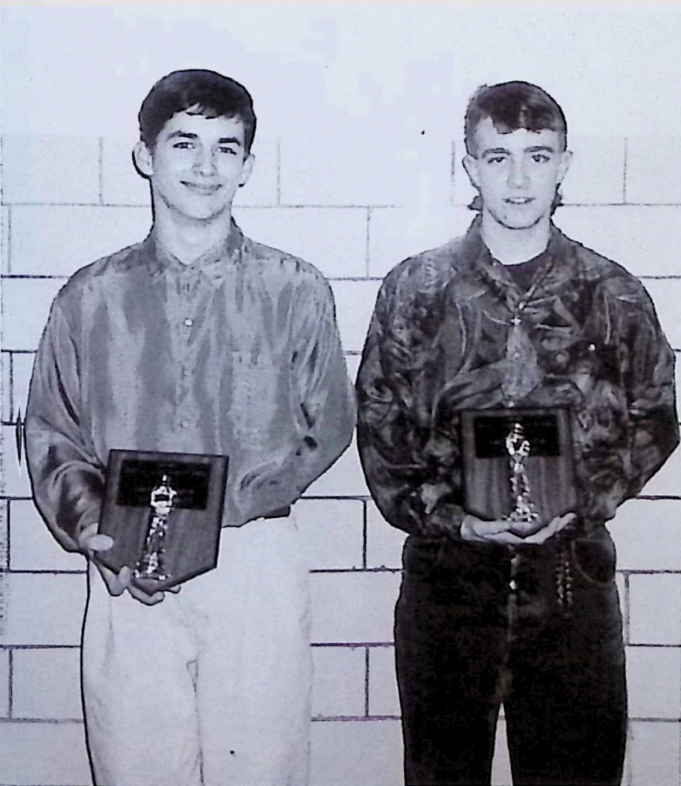

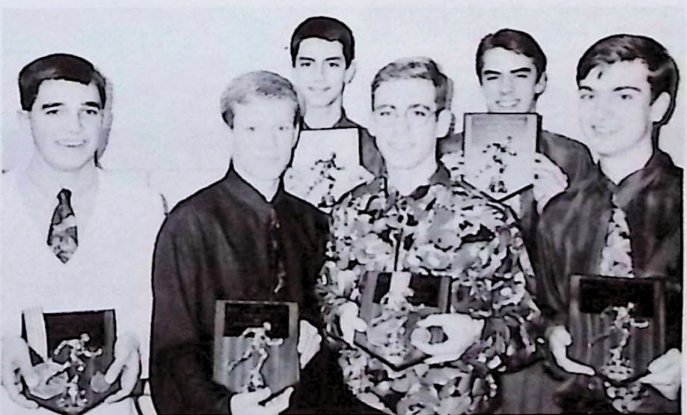

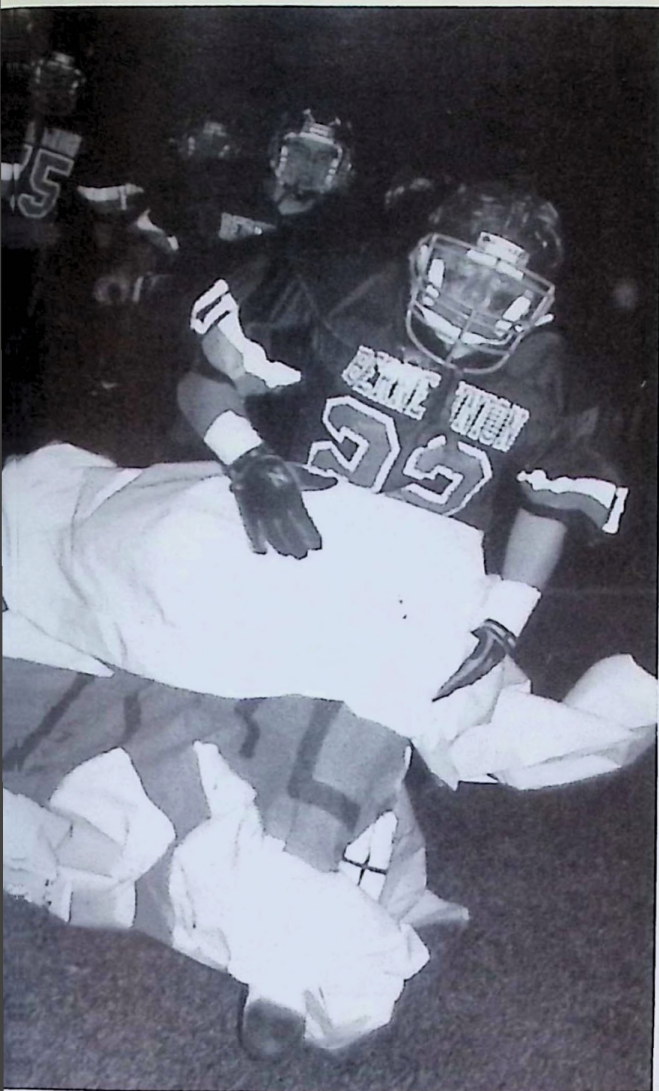

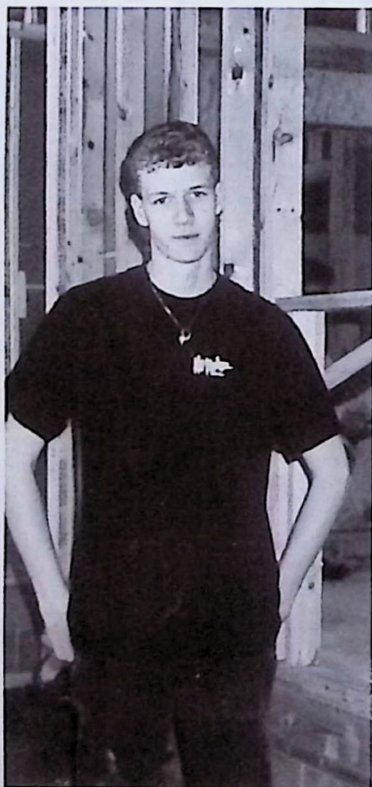

