This fall semester will be one to remember for Muenster ISD, marked by championships, first-time achievements, and academic excellence across the district. From the football field to the fine arts stage to the elementary UIL podium, our students, staff, and community made history together.

Back-to-Back State Champions

Under the bright lights and big-game pressure, our Hornet football team proved that last year was no fluke. With discipline, grit, and a relentless team-first mindset, they captured their second straight state championship. The season was filled with defining moments: clutch defensive stands, explosive plays on offense, and a sideline culture built on trust and accountability. Coaches and players committed to early-morning workouts, long film sessions, and constant improvement. Raising that state championship trophy again was a powerful symbol of “A Tradition of Success” in action.

Elementary UIL: 15 Years of Excellence

While the high school lights were shining on the field, our elementary students were continuing a dynasty of their own. For the 15th year in a row, Muenster Elementary brought home the district championship in UIL academics. Behind those medals and trophies are countless hours of practice and teachers who coach, encourage, and push students to do their best. Fifteen straight titles is more than a streak; it is a hallmark of “A Tradition of Success” that starts early and sets expectations all the way through graduation.

Drumline’s Debut: All 1s in Year One

This was also the first year for our drumline to compete at solo and ensemble contest, and they made a statement right away. In their debut season, our percussionists earned all 1’s, the highest rating possible.

Starting a new program takes courage and commitment. It requires students willing to try something new, directors ready to build from the ground up, and families who support long rehearsals and endless practice. Earning straight 1s in year one shows the strength of our fine arts program.

What ties all of these moments together—state titles, UIL dominance, and drumline success is the same thing that defines Muenster ISD: a community that shows up, supports one another, and takes pride in excellence. This fall semester showcased the best of who we are: champions on the field, scholars in the classroom, and artists on the stage.

Education Foundation News from President, Lou Dyer Heers '80

The MISD Education Foundation was so excited to see the 2025-2026 school year begin! Because of the generosity of many donors and supporters of this wonderful school, its teachers, and students, our fundraising efforts have continued to thrive. On September 26, the Education Foundation awarded seven instructional enhancement grants during halftime of the Muenster Hornets vs De Leon Bearcats football game.

Elementary Teachers & Staff

These individuals were awarded a check for \$3,000 for their grant titled, “Enhancing Student Creativity & Learning Through a Poster Maker.” The Poster Maker will allow students and teachers to create large-format visuals for classroom lessons, presentations, science fairs, art projects, and school events. This is a sustainable investment because it is a one-time purchase that will be used for many years across all grade levels and subjects.

Leah Styles, Elementary Computer teacher

Her grant, “Robot Rookies,” totaled \$1,250. This project introduces hands-on learning with programming and coding of robots. Students will learn to code robots that follow paths, interact with colors, sounds, objects, and utilize body movement and facial recognition.

She received \$542 for her grant titled, “Santa, I Know Him! – Memories Center Stage.” These funds will provide items needed for the MHS Theater Department to host a “Pictures with Santa” fundraiser. Theater students will oversee costuming, make-up, props, and set design for Santa’s Workshop. This fundraising endeavor will provide a service to our parents for pictures with Santa.

Graphic Design I & II, Digital Media, and Yearbook teacher, Tyler Bruce

Tyler Bruce's project, "Bringing Graphic Design to Life," will equip the graphic design and digital media classes who design the yearbook with a high-quality photo printer, ink, and paper. This will allow our students to move beyond digital mockups and produce professional-quality posters, photos, and various print materials. This initiative will significantly impact students learning by providing practical, hands-on experience during the entire design process, from concept to final product. Mr. Bruce was presented a check for \$865.

Deanna Miller, IPC and Physics teacher

She was presented a check for \$2,626 for her grant titled, "Powering Possibilities." This instructional grant allows Mrs. Miller to purchase five "Essential Physics Modular Circuit Kits." Her IPC and Physics students will experience hands-on learning by creating and comparing series and parallel circuits, by analyzing data collected from various set ups, and by discussing real-life applications.

High School Biology teacher, Rose Barnhill

Her application was called "Producing Proteins." This grant, for \$359, allows for the purchase of a "Protein Synthesis Manipulatives Kit." These protein synthesis manipulatives model complex processes that happen in living organisms, as well as give students the ability to use modeling to better understand transcription, translation, and protein synthesis.

