The 2022-23 school year was a tremendous success in many ways for our Archbishop Wood school community. The Class of 2023 was awarded an unprecedented \$53.4 million dollars in merit-based grants and scholarships to 206 colleges and universities across the United States. Our Girls Basketball Team won their third consecutive PIAA State Championship; Girls Soccer defended their title as Philadelphia Catholic League Champions for the third year in a row; we had 79 All-Catholic student-athletes; and nine of our talented musicians achieved All-Catholic status for Band and String Orchestra. There were also numerous other individual honors and awards bestowed on our Viking students, a wonderful reflection of the successes they are attaining in the classroom and beyond each day.

The generosity of our alumni, families, and friends contributed to a significant year of giving for Archbishop Wood as we raised more than \$1.2 million dollars for the Viking Fund, Scholarships, and the EITC/OSTC program. Your generous support enabled us to provide much-needed financial aid to our students with the awarding of \$1,057,425 in Academic and Viking Scholarships and Tuition Assistance Grants for the 2023-24 school year. This amount reflects your kindness in supporting our students, and their families, as they pursue a quality Catholic Education.

Archbishop Wood remains steadfast in our commitment to providing our students with the necessary resources to succeed. Whether it be upgrades to our facilities such as the new windows and roof that were subsidized by the Archdiocese of Philadelphia, or the complete refurbishment of our Business, Computers, and Information Technology Center which was made possible through the generosity of grants we received from BLOCS and Forbright Bank, we remain focused on ensuring that our families recognize the value of a Catholic Education at Wood.

Currently, our students come from 65 different grade schools which is a tremendous reflection of the positive image Archbishop Wood has in our surrounding communities. As we continue to grow in the future, we look forward to upholding the successful legacy of our Viking Alumni and we remain committed to providing these young men and women with an education that will enable them to succeed in their future personal and professional endeavors.

Thank you for your continued support and commitment to Archbishop Wood, your generosity is making a difference for our students today, tomorrow and in the future.

# A Conversation with Kevin Leslie, Class of 1978

Each student has a unique journey during their four years at Archbishop Wood, and for Kevin Leslie '78 that first step began when he walked to the mailbox each day to see if he received a letter of acceptance to Wood. Admittedly, Kevin was not a stellar student at Saint Bede's elementary school, he was more focused on sports and struggled with test-taking. He was also one of the younger students in the class since his mother had him skip kindergarten and go right to first grade. Thankfully, Kevin was admitted to Archbishop Wood and he began a journey that still influences his life today.

As the middle of three boys growing up in Churchville, Kevin and his brothers, Charles '77 and Brian, learned the importance of faith from their parents, Charles and Kathleen. Charles was a Philly guy and a graduate of Roman Catholic High School who met Kathleen while he was stationed in London during his time in the Army. She had left Ireland because of the lack of jobs and was waitressing at a restaurant when Charles and his buddies came in for dinner. They were set up on a blind date and a year later Kathleen moved to Philadelphia.

Kevin Leslie entered Archbishop Wood with no expectations. He was cut from the basketball team when he tried out in 9th grade, and after returning to try out again in 11th grade the coach informed him he needed a haircut. Even though he had recently had it done, Kevin decided that getting another trim was not important enough so he never went back to the next tryout. While his athletic aspirations fizzled, he continued attending school and doing enough to get by with homework and tests. He readily admits that he "graduated at the bottom of my class", and with no other options he attended Bucks County Community College.



While working two jobs to pay his own tuition, Kevin majored in Communications with dreams of being a broadcaster. His enthusiasm for football led him to publish a newsletter with scouting reports on all of the prospective picks for the NFL draft. This publication elevated Kevin to a new level and he was invited to not only be a guest on 1210 WCAU-AM radio with host Steve Fredericks, but also attend the draft in New York City from 1980-85. Unfortunately, his dream of becoming an NFL scout did not come to fruition and Kevin was faced with searching for a new career.

