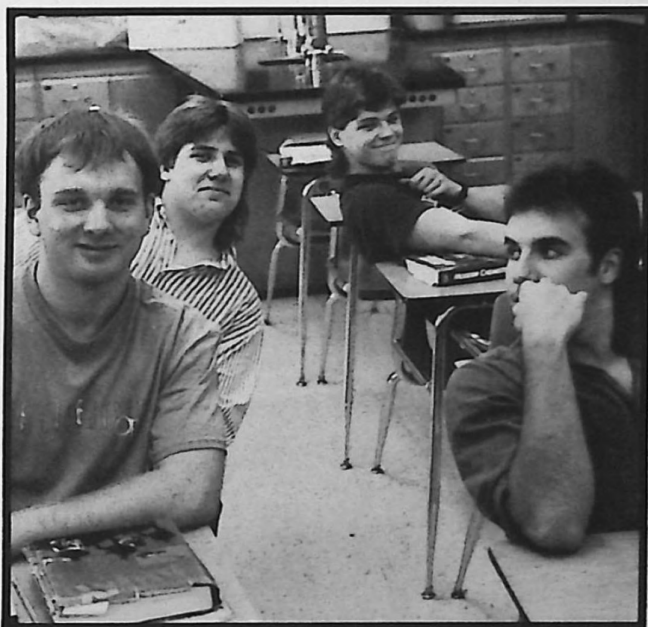
Mr. W. Brown Feix will be retiring from Berne Union at the end of the 1988/89 school year.