When the Muenster ISD Education Foundation was formed in 2016, one of its main goals was to help in resurrecting the Band Program at Muenster ISD. Thanks to many of your generous donations, we were extremely happy to present Mr. Ralston with a check for \$7,386! This money provides for a class set of recorders and bucket drums for our 5th graders, a beginner band curriculum for our 6th graders, a class set of practice pads for percussion students 6th-12th grade, a tambourine & triangle set for 6th-12th percussion students, and a very much needed Vibraphone for our up and coming drum line.

The goal of the MISD Education Foundation is to raise funds to support academic programs and achievement. Your generosity and donations truly make a difference! This year we were especially excited to award these instructional enhancement grants that totaled **\$16,028**. 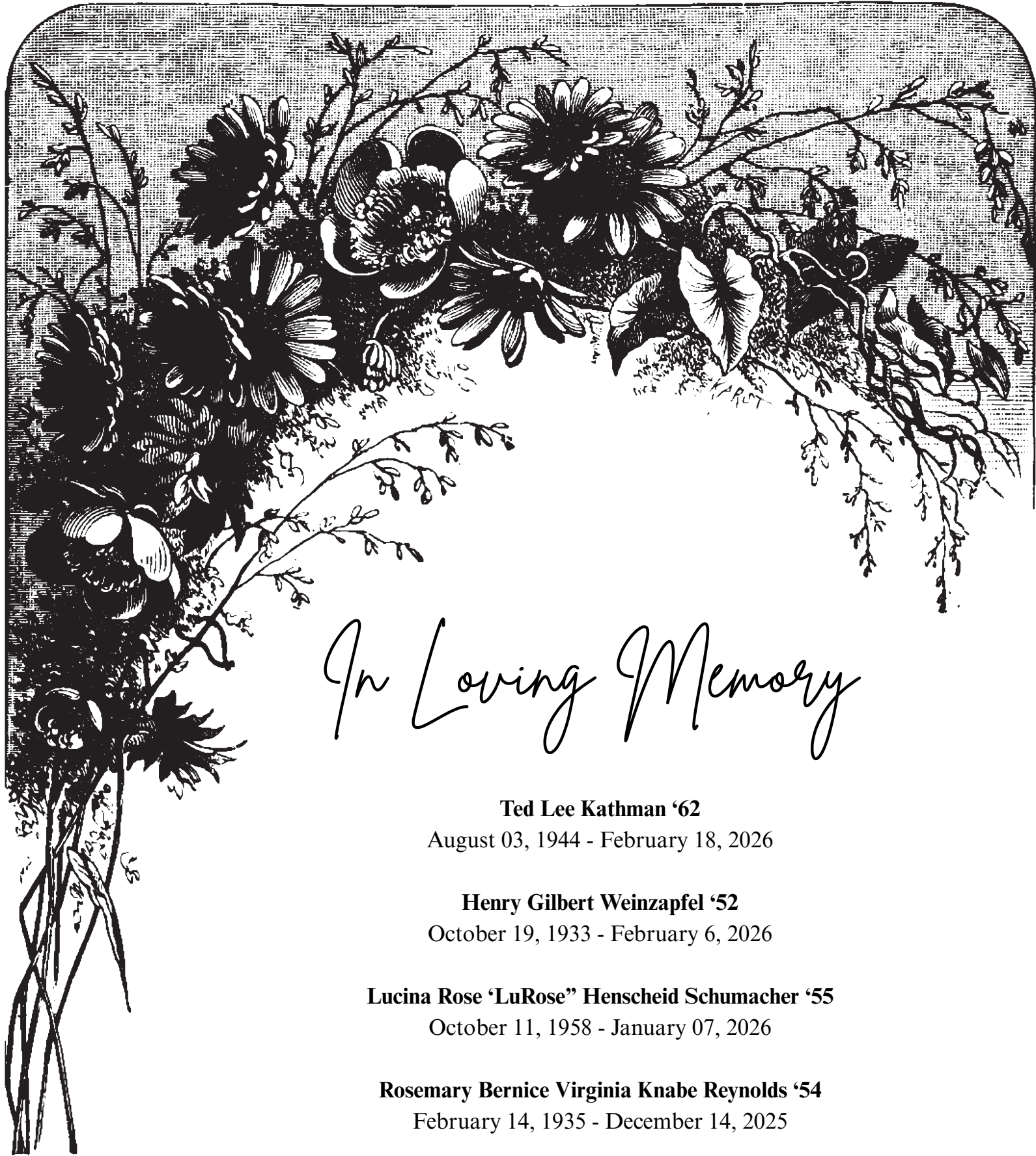

Secondary Staff Spotlight - *Jeff Presnall*

More Than the Scoreboard by Coach P.