An opportunity to enter the chemical industry in 1979 led Kevin to pursue a career that propelled him on a path that he still travels today. In 1981, he began working in sales for Petrarch Systems, based in Bristol, PA, and remained there until joining Anderson Associates (Summit, NJ) in 2000. A&A eventually merged into AB Specialty Silicones, a company based in the Chicago area that Kevin and 15 others own. AB Specialty Silicones produces silicone raw materials that can be formulated into various products like medical devices, automotive paints, caulk, and a variety of others. Currently, Kevin still works in sales for AB handling the Mid-Atlantic states, Florida, and parts of Asia including Japan, Taiwan, Singapore, and Korea.

In 2020, Kevin and his wife, Rose, purchased a Kilwins Ice Cream Store franchise in an upscale outdoor mall

in their hometown of Naples, FL. The store was extremely popular from day one with most of the business occurring from October through May, the busiest tourism season. The success of their investment has led them to pursue a second franchise in the 3rd Street South section of Naples, a venture they hope to open in the next six to twelve months. Rose oversees the daily operations with their son with others assisting in supervising their twenty employees.

Kevin Leslie's successful career began with the lessons he learned as a student at Archbishop Wood. He stated that, "perseverance, toughness, and focus are lessons that stay with you later in life. Many of my teachers influenced my success including Mr. Velten who was all business and would not let you get away with anything; Mr. Devlin who taught us life lessons; and Mr. Duffy who made a lasting impression on me. Wood was different from a public school, the teachers were interested in helping us improve and the moral lessons we learned from the religious priests have stayed with me today."

Philanthropy is a valued attribute for Kevin and Rose Leslie. They established a foundation which enables underprivileged children from the Miami and Saint Petersburg area to attend sports camps each summer. The foundation works with the Police Athletic League (PAL) and other community groups to provide this opportunity and allows Rose and Kevin a chance to meet with the kids and their parents. They value the benefits in supporting today's youth and this summer they expanded their philanthropy to include students at Archbishop Wood. Kevin believes it is important to support Wood because today's students experience a different education than they would receive elsewhere. "I think of the benefits I had at Wood when I was a student, today it's pretty likely that it is the same thing, just different. Archbishop Wood prepared me for life in general."

**Where did you grow up? Family, Neighborhood, parish?**

I grew up in Delaware County in the parish of Our Lady of Perpetual Help in Morton, PA. I am the youngest of 6 kids – we all went to Cardinal O’Hara High School. I was the Class of 1982. From there I went to community college and finished at Widener University with a major in Engineering. We always went to mass, my family was very religious – my mother especially. Priesthood was not on the horizon for me – I never gave it a thought when I was young. After I finished college, I was working as an engineer. It was nothing too impressive or high power – it was entry level - a lot of paperwork. I worked there for about 7 years and during that time is when I decided to go to the seminary.

**Can you tell us a little bit about your journey into the priesthood? Did you know right away when you were in school like some of our students or did you need more time to hear God’s plan for you?**

Seeking a life of vocation, while it came later in life for me, was a very natural thing. Once I was finished with college – my life slowed down. When you’re in school you’re always busy – you have events, a bursting social life, and so many things going on at once. It isn’t until after you graduate that it all kind of slows down – at least it did for me. You’re jolted into

adulthood, you find employment, start going to work every day, you come home and there is nothing really to do. It was this slowdown that really started to change my perspective. I knew in the back of my mind that I needed to straighten things out. After graduating high school, I stopped going to confession – I never stopped going to mass, but I had completely stopped going to confession. I noticed I was carrying some guilt. I was in a rut and feeling a lack of fulfillment. I am not sure if it was the Holy Spirit or my guardian angel who helped me realize that I needed to go to confession. I prepared for two weeks – I retaught myself the Act of Contrition. On my lunch hour, I went to the cathedral in Center City and that was the beginning of a whole new chapter for me. My faith gradually became more and more lived. I started going to confession once a month and mass every day. About a year or two later I was at mass at St. Patrick’s in Rittenhouse Square and I was looking at the priest and the idea of wanting to switch positions came over me – it shocked me – I wanted to switch places with him – I was thinking he can go back to my job and I’ll stay here doing his job. I’m lucky – it was a true awakening and I wasn’t expecting it. I joined the seminary when I was 32 years old. I have now been a priest for 21 years – I was ordained in 2002.