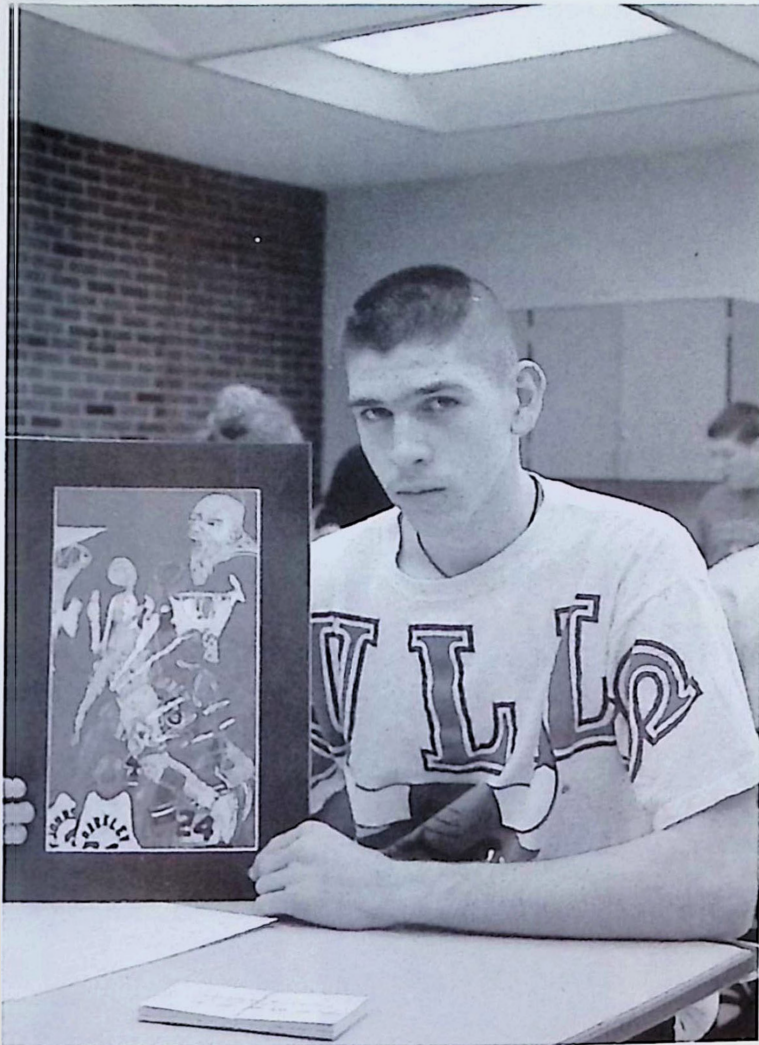

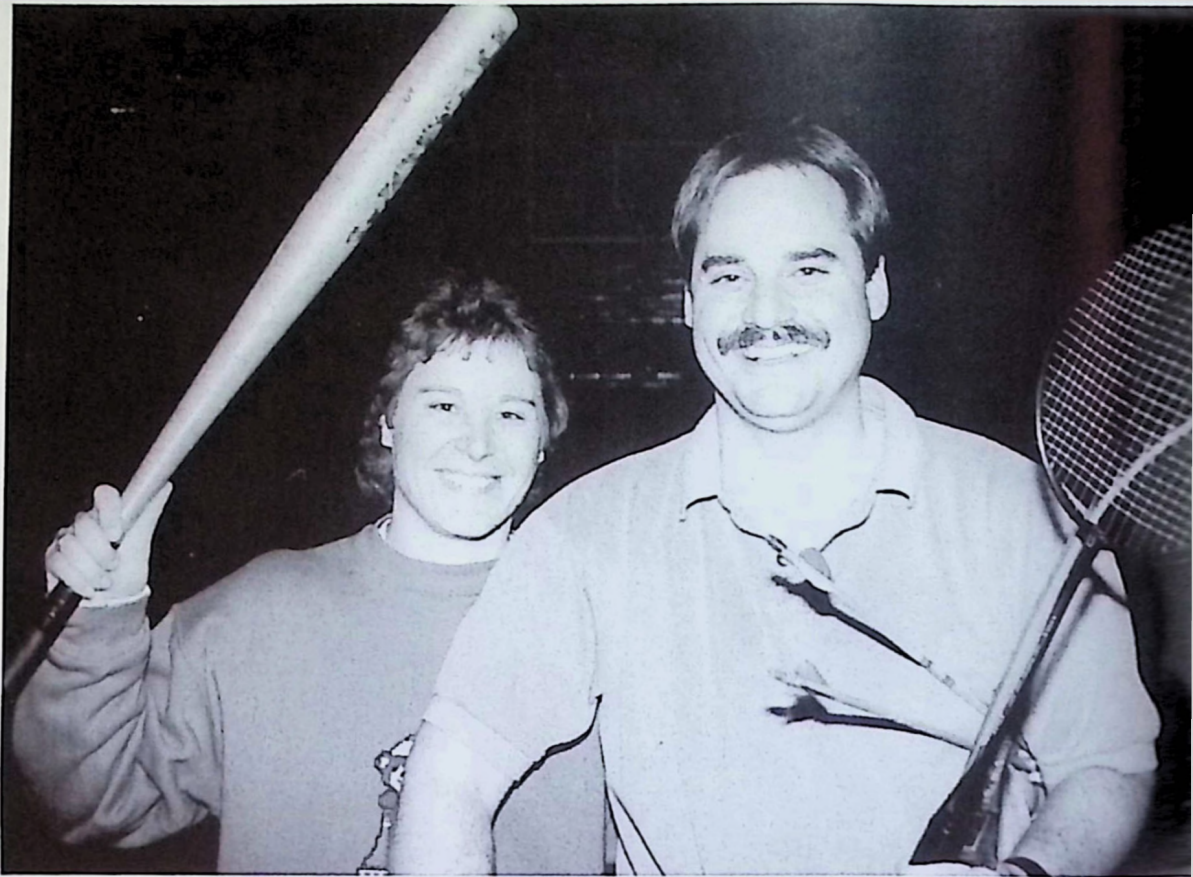

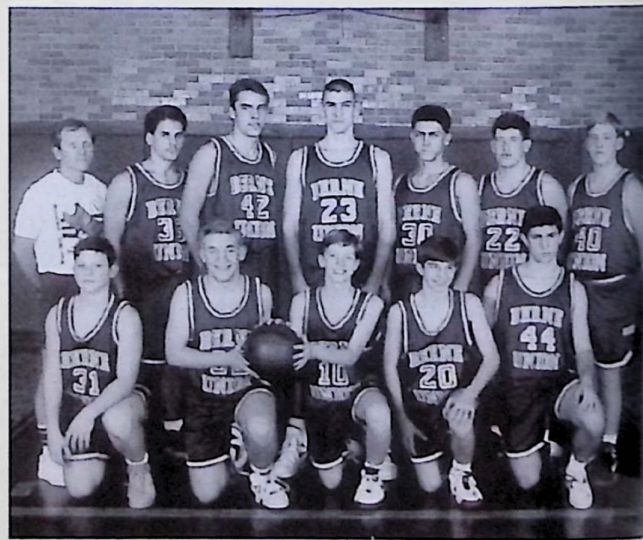

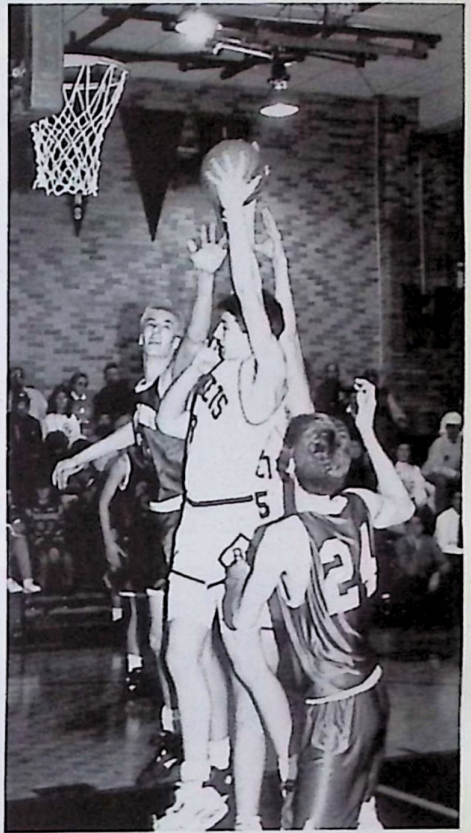