Cheryl and I moved to Muenster more than 25 years ago, in the summer of 2000, not fully knowing what an interesting journey lay ahead. Our sons, **Shane '11** and **Landon '12**, began their school years at Muenster Elementary in first and second grade, and in many ways, this community helped raise them alongside us.

Shane and Landon later graduated from Muenster High School and then from Boston College—accomplishments that still fill us with pride. Last spring, both boys were married, and Cheryl and I were blessed to welcome two wonderful daughters into our family, Triana and Christine. Watching our family grow here has been one of life's greatest gifts and a reminder that time truly does fly.

The Presnalls have truly been blessed to call Muenster, America home since the turn of the millennium. I have been privileged to be mentored and led by outstanding administrators such as Clyde Steelman, Phil Newton, **Lou Dyer Heers '80**, Steven Self, and Curtis Eldridge. I am especially grateful to our current superintendent, Matthew Quick—who may or may not have had a driver's license when I moved to Muenster—for helping me transition into a full-time role as technology director. As a coach, you could not ask for better athletic directors than Gordon Martin, Monte Endres, and Brady Carney. I have also had the pleasure of working alongside many exceptional coaches, including—but certainly not limited to—Kenny Mann, **Amy Otto Binder '94**, and Lynn Cook.

Outstanding teachers have always been a hallmark of MISD, and I was fortunate to count so many as colleagues, especially Martha Koesler, Nancy Perryman, **Joni Wilde Sturm '70**, Danna Hess, **Joann Fisher Pagel '62**, **Jill Wimmer Reiter '84**, and **Deb Schneider Klement '76**. I am also grateful for the many hardworking staff members who helped keep me “on the straight and narrow,” including Patsy Fleitman, Charlotte Klement, Terri Barrett, Tonia Hofbauer, **Kami Klement Creed '03**, and **Connie Lutkenhaus Samford '83**.

In more than 25 years, I have been blessed to work with only two business managers—Carol Klement and Leslie Hartman—both of whom taught me invaluable lessons about school funding in my roles as a coach and technology director. I am also thankful for mentors like Joe Koesler, **Smoke Koelzer '77**, and Jason Hofbauer, who patiently guided a guy who admittedly knows very little about all things maintenance.

My years as technology director at MISD tend to blur together, spanning everything from floppy disks to Smart Boards and now even artificial intelligence! One tech moment that still stands out is my son, Shane, presenting me with a carefully written persuasive essay in 2008, explaining why he absolutely needed a new gadget called an iPhone. Many other technology-related memories faded quickly into cyberspace sometime after 2013 B.C.—before Chromebooks! What has not faded, however, is my appreciation for two remarkable colleagues who helped shape Muenster ISD Technology into what it is today: Debra Sicking and Carol Cook.

Unfortunately, time moves far too quickly. I am now one of only five remaining school employees from the 2000–2001 school year, joined by **Dianne Pagel Endres '93**, **Amy Otto Binder '94**, **Barbie Walterscheid Barnhill '79**, and Susie Fleitman. Today, however, I am fortunate to work alongside eleven former students at MISD—and yes, we regularly remind each other of our “younger” days.

These colleagues—and many more too numerous to name—have made my time in Muenster both enjoyable and deeply rewarding. Like most educators, however, it is the students who leave the greatest impression. Over the past 25 years, I have collected countless memories and been shaped by even more students who have touched my heart. There is no way to include them all here, so I will highlight just a few moments that continue to stand out.

Most Hornet fans can easily recall Muenster High School's six UIL state championship teams—right? Three came in 2017 alone: Lynn Cook's basketball team, Josh Wheeler's baseball squad, and Brady Carney's football Hornets. Add to that Coach Carney's back-to-back football state championships in 2024 and 2025, and that makes five. Which raises the question: what's the sixth? If it's not coming to mind right away, don't worry, I promise I'll get back to it

From that same postseason, I still remember **Robyn Hermes Eggemeyer '04** telling me during pregame that she could see fans in the stands through the backboard while shooting free throws at the Drum in Austin! **Kallie Gerstberger Porter's '05** halftime three-pointer at the buzzer remains just as vivid, as does a young **Lia Heers Hellman '10** hitting a clutch shot in the Lady Hornets' double-overtime playoff victory over Sam Rayburn!