**Before coming to Archbishop Wood, what work were you doing?**

The year before I came to Wood I was at the seminary – I was the Spiritual Director there. Before that I was teaching at Cardinal O’Hara High School for 5 years. They initially told me I’d be working at the seminary for 7-8 years and after just 1 year they called and said they wanted me at Archbishop Wood. A lot of prayer goes into every move – you have to bring it to prayer as best as you can and keep an open heart about God’s plan for you.

**How long were you at Wood? When you were here what kinds of things were you involved in, both as your**

**main roles and extracurricular?**

I was the Director of School Ministry at Wood for nine and a half years – I was nearing my tenth year when I got the call that I would be leaving. While at Wood, I taught sophomores. Sometimes I taught Freshmen too, but never the upper classmen. I managed the Kairos retreats at Wood, helped run the Community Service Corps and the Pro-Life club. I took the students on overnight trips to Washington & New York. I linked up with students at the soup kitchens on Sunday’s and organized Operation Santa Claus every year. I was the Boys & Girls Tennis Coach too. I made it a point to attend every event I possibly could. Whether it was an athletic event or an academic ceremony – I was there. As School Minister, I wanted to show the students my full support – show them how important they were. The goal was for them to see me as a constant presence in their lives. It brought me a lot of joy to support them and show them that they mattered.

**Tell us a little more about your relationship with the students and how you helped 4 students discover their calling for religious life...**

In my time at Wood I was fortunate enough to mentor several students about their interest in the priesthood and religious life. It was important to me that it should happen organically. When the opportunity would present itself, I of course would engage with the students to help them decipher their calling. A few students had pastors who connected with me and would share if they had a feeling that the student was possibly headed in a certain direction, so there were always a few kids on my radar that I would keep my eye on. In addition to having these conversations, I would also provide resources like books that help a person discern their vocation. As of present day, four students went into the seminary to study and become priests. There are a few others who expressed interest; both male and female, but as far as I know they have

