# Students Kick ‘Bot’ in the STEM Field

Though Archbishop Wood is very well known for its academics and athletics, there is one more “a” characteristic of the school that needs recognition: activities. One of the most involved and successful activities of Archbishop Wood is the Fighting Robovikings, our school’s very own robotics team. Founded in November 2006, the team participates in local and state competitions during the season, from January through April, as well as off-season competitions from June to November. The students on the team are challenged to design, build, and program a robot that performs prescribed tasks against competing robots. All of this is done in build season, a six week time frame.

Of course, building the robot is not the only part of robotics. Areas where students can participate and showcase their skills include: field work, scouting and strategy, driving the robots, programming, mechanical and electrical work, marketing, team spirit, animation, safety, pneumatics, web design, and others. The teams often prepare their portions separately, but come together on or before the day of the competition.

The team’s hard work is showcased in the many awards and recognitions they receive throughout the seasons. Often, the team is victorious in district and local competitions, which can easily lead to advancing to the Mid-Atlantic Robotics District Championship. They have even qualified for and participated in the FIRST World Competition in St. Louis multiple times, namely this past season. The team has also won many prevalent competitions over the past few years, including the Virginia Regional Competition in 2014 and the Hatboro-Horsham District Event in 2015.

The Robovikings have won their fair share of awards over the years, including multiple district event victories and other various awards like Innovation in Control, Gracious Professionalism, and Quality, in recognition of their accomplishments as a team. In addition, Mr. Thom Galie, moderator for the team as well as teacher at Archbishop Wood,

was a recipient of the Woodie Flowers Award. Some of these recognitions have been awarded to the Archbishop Wood Robotics Team on multiple occasions as well, further attesting to their competence and achievements.

Not only does the team work hard during competition, they do plenty outside of competition as well. For example, the team delivers Christmas boxes and breakfast bags to St. John Hospice and Aid for Friends, respectively. The Robovikings are involved with all sorts of similar community service, involving both charity and education. They also run a team in FIRST Lego League, an activity that involves building robots out of given Lego pieces. The FIRST Lego League is catered towards grade school students, and the team at Wood is opening this opportunity to





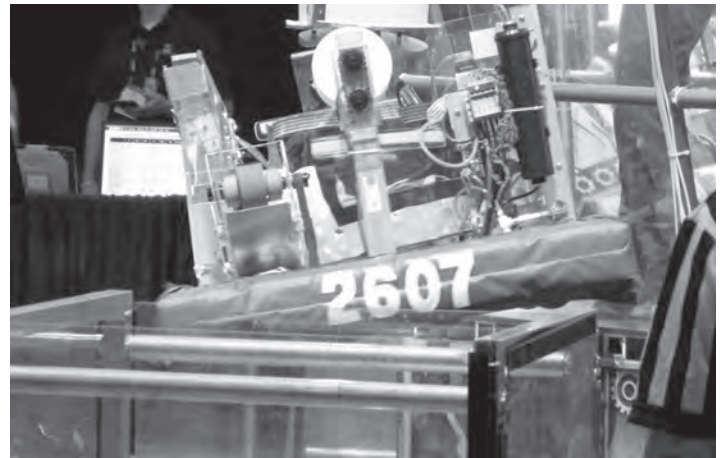
young students interested in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math).

Of course, an Archbishop Wood activity would not be what it is without the students. The students on the robotics team are dedicated and give so much time so that they as a whole can be successful. Rising junior Nicole Hediger says, "The robotics program at our school is a way for students to express their love for STEM. Each year, we are given a new challenge to complete, then we have a certain amount of weeks to build a functioning robot that can compete against said

challenge. However, not all students involved work on the robot; for example, I lead as the outreach student lead and chairman's student lead. This means that I work on our team's community service, getting the

team's name out there, and so on. This program as caused me to be able to express my love for stem and share it with others like me. Furthermore, the robotics program has taught me valuable life lessons about teamwork and determination." As Hediger said, this team requires loads of effort, but the students involved love it, as she later referred to the team lovingly as "my team."

The robotics program and team continue immersing students into STEM, and the rest of the Archbishop Wood community cheers them on, as we hope to see the team "kick bot!" more in the future.

In the past six years, this team has won the state championship five times. However, the football team is not the only Archbishop Wood team familiar with winning.



The girls' basketball team has been able to capture five state titles in the past seven years. In addition to this, they have also been named PCL champions twice and District 12 champions five times.

The game ended with a score of 73-40, leaving Archbishop Wood Boys' basketball to be named state champions for the first time ever.

The athletic victories are truly a tribute to Archbishop Wood. The success exemplifies the persistence of Wood students and their need to achieve the goals they set.