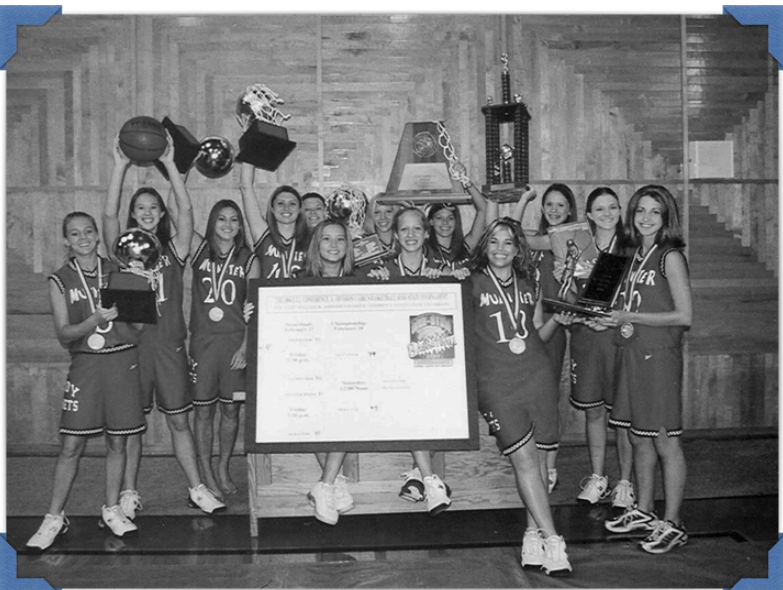
In 2017, the Hornet Basketball team made school history by winning the State Championship with Coach Jeff Presnall and Coach Lynn Cook guiding and encouraging them all the way!

Some specific—and yes, some random—memories still stand out to me, including winning the Girls' Basketball Regional Tournament in 2004 at Stephen F. Austin State University. That moment felt especially meaningful nearly 30 years after the greatest Muenster Lady Hornet basketball player of all time, **Doris Felderhoff Dennard '73**, played her college basketball there and earned Kodak All-American honors in 1976 and 1977!

On the boys' side, one image that never fades is **Russell Endres '05** throwing down a breakaway dunk at Slidell's old gym and celebrating just long enough to earn a technical foul—much to the delight of Muenster fans. The 2013 boys' basketball season produced two other lasting memories: **Andy Flusche's '13** steal and game-winning basket against Honey Grove, and **Hunter Klement's '13** three-pointer that gave us an early 15–6 lead over eventual state champion Triple A Academy—a lead that, unsurprisingly, didn't last long!

More recent Hornet moments include **Danny Luttmer's '20** late interception against Wellington to seal a state semifinal football victory in Vernon, and a few years later, **Jonathan Wheeler's '21** walk-off grand slam against Lindsay—followed by plenty of “good-natured fun” at the Knights' expense as he circled the bases.

Muenster's cross country and track accomplishments are far too numerous to list, but one often-forgotten state championship season came in 2006, when **Justin Ferguson '06** captured the 400-meter state title and teamed with **Michael Faries '07, Jordan Walterscheid '06, and Derek Endres '06** to win gold in the 4x200-meter relay.

And yes—the sixth team state championship earned by Muenster High School was actually the first UIL team state championship in school history: the 2002 UIL Class 1A State Academic Meet Championship! That Hornet team was led by **Pamela Lutkenhaus Grewing '02, Kelly Grewing 'Combrink '03, Ashley Hess Endres '02** and the infamous “pencil-dropping” **Chris Jackson '02**, who alone brought home seven gold medals. The team was guided by outstanding coaches that year, including Mrs. Gerri Eckart, Danna Hess, and the late Jerry Eckart.

I also take great pride in seeing former students go on to make their teachers and coaches proud through their success after graduation. Many have become doctors and medical professionals, including **Melinda Walterscheid Cory '04, Eric Hellman '10, Emily Hellman Bouffard '12, Andi Hess Wagner '12, Rishi Patel '12**, and my son, **Landon '12**. Others—**Jessica Walterscheid Bowman '07, Brooke Walterscheid Deshpande '13, Megan Felderhoff Sandmann '07, Jessica Fisher '08, Sydney Huchton Davis '14**, and many more—now care for so many of us in our silver and golden years.