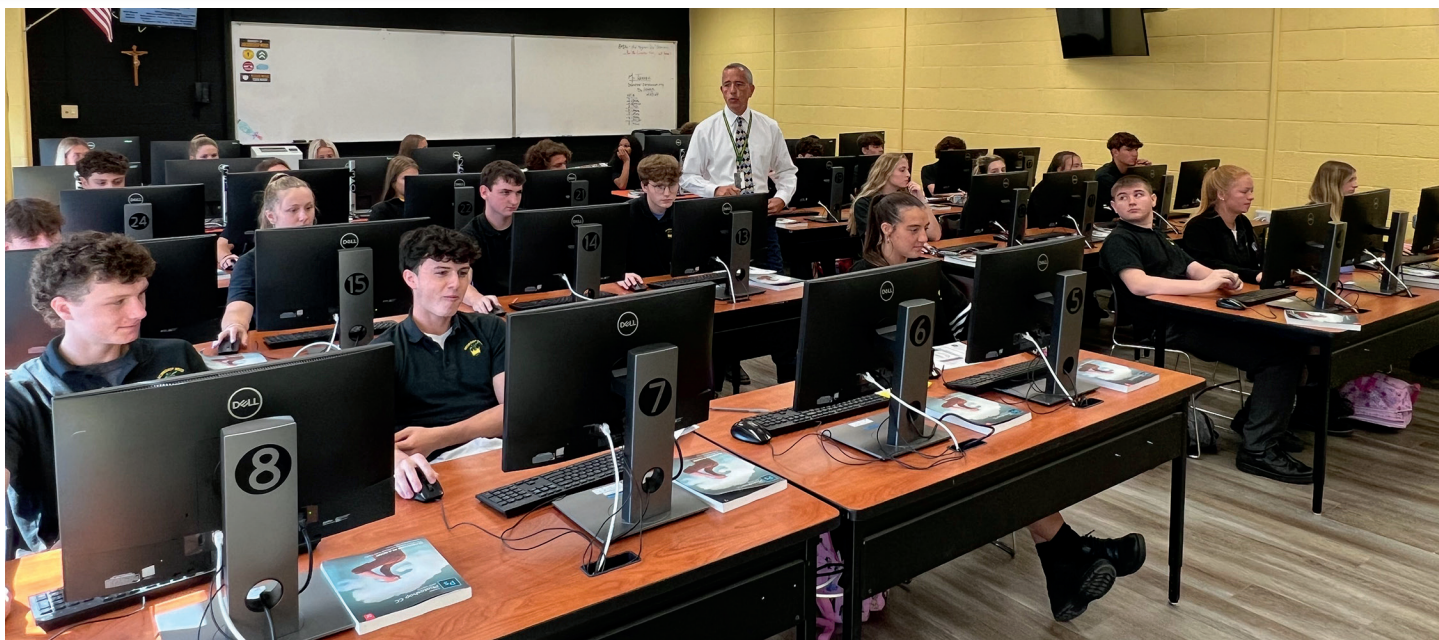

# BCIT Department Building A Comprehensive Future



The Business, Computers, and Information Technology (BCIT) Department at Archbishop Wood was the recipient of two grants that enabled numerous upgrades to be performed during the summer of 2023. Thanks to the generosity of a \$100,000 award from BLOCS (Business Leadership Organized for Catholic Schools), and an additional \$40,000 received from Forbright Bank in collaboration with Mr. Pat Rusnak (a former faculty member) many upgrades were made in the department including infrastructure and technology.

Archbishop Wood offers students the opportunity to receive a foundation in various business fundamentals through nine courses offered in our BCIT Department. Freshmen are introduced to basic skills in a course that demonstrates an understanding of Information Technology, Computer Science Fundamentals, and Financial Fundamentals. As they progress in their academic curriculum, Juniors and Seniors can take electives in courses such as Accounting, Principles of Marketing, Financial Literacy, Economics/ Entrepreneurship, and Fundamentals of Real Estate. During the 2022-23

academic year, 396 students were enrolled in these classes which reflects the interest and need for expansion in this department.

Through the generous grants received from BLOCS and Forbright Bank we are able to strengthen our commitment to providing students with essential resources that will enable their ability to broaden their academic competence in multiple areas. These awards allowed us to enhance multiple components of the BCIT department including: a live stock ticker, new laptops and computer monitors, televisions, upgraded software, and synergic seating which allows for collaboration. All of the classrooms were painted and new flooring was installed giving the department a



complete facelift.

Our investment in the upgrades and expansion of the BCIT Department enables Archbishop Wood to offer state of the art technology in an atmosphere conducive to shared learning. The intent of many of our students to pursue college degrees in the business field demonstrates the interest and success they attained at the high school level. Currently, 54% of our student body are enrolled in these elective courses, and the enhancements made through the generosity of BLOCS and Forbright Bank has strengthened Archbishop Wood's future as a viable academic institution.

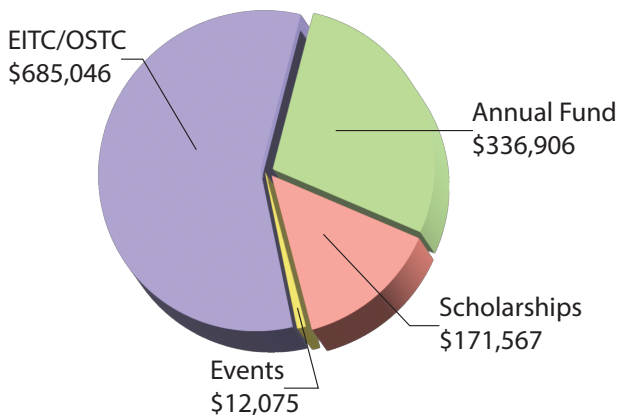

Through their generosity, the Kevin ('78) and Rose Leslie Family Scholarship was established for the 2023-24 school year to provide students from Saint Katharine Drexel Catholic school (the merger of Saint Bede's and Assumption B.V.M) with an opportunity to attend Archbishop Wood High School. Kevin and Rose appreciate the value of a Catholic Education, and he believes "that a classic curriculum along with the Arts and Business courses are definitely beneficial to students in the future. There is something for everybody at Wood."