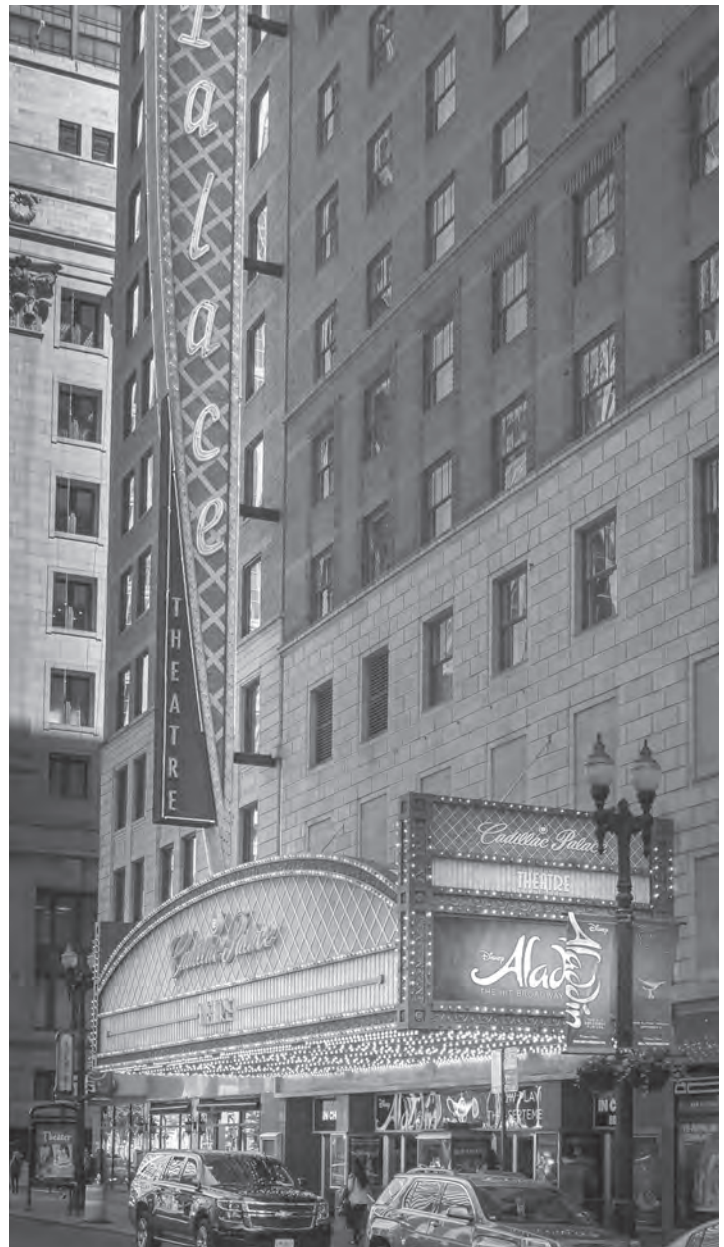
## Standing Ovation for Ian Carr

Ian Carr, 2006 Wood Graduate, recently became the Head of Sound for the first national off-Broadway tour of Disney's *Aladdin*. He is in charge of "mixing" the show, meaning that he adjusts all of the microphones, speakers, etc to make sure the show can be heard clearly by the audience, and sounds the same from one performance to another. This can be an especially difficult job because the show doesn't stay in one place for long, so factors like weather, altitude, and theater size vary in different cities. So Ian has to figure out how to set up all the sound system in each space and check each piece of equipment before every performance. During the show, he works the sound console, controlling when each microphone or sound effect comes on and at the correct volume. His job is extremely important to the success of the show because it greatly affects the audience's experience of the performance.

However, Ian wasn't always a behind-the-scenes kind of person. In middle school, he became interested in performing on stage, and continued this for the first part of high school. He says that he has always enjoyed performing, but he found that his true calling was backstage. He discovered that he loved working with sound; he even did a little DJ-ing. Studying at DeSales, Ian earned a degree in theater. While in college, he sent his resume all over the place, and ended up working at both Hershey Park and the Pennsylvania Shakespeare Festival. Soon after college, he started a job as the assistant sound engineer for the 2nd National Tour of *Legally Blonde the Musical*. He also toured with *Rock of Ages* and *Sister Act the Musical*, where he was promoted to Head Sound Engineer. # #Youandmebench

It started with a simple question, “How do we celebrate relationships in a unique way?” It was a question developed following a meeting with one of my clients, Safian & Rudolph jewelers. I work in advertising, and we had just wrapped our initial ‘immersion session,’ which we use to gain a better understanding of the client and their goals. The last thing they said to us before they walked out of the room was, “We don’t just sell jewelry. We celebrate relationships.” That line stuck out for me. At the end of the day some coworkers drifted across the street to the well-placed, and super-convenient brewery where we often went to get out of the office and away from our work. However, if you work in advertising you know that you can never fully get away from your work. Your projects tend to stick with you as new ideas; concepts or insights are uncovered on a daily basis and sometimes in the most random of places. This night was no different, but as ideas flew around, eventually one stuck.