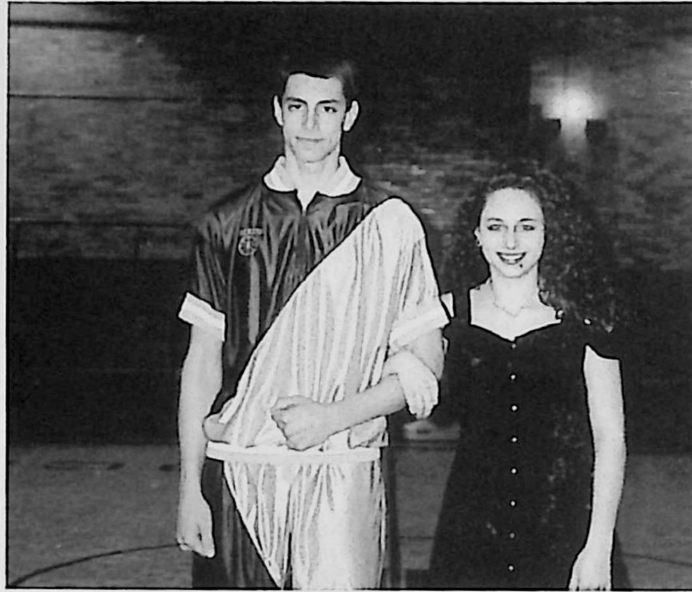

## "One Magical Night"

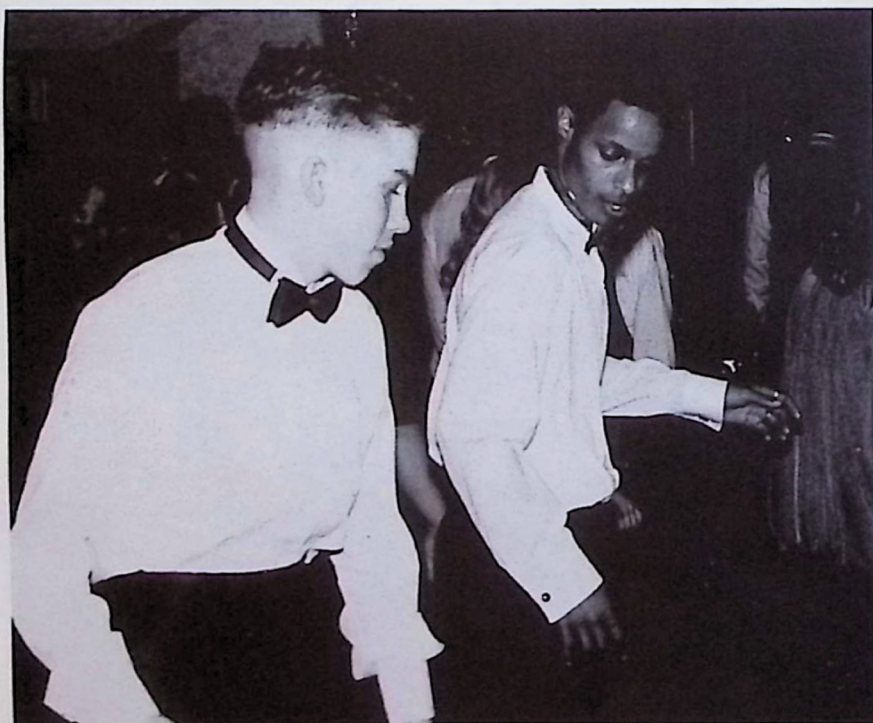

This magical evening took