
**Thanks to you, our alumni and benefactors,** Wood had the funds to open with a hybrid model to prepare for Fall, 2020..

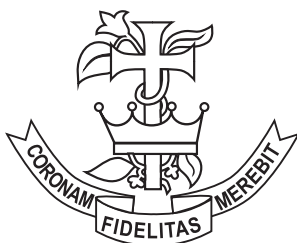

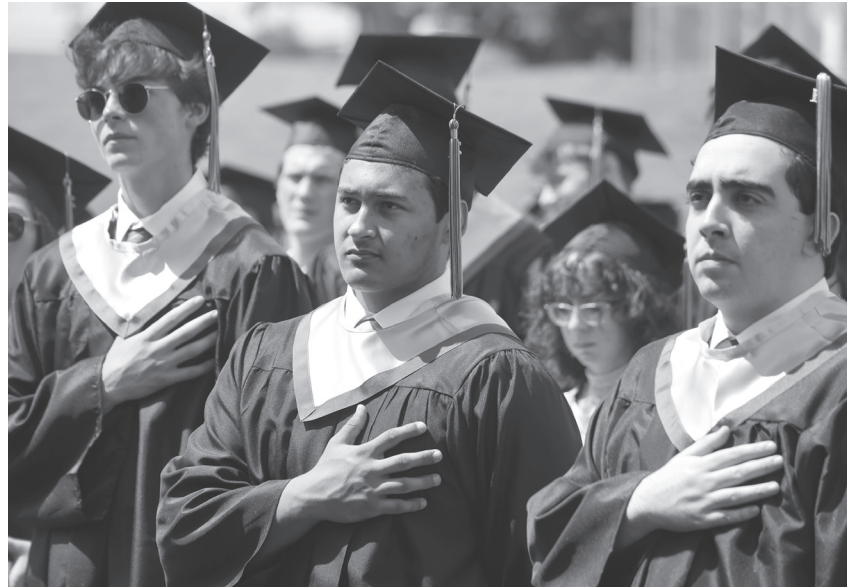

**28% of our students will venture out of state to attend college:** These states include Arizona, California, Connecticut, District of Columbia, Delaware, Florida, Illinois, Louisiana, Maine, Maryland, Massachusetts, North Carolina, New Jersey, New York, Ohio, Rhode Island, South Carolina and Virginia.



***Your first year as Principal of AWHs was a unique one due to Covid-19, can you tell us about the Peak & the Pit and how they have both helped you grow in your role?***

**PEAK:** The proudest moment I had during my first year as Principal of Archbishop Wood, was to be able to witness, in real-time, the strengths, talents and dedication of our students, faculty, staff and administration. During an average school day, I do not have the opportunity to see what this amazing group of professional educators can and

will do to overcome obstacles and solve problems. Watching everyone at Wood step out of their comfort zones and not only do things they have never had to do before, such as conduct their classes through Zoom, and, to be honest, things they did not necessarily want to do, but everyone stepped up to the plate knowing it was all worth it for the kids.

**PIT:** Not having control was difficult. My job this year was to keep all of us healthy and safe and all of our heads above water. I felt like I was driving a school bus filled with staff, faculty, students and families up a mountain, while looking down at a dangerously close cliff. I knew my responsibility was to keep us all moving forward on the best path possible that would lead us to success.

The main mission of any high school is to keep kids happy by addressing their academic, emotional and social well-being. It was frustrating as a professional who wants to open doors up for our students, to watch them repeatedly have to close. Staff and administration would plan and plan and then those plans would have to be reconfigured all over again because of local and global changes. I went from planning months in advance to weeks to days. It was what I like to call a, "productive struggle," which is when you learn the most and is a great metaphor for life itself.

***What are you looking forward to the most for the upcoming 2021-2022 school year?!***

I cannot wait to see all the kids together! There is nothing better than that! I am looking forward to greeting all of our students in person when they enter the building, together, for the first time. It will be wonderful to witness our students fully experiencing a typical day, week, month and year at Archbishop Wood High School as they receive the emotional and social benefits of interacting with their peers. Let's face it, kids have to be happy in school, and when that happens, academic excellence and confidence soon follows.

I am especially excited to welcome our incoming

freshman as well as our McDevitt, Hallahan, St. Basil's, and Our Lady of Confidence students to the Viking Family. It is our goal to make sure that these kids feel embraced and loved as if they have always been part of the Wood community. For instance, the Student Council already has two McDevitt students sitting on the Executive Board, The Best Friends Club from Our Lady of Confidence is coming to the school, and we are even building a bocce ball court since McDevitt & OLC has a strong team. It is going to be a great year!