At the time, early Spring 2016, there were a lot social and political issues that seemed to be constantly dividing our country. So, our goal was to create something that would bring people together, and that notion is how the client’s logo inspired the idea. Before we rushed off and spent a good deal of money to have this built, I called the City of Philadelphia and told them about the idea. I wanted to see if they liked it, and if we



could get it placed in a public park once it was finished. I learned there’s a reason all of the benches in Philadelphia’s parks look the same. They don’t take street furniture submissions or donations from anybody, because they are responsible for things like safety, maintenance and upkeep.

That didn’t stop me. That setback just fired me up a bit more. Now it was clear, we needed more than just an ampersand on a bench. We needed a strong backstory and strategy for spreading the message. Oh, and not to mention we also needed an actual bench.

We pulled design inspiration for the physical bench from the ‘Love Statue’, but unlike the ‘Love Statue’ we encouraged people to interact with this piece of art. Sit down on it, stand on it, lay on it. We just wanted people to have fun with it. Next was the strategy, and for this I tapped into an Instagram account I followed called Humans Of New York, from a guy in NYC who photographed all sorts of people. He would ask them to share a little about their life story and would then share their photo



and a snippet about them. All of those stories were about one person at a time. The bench was created to celebrate relationships and the power and positivity that can come from them. So the bench was just a catalyst for getting people to share stories about their relationship with whomever they were sitting down with (best friend, family, significant other, etc.). That’s why we called it the You & Me Bench.

The effort was 100% guerrilla at first. We’d take the bench out to a park or landmark in the city via a U-Haul and would set up shop for a few hours. I’d explain to people what the You & Me Bench was and would encourage them to sit down and take a photo. As they sat down, I chatted with the different people and took mental notes. Then I’d share the photo and their story on our social networks. I’d also encourage them to do so as well. The purpose of this was to share your story with your world. Let your world know how you feel about the other person, or maybe share a funny story of how you first met. Then when they shared that photo, all that we asked was that they use the hashtag, #youandmebench. The hashtag creation was important, because we also created a microsite, youandmebench.com, which aggregated any post using the #youandmebench hashtag. This allowed to people who visited the site to see their own photos as well as everyone else’s.

After a few weeks and some word-of-mouth recognition, we started partnering up with events and organizations in Philadelphia. By the end of the summer, the You & Me Bench had made over 29 different appearances in the city. It was featured on five different talk radio shows and had three different TV pieces done about it.

Finally, it had made enough noise that I went back to the city in hopes of getting the bench approved for permanent placement in the city as an art installation. After months of review, it was written into a bill which was signed by Mayor Jim Kenney. The bench will now and forever live on the corner of 7th & Sansom in Philadelphia, outside of Safian & Rudolph jeweler’s. So please feel free to visit and take a photo on it. ### Q: Tell me a little bit about your basketball career throughout the years.

