hope that this edition of the “Viking” magazine finds you well. Since my last communication to you, many wonderful things have taken place at Archbishop Wood: Our 50th Anniversary Gala was a great success as you will see by the pages in this edition of the magazine, and we have signed contracts with Shultz and Williams, to manage our Capital Campaign, and ELA Sports to be the construction managers for our sport complex. The campaign will have three silos: tuition assistance, the sports complex, and the renovation of all of our science labs. These are very exciting times for Archbishop Wood. The campaign is under way and the surveying and storm water drainage has been completed, and we are now beginning the process to obtain permits from Warminster Township.

As I stated earlier, the 50th Gala was a great success. Approximately four hundred alumni attended and another three hundred returned on Sunday for the Alumni Mass and Garden Blessing. Our next Alumni Weekend will reinstate the Hall of Fame on Saturday Night, followed by the Mass and Garden Blessing on Sunday. It will be a real Alumni Weekend where we can join together and share memories, recognize alums, and spread the good news of Archbishop Wood and the Viking Spirit.

Archbishop Wood is thriving! The Class of 2018 numbers at 277 and our overall enrollment is 1090 as of this writing. The successes of our students never fail to amaze me. This year’s graduating class received over thirty-two million dollars in scholarships and grants, and we have fourteen Neumann Scholars, as well as nine members of All Catholic Band, Chorus, and Orchestra. One hundred and twenty three of our students earned three or more college credits through our Dual Enrollment programs. We will be announcing two students as National Merit Scholar finalists, nine students achieving commended status and two receiving National Merit Special Scholarships. Our Athletic teams continue their path to victory, winning State Championships in Football for two of the last three years, securing ten District XII Championships in boys and girls sports, and having one hundred and

sixteen All Catholic Athletes and nineteen All State Athletes.

Like any successful institution, Archbishop Wood is not content to rest on its laurels. With the academic vision of our Principal, Mrs. Mary Harkins, and an administrative team, faculty, staff, and community who continually strive for excellence, Archbishop Wood High School will continue to prepare young men and women for the future in a faith-based Catholic Education.

As you can see, we are truly celebrating fifty years of excellence and we celebrate together, for without all of you and the generosity that you show to Archbishop Wood, all of our accomplishments would not be possible. We are the “Viking Family”: the alumni, parents, teachers, staff, students, and community are what make up a long line of traditions and memories that will go on long into the future. Behind the scenes, it takes a lot of financial aid to be able to build and operate a place as special as the Learning Commons. It took many donations and aids to complete the Commons, and in the end it turned out to be very successful. One of the main donors to the funds was the late Mrs. Mary Agnes "Pat" Jacobs. Mrs. Jacobs was a graduate of the Little Flower Catholic High School for Girls, and her children attended Archbishop Wood. Although Mrs. Jacobs did not donate directly to Wood, her donations greatly benefited the school.

"She donated because she loved Catholic schools and was devoted to her faith," said Mrs. Patrice DeMaria, the daughter of Mrs. Jacobs, who graduated from Archbishop Wood in 1985. "She truly was a wonderful woman."

A wonderful woman's grateful donations turned into something very special for the Archbishop Wood community. When asked about what her and her brothers Mike, Steve, and Brian Jacobs thought when they saw the finished Learning Commons when they came for the blessing by Archbishop Chaput, the siblings had two words: overwhelmed and gorgeous.

It makes me and my brothers feel proud to tell the kids that my mother's name is on the wall."

Patrice reminisced about her mothering saying, "She gave of herself and none of us ever knew until the last couple years of her life how much she gave of herself for us and the other charities that she gave to. She is more tremendous now than I think I ever realized when she was alive and she was pretty amazing when she was still alive."

Thanks to Mrs. Jacobs, Archbishop Wood has gained a fantastic area where students can grow and work in a safe, comfortable environment with no pressure at all. During lunch, study hall, and before or after school, the Learning Commons is a perfect place to get school work done, spend time with friends, and simply relax. A wonderful woman's generous donations turned into a truly wonderful thing for Archbishop Wood.