***What would you love to see happen for Wood in FIVE years' time?!***

Five years from now, I would love to see growth in all aspects of Archbishop Wood. In 2026, we will carefully analyze the progress of the academic and extracurricular programs as well as the impact of campus enhancements. I am passionate about the fact that if we can measure and analyze the growth of the school, then we will know the school is sustainable and successful. I am dedicated to keep pushing Wood for excellence in all aspects of the school. As an administration, we are never satisfied enough to say, "Okay, this is fine, let's stop here." Wood is a very special school, so, five years from now, I want it to be an even more amazing place for students to learn and grow.

***What does Catholic Education mean to you?***

Catholic education is about teaching the whole child. My faith, your faith, our faith, is the reason we are all here today. Catholic school is about instilling respect in each other – student to student, student to teacher, family to teacher – where we work together, learn together and play together – all while expanding upon what it means to be a Christian. Catholic school is one of the most welcoming places I know. Every student, teacher, family and staff member who walk through our doors, no matter what religion they practice, become part of the Viking Family. When our students graduate, I hope they know that they are loved as children of God, that they are always a member of the Viking Family and that they will continue to follow the teachings of Jesus to make the world a better place.

***Why did you choose Catholic education for work and for your family?***

I chose Catholic education because I believe in it. I believe in Catholic education for my own kids and myself, I never considered other options. My first two children graduated from Archbishop Ryan and my youngest child graduated from Wood. Catholic education is an integral part of who I am – I even chose to earn my master's degree from a Catholic school. The tradition of excellence at Archbishop Wood is the result of everyone, since the school was built in 1964, who has been ready and willing to immerse themselves in Catholic education. I am honored to be surrounded by such wonderful individuals who have also chosen this vocation.

# A Conversation with Dan & Joan Dufner

*It was Spring 2018 when Archbishop Wood held its annual Scholarship Mass & Garden Blessing that we met Dan & Joan Dufner. They are the parents of AWHS grads: Elaine Dufner Wunder '87, Daniel Dufner, Jr. '88, Alison Dufner '89, Christine Dufner Newman '92, Edward (Ted) Dufner '94, Thomas Dufner '96, Andrew Dufner '00, Elizabeth Dufner '01 and Amy Dufner '03. After speaking with them for a few minutes about their passion for Catholic education, we wanted to learn more about their experiences!*

**Dan:** Both of us grew up in Northeast Philly. I started grade school at St. Charles Borromeo, then my parents moved and I went to St. Jerome's. For high school I attended Father Judge.

**Joan:** For grade school I went to St. Dominic's and then in 7th grade my parents moved to a new development and I attended Our Lady of Calvary. I went to St. Hubert's for high school and it was during my junior year that I met Dan.

**Dan:** Funny enough, we did not meet in school, we actually met at Nazareth Hospital. I had both of my knees operated on and had to be in the hospital for two months. Mutual friends and family members visited me and one day, Joan stopped by to say, "Hi."

**Joan:** I had to take three buses to get to St. Hubert's. While waiting for the second express to come, I would go into the hospital and visit Dan. When he got out of the hospital and started to drive, he asked me on a date to the movies. We have now been together for 57 years, married for 53.

**Dan:** We moved to Bucks County 42 years ago and started our family. There was no question that we were going to send our children to Catholic School. We wanted our



kids to live the Catholic faith during those very formidable years. For grade school, the kids went to St. Jerome's (when we still lived in Philly) and then Our Lady of Good Counsel. Each of our kids attended Archbishop Wood High School.

**Joan:** The tradition of Catholic School has been an important one for our family. I remember seeing my mom sitting at the kitchen table, carefully counting out our token money so we could get to and from school. It took a lot of work and sacrifices for my parents, for us and now for our children, to choose Catholic education, but we would not change it. It was well worth the investment! In order to support the family, Dan had to be on the road quite often for his job, while I stayed home to raise the children. It was tough, but we made it work.

**Dan:** There is no doubt that our children benefited immensely from their superb Archbishop Wood education and faith experience. We are so grateful to the teachers and staff for their dedication to the students and the legacy of the school. Our children understand what Catholic education meant for

them and the impact it had on their lives. We all reflect on their time at Archbishop Wood and understand that they are who they are and where they are, because of AWHS and their incredible teachers.

**Joan:** Because of Wood, all of our children went on to college, Allentown Catholic, Temple, Kutztown, Bloomsburg, Penn State, University of Pennsylvania, Lycoming and Shippensburg. The back of our station wagon was covered in college bumper stickers! One of our favorite memories was when, out of the blue, we got a call from Wood's guidance department. They asked us if Danny, who was accepted to every college he applied to, thought of going to an Ivy League school? We figured it would be impossible for him to get into Penn, let alone for us to afford it, but Danny was bright and the President of his class. I remember him saying, "Mom, I think I can do it -- I think I can go to Penn." He was right! It cost us less money to send Danny to Penn than for our daughter to attend Kutztown. I would not have known this if the guidance counselor had not called us. I hope

I wrote a letter thanking them for their kindness and included updates on graduating from Wood and then the University of Delaware.