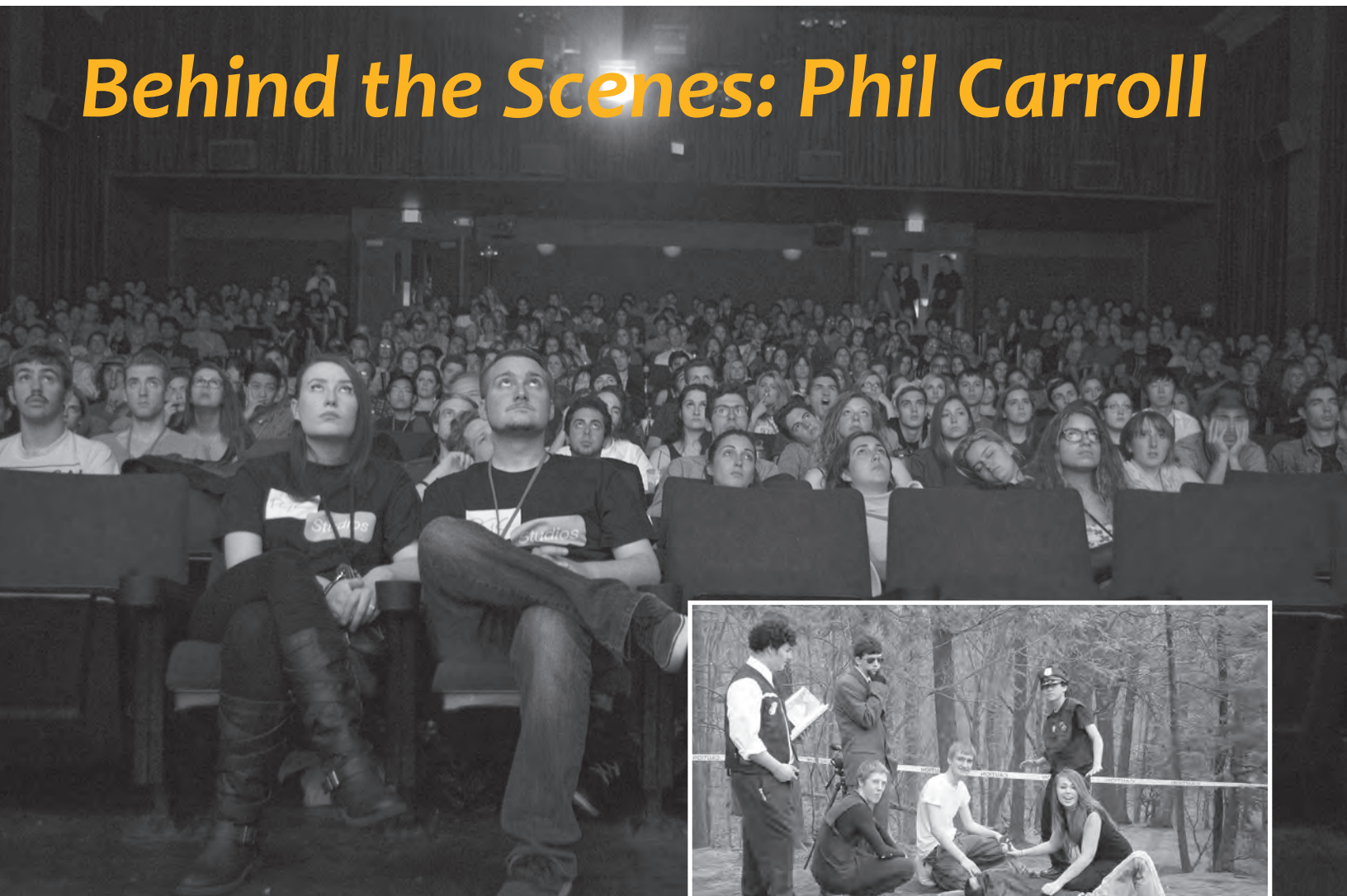

# Behind the Scenes: Phil Carroll

From a young age, Phillip G. Carroll Jr. knew he wanted to go into the film industry. At age ten, Carroll received a special edition copy of Jurassic Park, with a behind-the-scenes video on how the film was made. He was instantly hooked, and “loved watching the cast and crew bring the story to life almost as much as [he] liked viewing the actual film!” This led to a Carroll and his brother, John, creating a stop-motion recreation of the film with their father’s camera. They showed it to their family, and everyone loved it. Carroll “loved the feeling [he] got emotionally impacting them with something that [he] made.”

Jump forward three years, and Carroll found himself unfortunately in a hospital in Washington D.C. for a collapsed lung on a school trip. For entertainment in the hospital, Carroll’s father brought a laptop from home then bought Final Cut Express editing software. For the next ten days, he distracted himself by editing a montage of his class growing up through grade school. The room was moved to laughter and tears when the finished video was shown at his eighth grade graduation. That is the moment Phil Carroll knew he wanted to be a filmmaker so that he could touch people emotionally.

After grade school graduation, Carroll went to Archbishop Wood, where he was involved in starting a Movie Production Club, where videos for assemblies, eighth grade visitation, and other Wood events were produced. Once, the club even produced a winning video for an American Red Cross contest with Mrs. Garofalo. Along with this club, Carroll spent his homeroom in the TV studio, helping with the production of the morning announcements. During extended homeroom periods, Carroll remembers that Mr. Velten would let him broadcast short films. Carroll also said, “Wood was where I came into my own as a filmmaker. All of the faculty were extremely encouraging of my filmmaking and gave me the freedom to learn and grow while at school.”

Some of Carroll’s best and favorite filmmaking moments were while he was at Archbishop Wood. During his junior year, he was given an entry form to the Derek Freese Film Festival by Mr. Velten. When Carroll described this experience, he said, “I decided to write a short film about a young unemployed man who is told on the night of his anniversary that his house is being foreclosed. He decides to rob a bank to bailout his family. I wrote BAILOUT in one week, shot it in one week with my



high school friends, and cut it together in a couple of days. We were working twenty four/seven on it. We even shot a car chase. I pulled an all-nighter editing it the night before SATs and submitted it minutes before the deadline... Mr. Velten played BAILOUT to the entire school, and again people cried. It was amazing. Mr. Mangin asked if the car chase was CGI, and of course as a student I lied and said yes (sorry Mr. Mangin! The entire experience, between fighting against all odds with the schedule, surviving the trenches with my best friends and seeing the film emotionally touch so many people made it the most rewarding filmmaking experience I've ever had." Though the film was not accepted into the festival, later that year it won Best High School Narrative in the Bucks Fever Film Fest.