# Craig Hamilton '85 Travels the World with the Philadelphia Orchestra

Not many Archbishop Wood alumni can boast the same level of success as Craig Hamilton, Class of 1985. Since graduating, he has not only become one of the chief representatives of one of Philadelphia's most iconic organizations, but has also earned himself an influential career that allows him to make connections all over the world. Craig is currently the Vice President of Global Initiatives and Government Relations for the Philadelphia Orchestra. He oversees the Orchestra's international and local

tours, as well as its many community outreach programs and national residency programs. He represents the Orchestra at the city, state, and federal levels of government. Craig interacts with both local and foreign governments to gain support and exposure for the organization. His work has led to many great and exciting opportunities for both the Orchestra and the city of Philadelphia.

Craig has been working with the Philadelphia Orchestra for 10 years. While working with the Orchestra, Craig has had the pleasure of

traveling around the world and seeing many foreign countries. Over the course of his career he has traveled to Paris, London, Singapore, Berlin, Madrid, Taipei, Tokyo, Luxembourg, and many more. He has even helped the Orchestra organize a tour throughout China, and is the President of the Orchestra's China Residency Program. He worked closely with Ambassador Nicholas Platt, who oversaw the Orchestra's first historic visit to China in 1973. After asking Craig what it was like corresponding with a communist government like China, he replied, "What I have learned most is that the Chinese and American people have more in common than what they don't ... and perhaps just importantly that the Chinese people and the American people genuinely enjoy working together and learning from each other. Also, I have learned that the power of music, friendship and loyalty transcends any differences between our governing styles."

At the heart of Craig Hamilton's work with the Philadelphia Orchestra is not only his time and devotion to the organization, but his love and passion for music and the arts. He and the Orchestra have been making great attempts to reach out to all members of the global community. They perform many free local concerts and have brought music and educational programs to people throughout the Delaware Valley. The Orchestra is also making more efforts to appeal to a "mainstream" audience by coming up with creative and unique ideas,



like performing the soundtracks to classic Pixar films and other movies. According to Craig, these are all reasons why the Philadelphia Orchestra is one of the best, if not the best, Orchestras in the World.

Needless to say, Craig has had a very long and colorful career that has helped bring him to where he is today. After graduating from Archbishop Wood in 1985, he began taking classes at Temple University, where he majored in journalism, specializing in Public Relations. While earning his bachelor's degree at Temple, he was offered an internship at the Greater Philadelphia Chamber of Commerce. After working as a publicist for the Chamber, Craig began working at the Opera Company of Philadelphia, his first experience of working in the arts. Craig cites this job as a key learning experience. He says, "It gave me the opportunity to learn more about marketing and advertising, and also broaden my communication skill set." After becoming the Director of Marketing and Communications, and spending almost 10 years with the Opera company, Craig was offered a job at WHYY.

As the Executive director of Development at WHYY, Craig was responsible for the station's fundraising efforts, marketing campaigns and community events. Although he enjoyed the work, he missed playing an active role in the arts like he had done while he worked for the Opera

Company. Luckily, he soon received an offer to work for the Philadelphia Orchestra as the Director of Development, an honor he gladly accepted.

Along with these prestigious accomplishments, Craig is also an Emmy award winner, a member of the Board of Directors of the Philadelphia Cultural Fund and Azuka Theater Company. He serves on the Development Committee for the Greater Philadelphia Cultural Alliance. Craig was also named one of Philadelphia's "101 Real Leaders" by the Philadelphia Inquirer.

Although Craig is now a part of one of the most successful orchestras in the world, he still remembers where his success began; in Archbishop Wood. While attending Wood, he was in several school shows, including *The Music Man* in 1985. He was also a member of the school's Yearbook Committee. He speaks highly of Archbishop Wood, saying, "*Archbishop Wood helped enhance my self-confidence and also showed me the importance of 'community.' The community of students, faculty and alumni at Wood was a very close one, and that combined community gave me a sense of belonging and confidence.*" Craig's fascinating and successful career is a testament to his character, hard work, and strong values. He is a graduate that Archbishop Wood should be proud to call their own.

