

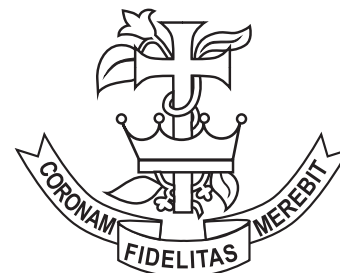

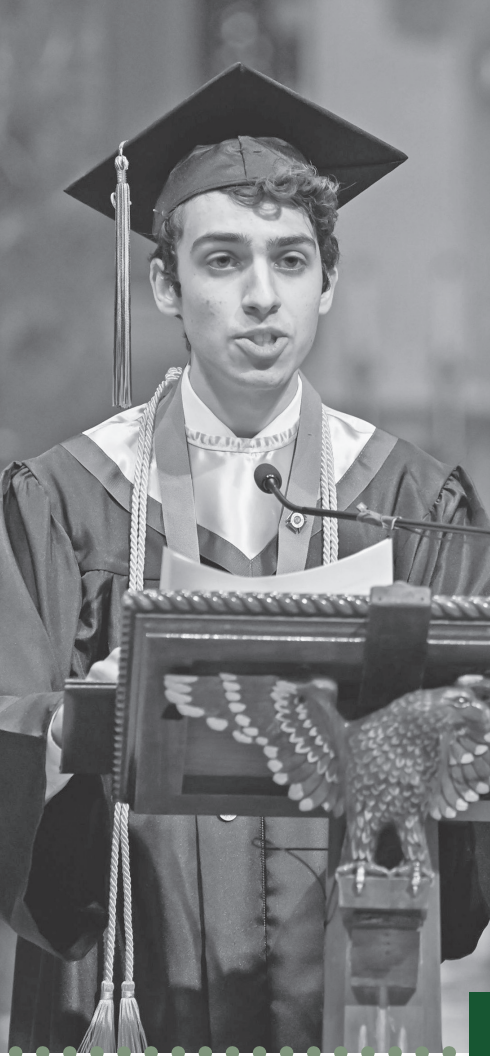

A Legacy Family of Archbishop Wood High School

When Archbishop Wood held its first Grandparents & Godparents Day during Catholic Schools Week 2020, we met Anthony & Linda Conti. They are the parents of Wood grads Lynn Conti DeAngelis '93, Kristin Conti Traczykiewicz '98 & Anthony (AJ) Conti '01 & grandparents of Mikey DeAngelis '21. After speaking with them for a few minutes about their dedication to Catholic education, we wanted to learn more about their experiences!

AC: Linda & I grew up in the city. Linda went to Saint Benedict for grammar school & I went to Immaculate Conception. We both attended Cardinal Dougherty High School, which is where we met. Linda was the Class President & I was the Drum Major for the Marching Band. We like to say, "It all began at Cardinal Dougherty..."

LC: After graduating high school, Tony went to St. Joe's University & I went to Holy Family. We dated for seven years & then got married. There was no question that we wanted our children to go to Catholic school so they could have the same wonderful foundation in their lives that we had in ours.

AC: Due to my job, we moved quite a bit. However, no matter where we lived, our children always attended Catholic school. That was the consistent thread throughout our life.

met her future husband, Jon, at Wood!

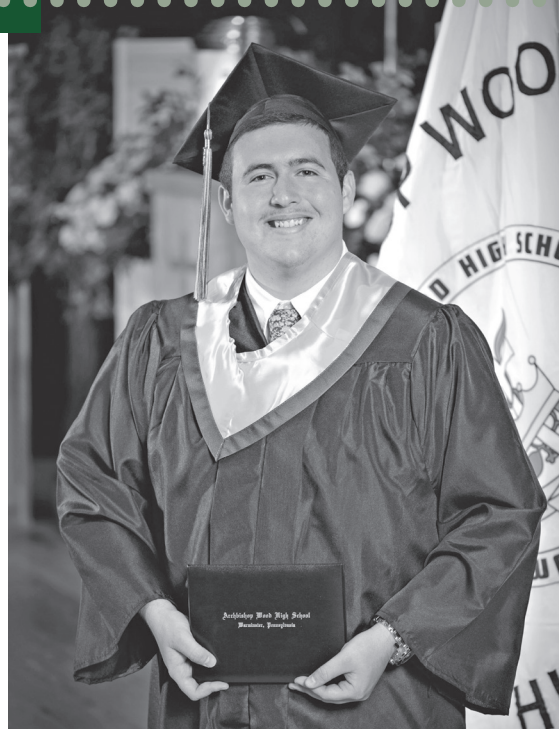

Faith & the Coronavirus 2020



In the Gospel of Matthew chapter 8 (cf. Lk 7:1-10), there is a story of a Centurion who went to Jesus and asked for help because his servant was seriously ill. Jesus told the Centurion that He would come to his house and cure the servant. The Centurion then famously said, **“Lord, I am not worthy to have you enter under my roof; only say the word and my servant will be healed.”** Jesus praised the Centurion for his strong faith. Of course, the servant was healed without Jesus having to walk a single step.

In Matthew chapter 9 (cf. Mk 5:25-34, Lk 8:43-48), there is a story of a woman who had been suffering

for twelve years from hemorrhages. She too went to Jesus and famously said, **“If only I can touch His cloak, I shall be cured.”** Indeed, Jesus cured the woman and then said, **“Take courage daughter, your faith has saved you.”**

In Matthew chapter 15 (cf. Mk 7:24-30) is a story of the Canaanite woman who came to Jesus and begged Him to cure her daughter. Jesus said, **“It is not right to take the food of the children and throw it to the dogs.”** The woman famously said, **“Please, Lord, for even the dogs eat the scraps that fall from the table of their masters.”** With this, Jesus praised the woman’s great faith and assured

her that her daughter was healed!