After his time at Archbishop Wood, Carroll attended Temple University to study Film and Media Arts. During his time at Temple, Carroll had many successful projects under mentor Kurt Eberling Jr. One of Carroll's short films, *Words of Atonement*, won Best Undergraduate Film during his freshman year. This led to other things going forward in his career. Cinematographer Brett Graybill worked with Carroll on the film, and Graybill would end up introducing Carroll to Richard Fisher, owner of FiP Creative, an advertising agency. This is where Carroll had his first commercial opportunity as a director, and he continues to direct for the company. From *Words of Atonement*, Carroll met an actress who would become his wife, Chloe Carroll.

After graduation from Temple, Phil and Chloe Carroll were married, and began work on their first feature film, *THE HONEYMOON PHASE*, a "psychological thriller following a young woman who must endure a 30 day experiment exploring the honeymoon phase, isolated with a man who may or may not be her husband." Currently, the film is in the top five for

Project Greenlight and Shudder TV's Reel Fear Horror Competition. Winning would mean receiving \$300,000 for production of the film, but the plan is to begin shooting in the fall either way.

If Carroll was not a filmmaker, he thinks he'd be a writer or therapist, saying, "I love expressing myself creatively but I also love listening and helping others with their struggles. For me, film is the perfect marriage of the two. I can express myself in my films while also sharing relatable struggles with others so that they do not feel alone. I believe that that the greatest gift you can give someone is to make them feel alive and connected to other people. Whether your life is like a drama, comedy, horror, or some genre-bending mashup in between - you are never alone, because everyone has a story to tell." Carroll added,

"I'd also just like to take one final moment to again thank everyone in the Archbishop Wood community for helping me to grow into the filmmaker I am today. Back in April, when there was public voting period for the Reel Fear Horror Contest, the Wood community rallied behind Chloe and I to help us win the public vote. It's so heartwarming to know that so many people came together to help us make our dreams come true. I'll never forget the Viking support I've received and very much hope to find a way to give back in the future!"

# We Remember Gerri Garofalo, Icon, Teacher, Mentor, and Faithful Friend

It was with profound sadness that the Archbishop Wood family learned of the unexpected passing of Gerri Garofalo on June 21, 2017. She had waged a valiant and courageous fight against cancer for two and a half years. Gerri was so thrilled to be able to tell everyone that she was cancer free in the spring. One more surgery, then recuperation, and she would be back on Margate's beach! Sadly, that was not to be. In the end, her huge and loving heart could not take the strain.

Gerri walked in the door of Archbishop Wood High School in September of 1964 as a member of the first freshman class and continued to be a real presence for the next 50 years. Essentially, she was in the school until her sick leave began in January of 2015. Gerri was a member of the Class of 1968, which was the first graduating class to attend Wood for four years. She then attended Bucks County Community College, earned her Bachelor's Degree from LaSalle University and a Master's Degree from Lehigh University. While Gerri was in college, she maintained her ties at Wood by coaching the swim team and then student teaching with Bill Collins. After graduating from LaSalle, she returned to Wood to teach.

Gerri loved her time as a student at Archbishop Wood, making many happy memories and lifelong friends. She was an athlete and a leader. Gerri played basketball and softball. One of Gerri's many nicknames was, "Ravioli." Every time she was on the foul line the fans would sing, "When the ball hits the rim, please make it go in, Ravioli."

Gerri was also elected to Student Council. Back in those days, the Student Council served as hall monitors between classes to keep things moving. However, Gerri was usually the cause of a slow moving hallway because she was socializing and laughing with her friends. She enjoyed telling stories of being in the hallway during class time. She said that the trick was to always carry a trash can so that everyone thought she was helping her teacher. Who would have ever predicted that Gerri would serve as the acting disciplinarian for a semester in the 2000 school year?

Gerri came back to teach in September of 1973. As an educator, she was the consummate professional and an inspirational teacher. At the same time, her classes were fun and she enjoyed telling stories of her travels. In her early days as a World Cultures teacher, she was adamant about geography and maps. Gerri was determined that her students know what ocean they were in when they went to, "the shore." She made her experiences as a blackjack and roulette dealer relevant in her Sociology and Psychology classes, and her students loved it.

Being at Wood for so many years, Gerri gave a unique perspective on aging. In the beginning, her students said, "You went to school with my sister." As time went on, she began to hear, "you went to school with my mom," and then it was, "you taught my mom." Then it became, "you went to school with my grandmother." The next step was, "you taught



my grandmother!" Gerri vowed that the first time she heard that phrase, she was out the door!

