RESPONSE FROM NATHAN

To Whom It May Concern,

Sierra Blanca ISD (SBISD) has requested information regarding items that SBISD indicated are missing and were alleged to have been under the responsibility of G. Nathan. The list of items for which information was requested is as follows:

- 2 iPad
- 1 laptop
- 3 mobile hotspots
- 1 Suburban

As previously mentioned to the interim Superintendent in approximately mid-June 2022 via text message, none of those items are in the possession of Mr. Glenn Nathan. The known information related to those items is given below:

- 1) 2 iPad's – iPads had been previously requested by Mr. Nathan for the use of athletics (basketball, football, and volleyball) under the direction of Mr. Ismael Ramirez and Mr. Felix Reyes, athletic coaches. Additionally, an iPad had been requested for new teachers; E. Ramberg, P. Nathan, A. Velasquez and then for instructional aides having issues with end-of-life devices that were unable to support TEA reading academies. At no point did Mr. Nathan sign for any device nor were any of those iPads used by Mr. Nathan. All inventory is managed by Elizabeth Morales.
- 2) 1 laptop – When Mr. Nathan was initially hired, Mrs. Beatriz Zavala, who was not a full-time employee and instead was contracted for testing and other academic support, was in possession of a laptop. Mr. Nathan sought her out to pick up the laptop, which was subsequently given to Danielle Sanchez*** (PEIMS/Attendance Clerk and Executive Assistant) as Mrs. Sanchez' device was no longer operational. Mr. Nathan worked to recover school district property but did not take possession or accept issuance of the said laptop. This laptop stayed in the possession of Mrs. Sanchez and repeated attempts have been made to recover the laptop following the resignation of Mrs. Sanchez in late October 2021. Elizabeth Morales managed inventory of devices.
 - o ***Note: Danielle Sanchez is married to Board President Joel Sanchez. As of June 2022, they were separated but still married.
- 3) 3 Mobile Hotspots – A mobile hotspot was provided to Danielle Sanchez, Joel Sanchez (at Joel's request), and to the athletics staff. Another hotspot was utilized by Mr. Nathan. Hotspots assigned to Mrs. Sanchez were attempted to be recovered by Sierra Blanca ISD following her resignation. To my knowledge, however, recovery was not successful. Another hotspot continued to be in the possession of Mr. Sanchez as of June 2022 prior to the resignation of Mr. Nathan. The athletic staff continued to keep a hotspot to the knowledge of Mr. Nathan. The hotspot used by Mr. Nathan was left in the superintendent offices at the school district in the original box. There is a concern regarding office security as Mrs. Armida Gomez did have access to the office since she had key access. The lead custodian also had access to the office. Finally, the lead administrator, Mrs. Rosa Rocha had access to the office as all keys were left with her.

- 4) Suburban – Approximately a year and a half ago, the maroon suburban broke down and was towed into El Paso for a repair estimate. The repair estimate plus the cost to tow the vehicle was evaluated against the current market value of the vehicle. The board decided to sell the vehicle to the tow company because the cost of repairing of the vehicle plus the tow expenses, as well as the age and mileage of the vehicle had shown the vehicle to be at end of life and fully depreciated. All information and decisions were discussed openly in board meetings and acted upon by the board. The contact information for the tow company is Garcia Towing 915-355-0721. Mr. Nathan is also willing to assist the District in recovery of the agreed upon funds for the sale of the vehicle.

The items questioned by Sierra Blanca ISD are not in the possession of Mr. Nathan. Any items held by Mr. Nathan were returned to the school district upon his resignation from the district. Any items signed for and acknowledged by Mr. Nathan were also returned. There are items that have not been recovered by former employees, current school employees and under the possession of the school board president. Mr. Nathan is willing to assist the district and provide information to the District in pursuit of the funds for the suburban, as well as support the attempts to recover devices from Mrs. Sanchez.

 - a. a. Proposed tax rate after receipt of certified values and the local property value survey: \$0.9492.