Ryan Martin entered his senior year with the ambition to pilot a new program at Archbishop Wood High School; Mini-Thon. Modeled after Penn State's THON, mini-thon is a philanthropy founded by the Four Diamonds Fund which extends participation to elementary, middle and high school students across the state of Pennsylvania to hold dance-a-thons. The dance-a-thons allow the participants to raise money to support the Four Diamonds Fund; this fund offsets the costs

of treatment for children with cancer and provides care needed to enhance the welfare of the family. Remaining money is allotted to research for finding a cure. Ryan's inspiration stemmed from his contact with friends at Penn State and grew throughout the school. He organized a committee and with the efforts of Wood students, faculty, parents, local businesses, family and friends over \$41,000 was raised for the Four Diamonds.

# RoboVikings Take Regional Title

The Archbishop Wood robotics team, the Fighting RoboVikings, was founded as an extracurricular activity for students and adults in November 2006. The program is many faceted and draws in not only the “techies” and science buffs but also the athletes, artists, and business entrepreneurs. Since its founding the team has soared to local, state-wide, and world-wide recognition. The team participates in local and state competitions during its regular competition season from January through April, as well as in off season competitions from June through November. This past year was one of our most successful. The team ranked 2<sup>nd</sup> offensively in the Tri-state region (PA/DE/NJ) and 113<sup>th</sup> world-wide out of 2729 teams. This year we attended our first out of state invitational competition in Richmond VA and won undefeated in the elimination rounds having only lost one match in the qualification rounds. This qualified us to participate in the World Robotics competition in St. Louis, MO. At our local competitions we also won awards for “Gracious Professionalism” and “Innovation in Controls” sponsored by Rockwell Automation Corp. In addition to the competitions, the team and adult mentors are involved in extensive community service including both charitable service and educational service. The team prepared Christmas boxes for St John’s Hospice in Philadelphia, prepared meals for the Bucks County Aid for Friends, collected funds to aid the families in Ewing NJ after the explosion disaster, sponsored a grade school level Lego Robotics tournament in the south gym, and mentored both high school and grade school level robotics teams. Our success is only possible through the dedication of the students, adult mentors, parents, and sponsors, as well as, the support of the school and its alumni. The team is financially self-sustained by fund raising events and sponsor contributions. Each season we are required to build an entirely new robot to address each year’s new game challenge, essentially, from “a bag of parts”. The cost of the materials ranges from \$3,000 to \$4,000 and the registration fees for in season competitions range individually from \$4,000 to \$5,000. This past year our registration costs alone totaled \$14,000. We would be remiss if we did not thank our major sponsors PECO, Lockheed Martin Corp, and Signature Consultant Corp, as well as, several individual alumni that have contributed anonymously to our success. Now for a little introduction to the program at Archbishop Wood and the international program in which we participate: Robotics is a multi-disciplinary tool that is being used increasingly by tens of thousands of schools worldwide to integrate STEM education. It inspires students to make connections across multiple disciplines rather than just learning each topic in isolation. Robotics engages students in an



inquiry-based approach where they are encouraged to collaborate and be creative in solving open-ended robotics challenges, and it offers a unique platform to address many areas of 21<sup>st</sup> century learning. It combines mechanical, electronic, electrical and computer programming skills, as well as, the business and management skills needed for the young entrepreneur. Students are motivated to learn by creating their own robotic devices, while at the same time they gain a deeper understanding of interdisciplinary fields of study. In addition, robotics appeals to a broad range of students at all levels from K through 12. Robotics is exciting and fun for students of all ages. And Robotics offers a truly comprehensive approach to learning:

- Robotics teaches through discovery using timely cause and effect learning
- It offers numerical competency through both mathematics and measurement, the latter being something often neglected in education
- It gives a truly visual grasp of both math and science
- It builds logical thinking
- It inspires and rewards innovation and creativity
- It enhances problem solving skills
- It develops team and collaborative working skills
- It instills responsibility and personal ownership
- It builds self-confidence through successfully accomplishing difficult tasks
- And it helps students to learn to absorb future technologies with ease

The FIRST Robotics program is a world-wide program that was founded in 1989 with exactly those learning goals in mind. FIRST stands for “For Inspiration and Recognition of Science and Technology”. FIRST is by far the largest and most effective robotics education and competition program in the world and was founded by Dean Kamen, inventor of the Segway and the AutoSyringe drug infusion pump, and Woodie Flowers, emeritus professor of mechanical engineering at MIT. # Q & A with Joseph Garvin, Class of 1976

*Joseph Garvin is a graduate of the Archbishop Wood class of 1976. He currently works as a camera operator aboard the Chopper 3 Helicopter for CBS Philly news. We caught up with Joseph to find out about his high school experience at Wood and how it has brought him success in his career today.*

**Q: What were you involved in at Wood that led you to pursue a career in photography and video?**

I graduated from Wood in 1976, the bicentennial year. There was a lot going on at the time; for example, the Flyers had just won the Stanley Cup. The year before, our football team won the city championship title that was played at Veterans stadium. I was the yearbook and Crossroads Photographer (our school paper) and was able to get a press pass for the sidelines of that event. At that game I decided that I wanted to have a career in Photography and Video. Most of my high school years were spent behind a camera. When I was not taking pictures at school, I could normally be found developing film in my darkroom at home. My senior year I joined the Wood TV studio crew and dreamed of some day working for a TV station.

**Q: Where did you attend college and where did you work in the years following graduation?**

Before I knew it I was graduating from Temple University with a BA in Communications. I soon learned how difficult it really was to even just get an entry-level job in the television industry. So I worked a variety of part time jobs and then started my own company in the photography and video production field. Eventually, I stopped sending out resumes and concentrated my efforts on videotaping special events and commercial photography. As years went by, I gained new clients and lost some to competitors, but I always had work to keep me busy.

**Q: How did you end up landing a job with one of the largest news channels in Philadelphia- channel 3 CBS Philly?**

When you least expect it fate has a way of helping you out. A few years ago I was photographing a wedding and started a conversation

with the video guy. We had a few things in common; we were both pilots and liked working in the media profession. He told me of an opening for a back up camera operator with a news helicopter. I dusted off my resume and sent it to the company the next day. For three years I worked part time as a back up and soon a full time position at Chopper 3 became available. This position combines my background in Aviation, Photography, and Video, all of which have been passions of mine since the mid 70's when I was a student at Archbishop Wood.

**Q: Would you consider your current job to be your “dream job” or are you still looking to take another route in the television industry?**

It has often been said, “Do something you love and work will never seem like a chore or become dull.” Well it has only taken me 30 years to prove that statement true. I landed my dream job in the TV industry as a cameraman for Chopper 3. I still do some freelance photography but working full time in the news business tends to keep you busy. I can honestly say that very few people are lucky enough to have the amazing and constantly changing scenic view from their office window that I enjoy every day.

One day it might be the Philadelphia skyline or a half hour later the sandy beaches of Atlantic City. That is just one advantage of being a camera operator aboard the news helicopter Chopper 3. There is never a dull moment.



# Austin Iorio '06 is flying high with the Marines

*Archbishop Wood graduates are out doing great things in the world today. First Lieutenant Austin Iorio, USMC, is a great example of these people. Austin graduated from Wood in 2006 and went on to graduate from Penn State University in 2010 with a degree in security and risk analysis. He worked at Lockheed Martin in Newtown before he was able to submit a package to the selection board for the Marine Corps. The already long process was prolonged because Austin needed a medical waiver for eye surgery. However, Austin is now doing very well in his training and has traveled to many places in doing so.*

**Q: Did your time at Archbishop Wood influence your decision to join the military? If so, how?**

I think in some ways it did, yes. Honestly, when I was going through high school the thought of joining the military was always there but I also knew I wanted to pursue a college education. Even in college, I didn't get serious about pursuing this goal until my senior year. I had done internships both sophomore and junior year which I definitely appreciated but it also helped affirm my belief that I wasn't ready for a desk job.