These are three examples of many stories in the Gospels of desperate people who, acting on faith, went to Jesus for help and He healed them! Many of us may also be feeling a little desperate these days. The pandemic has become a very long and bumpy road. However, we are not traveling alone as Jesus is always our companion. **Jesus does not abandon us during trying times.**

In addition to their unwavering faith, the three people in the Bible stories had another very special gift. **The gift was humility.** Each individual approached Jesus humbly with respect and love. It can be said that their faith made them humble

The Class of 1986 Scholarship

In February of 2019, Sarah Hale, Archbishop Wood's Director of Institutional Advancement, contacted David Dryden, a member of the AWHs Class of 1986, & invited him to get together for coffee to discuss his Wood experience. David invited his fellow classmates, Patti Irwin McDevitt & Terry Clark Funk, to join in the walk down memory lane.

After sharing many funny, touching & inspiring stories, the alumni asked about the current cost of Catholic education. They were surprised to learn that with Wood's tuition at almost \$10,000, 35% of the families are in need of financial assistance. The conversation then pivoted from memories of Archbishop Wood to how the Class of 1986 can help families in-need provide a Catholic education for their children.

So, on that winter day in Starbucks on Street Road in Warminster, The Class of 1986 Scholarship Committee was officially formed. David Dryden best expressed the feelings of his fellow alumni, ***"Our class had a wonderful time at Archbishop Wood & built many friendships that last to this day. We wanted to continue that legacy & help provide those same opportunities for students wishing to attend our great school."***

Thanks to the hard work of David, Terry, Patti as well as Jane Glesmer Tadlock, & the incredible generosity & support from their fellow Vikings, **in just three months, the alumni had raised more than \$14,000!** Starting in the Fall of 2021, Archbishop Wood's Class of 1986 Scholarship will award an incoming student with a \$2,000 tuition grant.

The Class of 1986 was saddened to hear about the passing of Father Whalen on June 2, 2020, after a brave battle with lung cancer. Jim Sweeney suggested that, in Father Whalen's memory, the Class of 1986 should make a gift to their scholarship. The alumni, again, opened their hearts & raised \$1,500 for the Class of 1986 Scholarship. Jim said, ***"We thought Father Whalen would be pleased to know that we were honoring his legacy by helping a family provide a Catholic education for their child."***

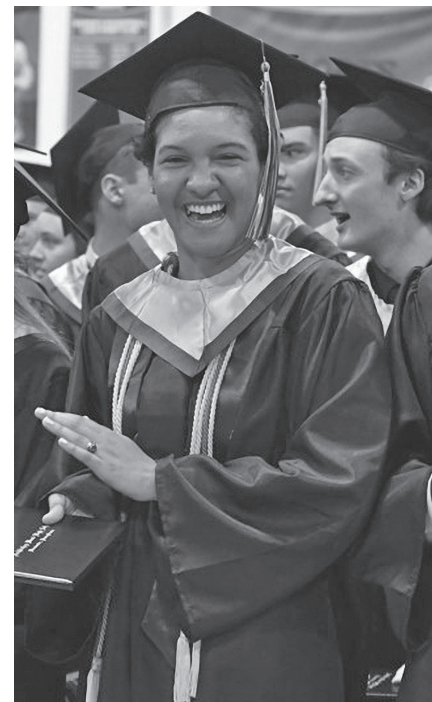

We are pleased to share with you, the champions of Archbishop Wood H.S., some of the good news that occurred during the 2019-2020 school year, thanks to your generosity & support to the Viking Fund:

- **Over \$1,000,000.00 in tuition assistance & scholarships was awarded to incoming & current students**

- 95% of the Class of 2020 have gone on to post-secondary education & have earned more than \$32.6 million in scholarships, 3% have enlisted in the military to serve our country, & 2% have chosen to go directly into the workforce/trades
- Further enhancements such as technology, art, furniture & more was purchased for the Louise Ciabarra College & Career Counseling Center
- Wood has launched a new partnership with Manor College for Dual Enrollment which will permit AWHs Seniors to earn college credits while still in high school
- AWHs is now implementing the One-to-One Learning Initiative; a long term goal, where each student will have his/her own personal device to use in the classroom & at home
- AWHs was able to enhance & outfit our school entry/lobby with a dual seating area for our guests & students
- Our Learning Support Program was majorly enhanced with a new design conducive to students & their academic needs. The entire space was revamped & furnished to become a designated space that serves 100 students per day

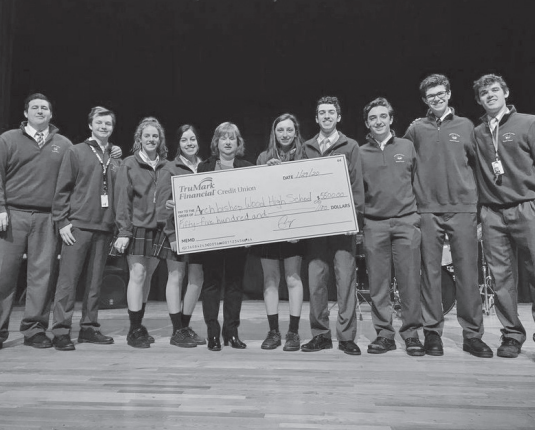