several months of planning. The Junior Class Officers, along with the Student Council, met everyday during lunch in order to decide upon the decorations. Many times there were

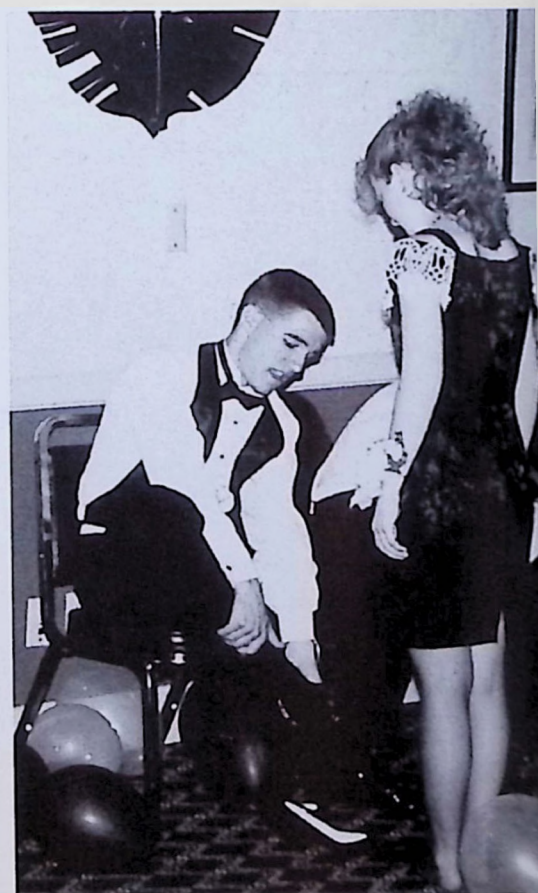
disagreements, but in the end everyone was pleased with the brightly colored palm trees and balloons.