**Q: Did you ever have any regrets on your decision to join the military?**

Not at all. Everybody's experience in the military is different and you'll find people along the way that will say they regret their decision to join and that's always unfortunate. I think it's what you make of it. (It is) No different than anything else in life really. The path to aviation in the Marine Corps is a difficult one and they don't hide the fact that your selection will always come down to the "needs of the Marine Corps". Ultimately it comes down to focusing only on what you can control and letting the rest take care of itself.

**Q: What places has your time flying with the military brought you? Was it easy to learn how to fly the aircrafts?**

The typical path for a Marine Corps officer once they get selected is to attend Officer Candidate School (OCS). OCS is in Quantico, VA, it's a 10 week program that is similar to boot camp with a heavy emphasis on evaluating leadership potential. From OCS we move on



to what is called The Basic School (TBS) also in Quantico, VA. The Marine Corps is unique amongst the other branches in that the first 6-8 months of every Marine officer's career is the same. We all go through OCS at some point and then move on to TBS. TBS is a 6 month course combining a series of field exercises and classroom study to ensure each Marine officer has an adequate background in basic infantry tactics and an understanding of how the different facets of the Marine Corps work together.

Once you finish TBS you move on to Pensacola, FL where you start Aviation Pre flight Indoctrination (API). API is a ground school focusing mainly on aerodynamics/navigation/ and engines. API has been described as a college semester worth of information packed into 4 weeks. I tend to agree with that. Once we get done the 4 week ground school we then move onto the famous "helo dunker" and other water survival challenges. We spend about 2 weeks building ourselves up for the mile swim in our flight gear.

If you make it through API you then get to start primary flight training. There are two places you can go for that, either here at Whiting Field which is just north of Pensacola or you can go down to Corpus Christi, TX. In primary we train on the Beechcraft T-6B aircraft. The T6 was an absolute blast to fly. You start with the basics, learning how to take off and land, maintain altitude, airspeed and use the navigation systems. As you progress it gets more complicated but also way more fun. We go through aerobatic training doing loops, barrel rolls, cuban eights, immelmans, splits, aileron rolls. We also learn instrument flying (flying in the clouds) and towards the end of the syllabus we do formation flights. Easily some of the most fun flying I've done so far.

After primary, Marines will select either C-130s, helicopters (helos), jets, or the V-22 Osprey. Helo pilots train at South Whiting field (where I am stationed at currently). I'm flying the TH-57C which is basically a Bell 206 helicopter. I'm loving helicopters; it's a challenge and definitely a step up from primary, but (it is) a ton of fun. I'll be honest; the transition from flying the T6 to flying a helicopter was pretty difficult. There are a lot of things about flying helicopters that seems counter intuitive when you first learn. Hovering is the biggest challenge when you are first learning. You can always tell the new students from the ones who have been there for a while when you walk out to the flight line. Typically the new students are all over the place with their hovering/ air taxiing. Most guys pick it up pretty quick though.

### **Q: If you could tell a high school student one thing about joining the military, what would it be?**

Consider all your options, weigh them out thoroughly... talk to as many people as you can and find out as much information as you can but when it's all said and done go with your gut instinct. Military life is very rewarding but also a huge sacrifice. It requires a dedication that is unwavering. You'll be in constant competition with your peers to stand

out and make a good reputation for yourself. With that being said it's also a huge family. The camaraderie is on another level. If you ask any flight student they'll tell you they didn't get where they're at by themselves. We pull together and help each other out, study with each other, and learn from each other's mistakes. It's the best way to improve. Marines always have and always will have a true desire to stick together and help each other out.