Kevin and Rose's faith played a predominant role in his ability to overcome a major heart issue in 2021.

After waking up with a heartbeat of 203 beats per minute, Kevin was rushed to the hospital where he underwent a ventricular tachycardia ablation which scarred the bad ventricle in his heart to eliminate the fast signal. This health scare did not deter him from pursuing his passion for running, an interest that he started after he graduated from Wood. He has completed nine half-marathons and continues to run twice a week on the beach in Naples.

Kevin Leslie credits his professional success to the education he received at Archbishop Wood. His ability to succeed in the chemical industry, along with his ownership of rental property investments and

the establishment of a hedge fund for short and long-term investments, occurred because of the life lessons that were instilled during his time as a Viking student. Kevin and Rose greatly value Catholic Education and the opportunities it provides for today's students. Through their generosity in initiating the Kevin ('78) and Rose Leslie Family Scholarship, four members of the Class of 2027 were each awarded a \$2,500 scholarship for the 2023-24 school year. not yet pursued that calling any further. We know that God works in mysterious ways, so maybe one day, as their life settles down, they will find themselves seeking more fulfillment and as they take time to reflect they will be in mass and have an awakening, just like I did.

### **What will you miss most about AWHs?**

I will miss the friendships I made with the entire school community. I will miss the faculty and staff – especially my 3rd floor South family. I will even miss my office being right across the hall from the school chapel. Naturally, I will miss everything about being involved with the students – just being part of their lives has been such a gift. The students are so open and joyful – you don't come across too many "angry" kids – even when they're having a hard time or a bad day, you can still see their goodness. Something special I will cherish and miss is the incredible experience it is to say mass for the entire student body.

### **Any favorite memories you wish to share?**

One of my favorite memories is when I instituted a "Chapel Friday" which meant – no class – well, technically there was class, but there was no heavy lifting – it was about checking in with one another and praying together in adoration, plus

some quiet time for personal prayer and reflection. I even offered confession. I found Chapel Fridays to be very healing and almost like a reset for the students. Something that makes me laugh to this day is, despite the world viewing them as young adults, the students still have so much childlike innocence left. One time after I took roll, I said alright, let's head to the Chapel! A few kids got to the Chapel ahead of me and as I walked in, I saw that their curiosity got the best of them and they were experimenting how many of them could fit into one of the confessional booths at once. There must have been ten students crammed in there, it was like a clown car as they emptied out – they just kept coming! It gave me a really good laugh – they were so proud of themselves. It was in that moment that I was reminded how important it is to acknowledge that we are all children of God – even the big kids.

### **What do you think it is about Wood that sets it apart from the rest?**

It's difficult to put it into words, but Archbishop Wood has such an incredible community of students, parents, teachers, staff, volunteers and more – everyone here is intrinsically good. In my experience, Wood is really approachable and welcoming. It's a humble place. You can be here for five years or five

minutes and feel valued and loved. The community rallies together for anyone who needs it as life happens and it is nearly impossible to fall through the cracks. There is something and someone for everyone at Wood – you can't put a price on that.

### **Where is your new assignment?**

I am currently serving as the Parochial Administrator at St Monica's Church in Berwyn, PA. I will most likely become Pastor after the new year.

### **Would you say you have any goals or things you wish to accomplish in this next chapter of your calling?**

I would hope to help St. Monica's parish grow while I am here – not just in numbers, but in real faith. I would love to see a Youth Ministry start back up here. I personally would like to take more chances and try things on the parish level that I have never done. There are always so many great ideas, but never enough time, so I look forward to prioritizing my time and making room for new experiences. I hope that my trying new things will encourage people to get excited about Jesus. I hope I can help them grow in their faith and see how our faith is a joyful one that makes our lives better, instead of it being viewed as an obligation.