As coaches, we are equally proud to see former players such as **Clay Stevens '18, Tyler Anderle '12, Taylor Klement '11, and Lana Heers Hanes '12** choose education and coaching as their own calling.

When Cheryl and I arrived in Muenster more than 25 years ago, we had no idea how deeply this community would shape our lives. Over time, I've learned that Muenster ISD's “Tradition of Success” isn't just about achievements or championships—it's about community, family, and the pride that keeps Lady Hornets and Hornets coming home.

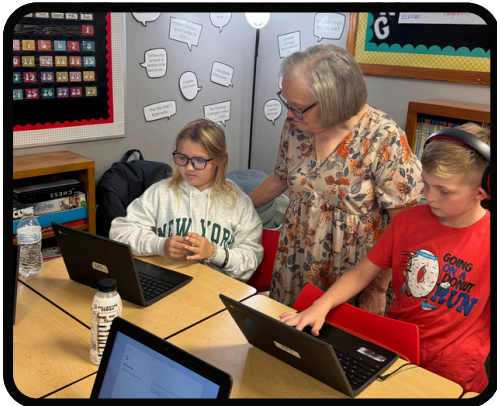
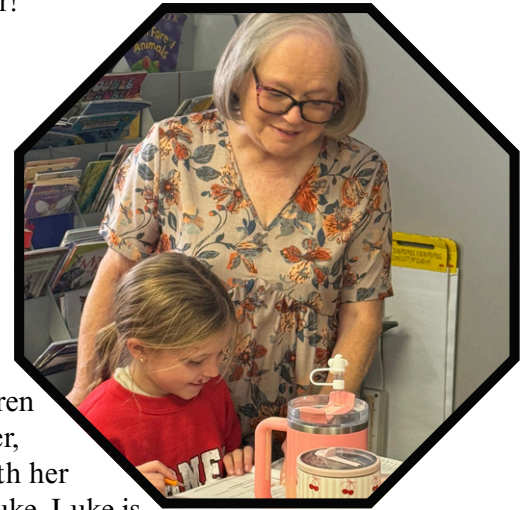
Elementary Teacher Spotlight - *Brenda Gann*

This was going to be a chore every day, so we decided to build a home in Muenster. We finally moved in July 2001. When school started for our son, I had our daughter, Heather Mercer, bake and decorate three cakes for me to take to each campus at the school. On each cake, we wrote "Have a Great Year" and wrote a note saying, "If I can be of any help, please call me." This is where my journey started with MISD.

I had been subbing for **Mrs. Lou Dyer Heers '80** in her second-grade class while she was finishing her studies to become a principal. One afternoon, when I was in my backyard, Mrs. Heers approached me to see if I would like a teacher's aide position at the school. I said, "Yes!" So here I am, almost twenty-five years later. I was hired by Mrs. Gwen Trubenbach and she placed me in the kindergarten classes where I helped students throughout the day. I mainly listened to and taught students who were learning to read. I worked with some great teachers, Mrs. Sharon Ledbetter, Mrs. Danna Fredrick, and Ms. T (**Sabrina Truebenbach Gibbs '95.**) We had so much fun together!

Before I came to MISD, I worked at a private school that was at Central Baptist Church in Gainesville. I taught three-, four-, and five-year-old children. I stayed with the school until it closed due to lack of student enrollment. I had been there for thirteen years where I was also church secretary. I still do church business from my home as financial secretary. I also am very active in our church. I play the organ, sing solos, and teach a class when they need someone to fill in. I am blessed to have played the organ for over forty years.



I have been married to Wayne Gann for fifty-five years. We have two children and four grandchildren. Our daughter, Heather, lives in Mansfield, Texas, with her husband, Mike, and our grandson, Luke. Luke is a junior and studying to possibly be an Ag teacher. Their daughter, Kaitlyn, lives in Stephenville, Texas, and wants to work with small children. Their oldest child, Emily, lives in Washington state and works for a large company. Our son, Kevin Gann, lives here in Muenster with his wife Melissa. Kevin is the parks and recreation director in Gainesville, Texas. Their son, **Ryder '26**, is a senior this year at MISD.