His journey into the priesthood began right here in the hallways of Archbishop Wood where Viviano was encouraged by the faculty and school ministers to get involved in different school ministry and service activities. Along the way, Father Viviano met new friends who turned out to have the same passion for faith that he did. Today, he knows without a doubt that the seeds planted during his time at Wood formed an integral part of his vocational discernment. Viviano's time as a Viking made him the person he is now; an instrument of God's grace, a representative of Jesus Christ, a priest.

"Life in the priesthood is very demanding, yet very rewarding. It allows you to participate in people's lives in a way that otherwise would never be possible," Father Viviano says. "It allows you to be part of people's families and journeys at the moments which are most important, most difficult, most joyful, and most memorable." In fact, as a priest, Viviano

would like to help people rediscover the richness of the Catholic faith and the Catholic liturgy. He sees a profound depth of beauty in our Tradition, and wants all Catholics to experience the beauty that he encounters every day.

So what are Fr. Viviano's fondest memories from Archbishop Wood? "Participating in the school plays where I met most of my friends with whom I remain friends today," he says. Some of his favorite roles were Riff in *West Side Story*, the Scarecrow in *Wizard of Oz*, and Billy in *42<sup>nd</sup> Street*.

Lastly, Father Viviano leaves us with a message that I think could be beneficial to all Catholics. He says that during a time when many are leaving the Church or not practicing their faith we're often tempted to turn to innovations or gimmicks to get people back. Viviano thinks that if we expose Catholics to the fullness of truth that the faith possesses and the liturgy expresses, it

will win many back to a more convicted living of their faith.

# Keeping the Faith

**M**y name is Kristin Doyle and I am the daughter of Tom and Betty Doyle. My parents have recently fallen victim to a completely senseless act of violence, but their faith in God and the days to come stay strong. As my mom and I are Wood Alumni from the Class of '75 and '07, we have received an overwhelming amount of support from the Wood community, and could not be more thankful. My mom has continued her dedication and love for Archbishop Wood through the past seven years, coaching their Cross Country team. She continues to be an active member of their community and really enjoys her time.

My parents are both beautiful people. They are both selfless, generous, and kind to all. To know them is to love them. They are both so deserving of good health and happiness and I continue to look up to them, adore them and admire their strength.

On October 10, 2013, my parent's lives took a very tragic and unexpected turn, as did the life of my brother and I. On this day, my parent's were traveling to Florida by car. Driving straight through the night, they were on I-95 in Richmond, Virginia around 11:30 PM when another vehicle pulled alongside them and fired a shotgun, striking both of them at close range.

Through the grace of God, both of my parents remained conscience, and were able to talk each other through the next few terrifying minutes. This is where I believe Jesus took the wheel. After being shot through the throat, my mom was able to steer their large pick-up truck from the passenger seat a mile down the road, crossing lanes and eventually gliding it against the guard rail to a complete stop. Becoming my dad's hero, she immediately put pressure on his wounds and called 911. My dad was immediately unable to move any part of his body, but gave my mom specific directions on what to do next.



Only through God were they able to get to the side of the road safely without causing any type of accident with other vehicles.

Our new life started from there. My dad is now a quadriplegic, sustaining serious injury to his cervical spine, starting at C5. He has lost all sensory and motor function from his chest down, and has limited movement in his shoulders and arms, with no movement in his hands.

My dad is confined to a wheelchair and depends on others to complete all daily and life skills such as eating, drinking, grooming, working, etc.

He continues on-going physical and occupational therapy. His main goal and our largest hope is for him to gain more range in his shoulders and arms, and one day use his hands to some degree. This will enable him to live a more independent life, which my dad is so deserving of.

A catastrophic injury such as this one requires around the clock care, my mom and I being his main caregivers. Although this story makes you think each day is super hard, it is not. There are definitely good days and bad, but after an event like this, you realize that nothing in the world matters except for the people you love. If you have them, you're super lucky every single day, so LOVE who you love.

Our hope will never die and we continue to be thankful for the millions of blessings that God throws our way, such as an amazing community filled with wonderful family, friends, and unconditional love.