Gifted and a giver, Gerri generously shared her time and considerable talents to activities outside the classroom. As a former softball player, she was very excited when she was chosen to be the softball coach in 1976. On her first day coaching, she was so excited that she forgot to keep her eye on the ball, was hit on the head and missed a week of school with a concussion. Gerri had very high standards for her softball managers. They had to know how to keep the scorebook because she didn't! For her athletic prowess and coaching, Gerri was inducted as one of the first honorees of the Archbishop Wood Athletic Hall of

Fame.

Being Student Council Moderator proved to be much safer. In March of 1976, Gerri organized the "Little Kids Day Marathon." The students played games all day, while Gerri wore a clown costume with full makeup and roller skated around the gym. Three thousand dollars was raised for Children's Hospital of Philadelphia for use in the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit. Several years later, a former student came back to Wood to tell Gerri that her baby was in the NICU and the equipment used for her baby had a plaque on it stating that it was donated by the Archbishop Wood Student Council. Her community service did not end there. She ran two Red Cross Blood Drives at Wood each year for more than 35 years. Woods' blood drives often set records for high school donations and the Red Cross loved coming to Wood because the drives were so well run and organized. Gerri was dedicated to inspiring her students to excel in all areas of their lives.

One of her proudest moments was being honored by the National Liberty Museum in Philadelphia with the, "Teachers as Heroes Award for Educators in the Delaware Valley That Make a Difference" in the community. She was a special teacher inspiring her students not only to do well academically, but to serve others and achieve their fullest potential.

Gerri loved all things musical. At age 9, she received an accordion for her birthday, which began what was to be a love of entertaining. Gerri started a band, "The Majestics," at age 16. They provided music for many banquets and weddings for over 35 years. Graduates of the Girls School will always remember the Annual Talent Show. "Heatwave," became her signature song and she would have the whole gym singing and dancing at the end of each Talent Show. Because of her deep love of family and music, Gerri organized the first Father-Daughter Dance in May, 1979. These dances provided many special memories for girls and their fathers. The dads would all beg to be in the singing contest, and the elimination dances were unforgettable with funny categories such as, "If I Ever Gave You a Demerit - Sit Down!"

Another topic of conversation that revolved around Gerri for many years was her incredibly thick curly hair. In her high school days she was called, “Poodle Head,” and “Brillo Head.” At a time when long straight hair was the norm, Gerri stood out in the crowd. Many students and faculty from the later years will remember her as, “Accu-Curl.” Her hair enabled her to predict coming snowstorms and, more importantly, a day off from school!

Gerri was a people person. She had friends from all over the country, many of them former students. Gerri was always meeting someone for lunch or dinner, usually at a Chinese or Italian restaurant. She loved kids and they loved her. Gerri really enjoyed meeting the children and then the grandchildren of her former students. Her refrigerator was covered with all the pictures of kids who called her, “Aunt Gerri,” and she loved it! Gerri was wonderful with senior citizens as well. It was not unusual for Gerri to stop by the home of some of her friends’ parents just to say “Hi,” drop off some figs, or a bargain from the grocery store that she knew they liked. She also enjoyed going to St. Joseph’s Villa to see her former teachers and colleagues. Gerri loved to laugh and tell stories and her smile could light up a room.

Last, but not least, Gerri’s gratitude to her Archbishop Wood family was profound. Last November, she attended the annual Thanksgiving

Mass to personally thank everyone for all of their love and support during her journey. She felt that her Wood family was with her every step of the way. It was a constant source of hope and comfort. Gerri truly believed that the love and prayers from her Wood family gave her great strength. Gerri was always ready to bring a bit of humor to lighten the mood during her numerous scans and procedures. She always told the technicians that she just might glow in the dark because so many people were praying for her.

Monsignor Beisel encouraged everyone at her funeral mass to think of Gerri’s many virtues and try to emulate them. We will all be better for having known her. Last, but not least, the next time you hear a weather forecast for a heat wave, or a snowstorm with the potential for a day off, and especially when you are, “down the shore,” in the Atlantic Ocean, think of Gerri and smile.....Gerri loved to make people smile.

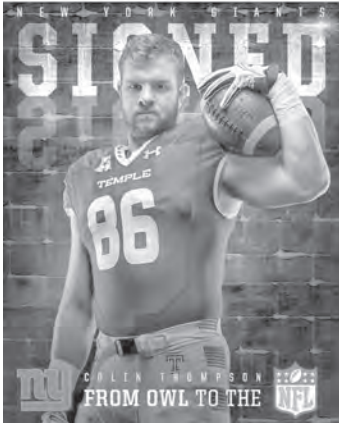

Starting here I didn't know much about our school, but over the year I got to know the students, teachers, families, coaches, and the school's culture. In the fall I read this Tweet and now I get it, but it was, "Nobody likes to talk about their high school more than people who went to Archbishop Wood." Our kids, families, and alumni are really dedicated to this school and they want to see it succeed and excel. People come here and they love it and that's very apparent after my time here. It was more like my impression of Wood was really confirmed not necessarily changed.

**Q: Looking forward, what do you hope to work on in the future?**

Well, I want our successful clubs to continue to be successful, but to be the model of what a successful club could be. So that anyone wanting to start a new club can see that and know what to do. I also want our various clubs that are involved with media to grow over the next few years. I would also like to see more creative outlets for students. # Fifty Years? Dear God.

Any girl who attended Archbishop Wood starting in 1967 has had Ms. Fitzgibbons for gym class. Known by all as Ms. Fitz, she has been a familiar face at Wood for fifty years. When I went into Ms. Fitz's office to interview her, I introduced myself but she immediately said, "I know who you are." This shocked me. I did not realize she remembered me; for two years I had regularly heard her tell me, "Don't stand there like a mannequin!" This is one of Ms. Fitz's signature phrases that I am sure she has been using since she started here at Wood.

When I asked Ms. Fitz what Wood was like when she started, she said, "Dear. God." She told me that Wood was fairly new and it was separate; boys in one school, girls in another, separated by a large green lawn. She knew Mr. Kelly, the boys' gym teacher, from grammar school so they came together for some gym classes. In addition to teaching girls physical education, Ms. Fitz was the girls' athletic director until the merger. She coached softball, swimming, and varsity basketball for the girls. Looking back, she remembers softball as her favorite because of how many former students with which she is still friendly. Then when the schools merged in 1990, Ms. Fitz was not affected much because the gym classes never became coed. Life went on.

Currently, Ms. Fitz teaches several physical education classes each day. She starts off with an article telling the girls how important good



posture is or reminding them how awful smoking is. ("It's a dirty, filthy, rotten habit.") Then she instructs the girls as they play volleyball, soccer, softball, or the favorites, archery and golf. Recently introduced is ultimate Frisbee. Ms. Fitz commented that she does not have a favorite activity to teach, but likes each one as it came along. She does enjoy, however, how much fun her students have during archery and golf.

I asked Ms. Fitz what her favorite memory at Wood has been so far. She paused and thought for a moment and then recalled when she was coaching girls' basketball. They had a game against Newmann-Goretti at the Palestra in Philadelphia. She took the girls down a few days early to practice but instead of practicing, they ran up and down the steps. Ms. Fitz smiled remembering this event and said that the girls had called themselves "Fitz's Farmers" that year.

My final question was the impact that Archbishop Wood has had on Ms. Fitz's life. She immediately said that the friends she has made on the way are the most important thing. "[It's] friends that you have made along the way, not just at Wood but at other schools. It's social and athletics." In her teaching career, she has learned that demanding and showing respect is important. She recalled the first time a student told her that Ms. Fitz had taught her mother. At this point she has taught whole families, she said. All of these students have become part of Ms. Fitz's graduate family and will remember the role she played in their high school career forever.

Including two-year schools, 98 percent of students from the graduating class will be furthering their education. Karly Brown was also awarded the Naval Reserve Officer Training Corps scholarship and will be furthering her education at Temple University in the honors program. Karly, along with Jacquelyn Sherman, was given the honor to speak at graduation. Andrew Flinn will attend Villanova University. Andrew completed high school ranking second in the Class of 2017, right behind Erin Lalli who was ranked number one.

A member of the graduating class, Brian Fennessey said, "The class of 2017 is rooted in Archbishop Wood, but will branch out to do bigger and better things." These students will be remembered for their hard work, perseverance, and the many successes they brought to Archbishop Wood. 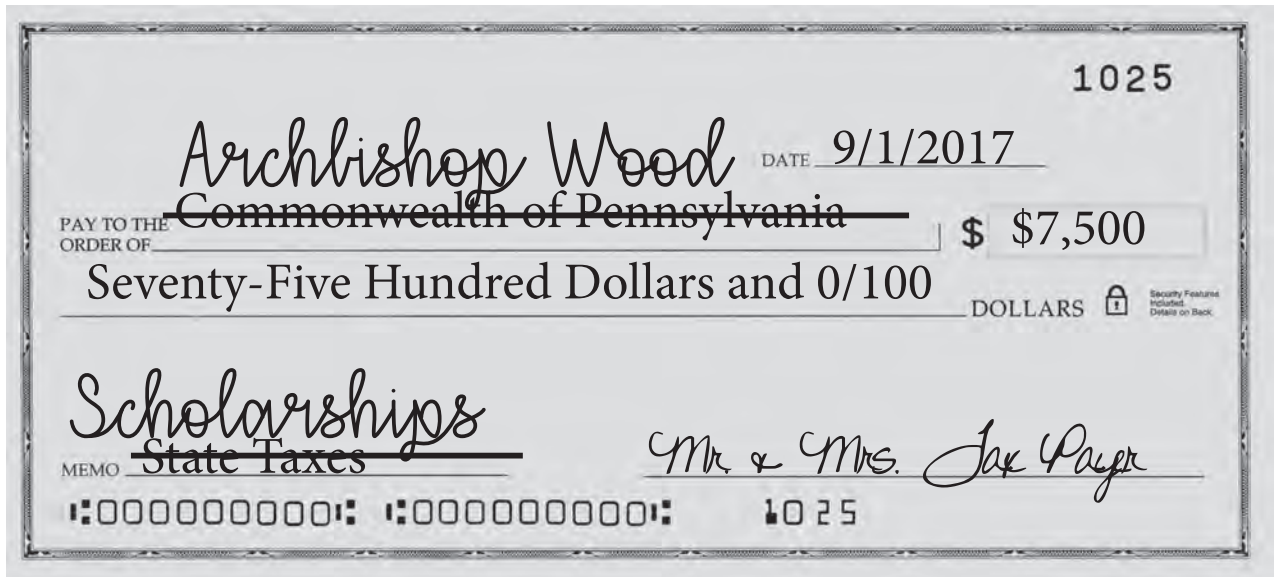

## MISSION STATEMENT

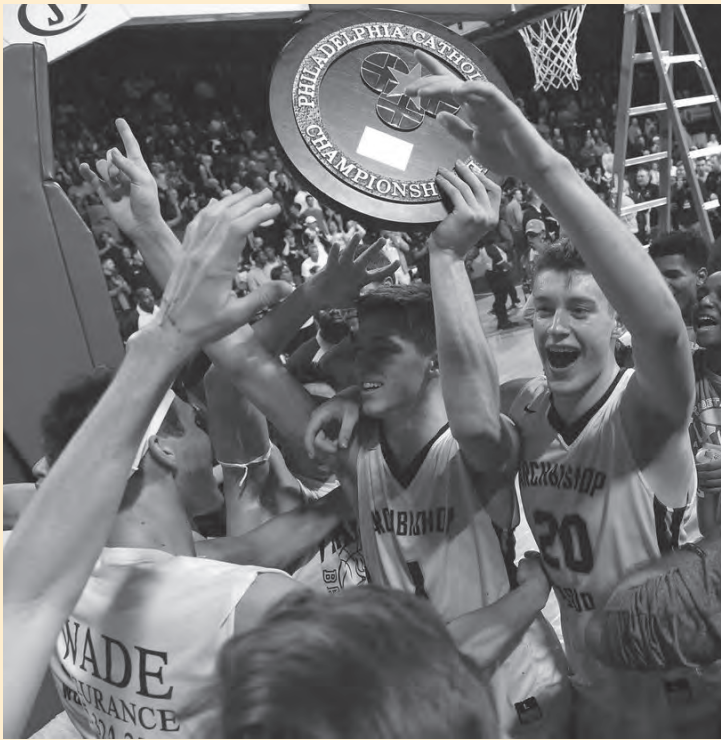

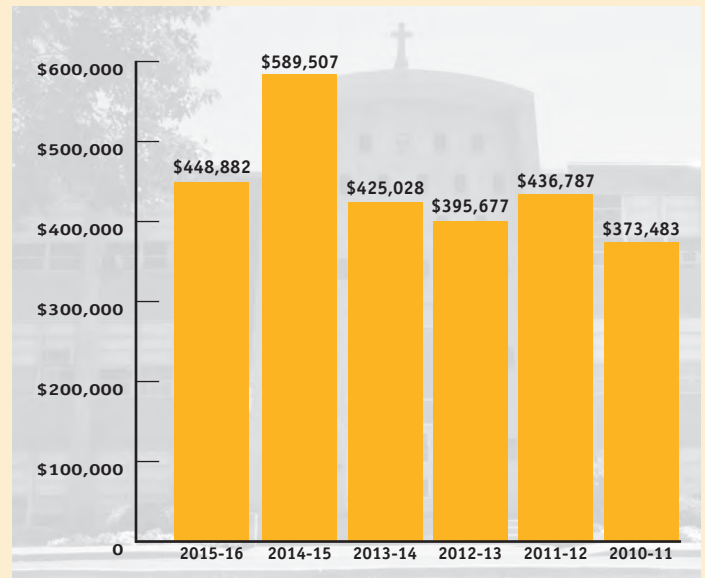