When I am not at work, I try to work on puzzles, diamond dot paintings, and gardening. I learned how to can vegetables this year, and that was very enjoyable.

I love being at school. I always told Mrs. Heers at the end of year appraisals that "this is my happy place." I am retiring in May and am going to miss being here because of the people I work with. I will miss the hugs from students. You may still see me there some because I plan to volunteer there and read with kindergarten through second grade students. I also want to help the teachers by continuing to make copies for them.

Oh, the students always call me Mrs. Gann. I do not think many people know my first name. I see students out in public that have been out of school for some time, and they still say, "Hello, Mrs. Gann!" I tell them that they can call me Brenda, and they say, "No, that is not right, you will always be Mrs. Gann to me."

Some of the best people I know are my co-workers. They will do anything for you, and they are always there to help you through tough times. We pray for each other in any situation we find ourselves in. Please know that I will always love you.



ALUMNI SPOTLIGHT - *Lyle Huchton '82*

When people ask me what I do for a living and I tell them that I'm a costume designer, I usually get one of three responses: That seems like a really fun job or No, what do you do to make a living? or How did you get into that? Yes, it is a fun job, I do make an ok living at it, and it is an interesting story about how it all happened.

I am a 1982 graduate of Muenster High School. Like most people who grew up in Muenster, I went from kindergarten through 12th grade at Muenster ISD. My mom and dad are Theresa (Fuhrman) and A.J. Huchton. I have five brothers who also attended Muenster ISD - **Ricky ('72), Terry ('74), Neil ('75), Billy ('77), and Rex ('92)**. With so many brothers, you would expect me to be athletic or enjoy traditionally male activities. I, however, did not. I knew at an early age that I was not like all the other boys. While other boys played Little League in summer, I spent my time swimming or at the Muenster Public Library.

It was in that cool, quiet place that I discovered my love for reading. Looking back at the stories I truly cherish—Charlotte's Web, Treasure Island, The Jungle Book, I am now able to share them in play form with other kids who I hope will appreciate them as much as I do.

My circumstances improved significantly upon beginning high school. I could be involved in things that were an interest to me. I was active in student council, band, and UIL. I competed for 4 years in prose interpretation and 3 years in one-act play. With guidance from Patsy Sloan and Martha Koesler, I earned multiple acting awards and qualified for the UIL State Academic competition in prose interpretation my senior year. But it was the summer I spent at an intensive drama camp at East Texas State University (now East Texas A&M University) that really opened my eyes. I was around fifty plus other kids who shared my same interest. For two weeks, we were completely involved in everything related to theatre. That summer taught me many things, but it was during one of the workshops that I first discovered costume

design. I remembered the advice from the teacher that if we wanted a career in theater, we should develop another skill to support ourselves between acting roles. I remembered that **Joni Wilde Sturm '70** taught sewing as part of her curriculum in Home Economics. So, at the start of the next school year, I went straight to her and told her that I wanted to take her class to learn to sew to be able to work in theater.

Back in those days, most boys did not enroll in Home Economics. But as I have said before, I was not like most boys, and it did not bother me in the least to be in a class for girls. It was that life lesson of learning how to sew that carried me through college and to a professional career in design.

I went on to major in Drama at The University of North Texas and for one of my core classes I chose Introduction to Costume Design. It was in that class that the professor noticed that I may have a future in design, so I switched my focus from Acting/Directing to Costume Design.

After college, I started working at the Dallas Theater Center. While there, I met a few local costumers who introduced me to other theaters seeking individuals with sewing or design skills and helped me get my foot in the door. They were and still are a wonderful support system.

My story could stop here. I could tell you that I found a lot of great jobs and made a ton of money. That is not the reality. Most theaters operate seasonally, typically from September to May. For a few months each year, you need to secure other work, which can be hard to find. Several times I wanted to quit and change careers entirely. During one of those times I had to pack all my stuff up, put it into storage, and move back home with my Mom. However, God had other plans for me other than to let me quit. It was during that time that I got hired by HIT Entertainment to work with **Barney the Purple Dinosaur** and later with **The Wiggles**.

I will wrap up with this quote from Edward Bulwer-Lytton: "Talent does what it can. Genius does what it must." I am not suggesting by any stretch of the imagination that I am a genius, but I am thankful that I have been intuitive enough to be open to follow the path God had for me.