Soon after, the Hirschmann Family, including Tom and Mike, reached out to thank me and let me know how moved their family was by my letter. Tom and I connected on how his parents also made sacrifices so that he and his siblings could receive a high-quality education at Wood. We shared another connection as his children went on to graduate from the University of Delaware. Mike was so kind to say that, "I think you represent exactly the type of individual my older brother Jim wanted to help when he started the scholarship many years ago." Donating to help another student has made it all worth it, but to have



such positivity from Archbishop Wood, Sarah, and the Hirschmann Family truly means a lot.

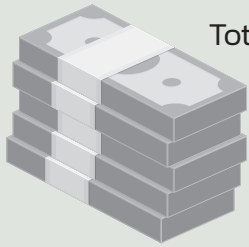
### DEMOGRAPHICS

This year, Archbishop Wood High School was able to open its doors for in-person learning with the implementation of a Hybrid Schedule. AHS students split up their time between learning from home and learning from the classroom each week. It is thanks to YOU, our Viking Family, that AHS had the technology and resources to meet all of the CDC Health & Safety Requirements.

We are pleased to share with you, the champions of Archbishop Wood H.S., some of the good news that occurred during the 2020-2021 school year, including:

- **Over \$830,000.00 in tuition assistance and scholarships was awarded to incoming and current students for the 21-22 school year.**
- **97% of the Class of 2021 are going on to post-secondary education and have earned more than \$53.3 million in scholarships, 6 of our students have chosen to go directly into the workforce/trades and 1 student has chosen to serve our country by joining the United States Coast Guard.**
- **AHS Class of 2021 graduates are attending some of the most competitive colleges and universities throughout the country (see page 4 for more details).**
- **Installation of new student lockers and showcases began in December 2020 to replace the existing structures that were original to the building since**

its inception in 1964.

- **The Remind Notification System was installed to provide immediate mobile communication (with students/parents/families) and activation of the mobile device health questionnaire required for admission into the school building.**
- **In order to swiftly move into the mandatory Hybrid Learning Schedule, six video conferencing cameras were purchased and installed in our classrooms. This installation permitted students to participate in real-time instruction from the comfort and safety of their own home.**
- **Supplies to sanitize and disinfect the school building, physical barriers to facilitate social distancing, thermometers, and other supplies necessary for reopening and operation of school facilities to effectively maintain health and safety.**
- **AHS continues to implement the One-to-One Learning Initiative; where each student will have his/her own personal device to use in the classroom and at home.**
- **NEARPOD Software was purchased and installed in the Science Department. NEARPOD is an award winning instruction software that engages students with interactive learning experiences such as lessons, videos, and formative assessments built for distanced learning, hybrid and school based settings.**
- **An audio/visual system allowed the AHS Club & Athletic Programs to broadcast live, "watch from home," events for our families and Viking community, who could not otherwise attend, due to social distancing restrictions.**
- **AHS was able to host an in-person, on campus Baccalaureate & Commencement Ceremony for the Class of 2021. This included chair rentals for graduates and guests, stage rental, sound systems, live broadcast equipment, and much more!**

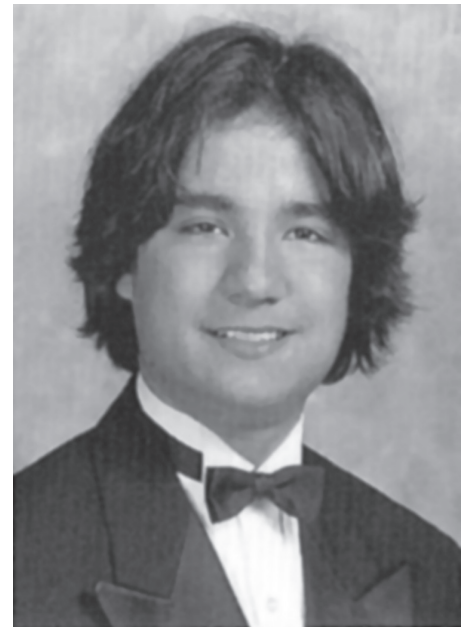
Alex is remembered by his classmates for his artistic talent, unassuming presence, which typically resulted in a witty remark, unsuspecting pranks on his friends,

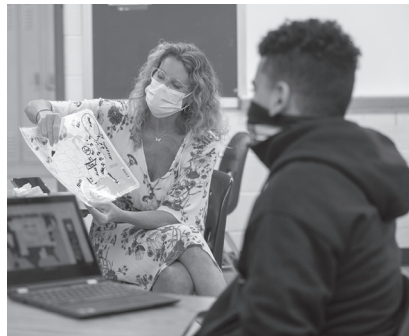

## LEARNING SUPPORT GRANT:

## SAFETY & SECURITY GRANT:

The AWHs Business/Technology Department educates students in areas of Personal Finance, Computer Programming, Business and much more.



## COVID-19 Relief GRANT:
