

**BYLAWS OF THE**  
**RED BANK CATHOLIC ATHLETIC HALL OF FAME**

**A. General Criteria**

1. The Red Bank Catholic Athletic Hall of Fame shall be open to individuals and teams who have made outstanding contributions in one or more of the following areas:
  - ♣ A superior competitor
  - ♣ A teacher/coach with a distinguished record
  - ♣ A person who has made a long-term, exemplary contribution to RBC Athletics
  - ♣ Teams with exceptional achievements

**B. Committee**

1. There shall be three committee members representing Red Bank Catholic (“RBC”): one from the high school Administration, one from the Athletic Department, and one from the Alumni Office.
2. Additional members may be affiliated with the school as teachers, alumni, or supporters of RBC.
3. The Committee will have a Chairperson, a Vice-Chair, a Secretary and a minimum of 11 voting members. Appointed officer positions will be initially determined by committee members from the Athletic Department and the Alumni Office and subsequently, prior to the end of serving terms, by the Chairperson and the committee members from the Athletic Department and the Alumni Office.
4. The committee member from the Alumni Office shall serve as Secretary and keep all records, including minutes of each meeting, which shall be distributed to the full committee. If the committee member from the Alumni Office will not be able to attend a meeting, he or she may have a representative from their office attend a meeting for recording purposes, but will be non-voting.
5. All members will be required to attend meetings either in person or remotely.

6. All members will serve without compensation.

7. Maximum Committee members capped at 15 including the three members affiliated with school.

8. Committee terms shall be four years and members may be re-elected. Should any member resign or otherwise become unable to serve a term, a replacement shall be elected by the committee to serve out the remainder of the term.

9. The committee shall make best efforts to include on the committee members from each of the five ten-year periods counting backwards, starting ten years from the then current date. For example, in 2025 the committee would make best efforts to include members who graduated in each of the following ten-year periods: 2005-2015, 1995-2005, 1985-1995, 1975-1985, 1965-1975.

### **C. Criteria for Nomination (Individual Athletes, Coaches, Teams, and Outstanding RBC Community Members)**

1. Any RBC alumnus or alumna whose class graduated at least 10 years prior to nomination date.
2. Maximum two teams and 10 individuals may be inducted in any Hall of Fame class, plus a possible recipient of the Monsignor Casey Award (see F.1. below).
3. Charter class of 10-15 members inducted in the first year.
4. Nominations must be submitted on behalf of individuals or teams detailing their athletic achievements and the special nature of their contributions.
5. Individual nominees should prove to be positive role models for current RBC students.

### **D. Nomination Process**

1. Nominations must be submitted in writing utilizing the nomination form provided online on the RBC website.
2. Nominations may be made by anyone other than the nominee himself or herself.
3. Every nomination must be seconded by two persons.

4. Nominees not selected shall remain on the list for consideration for a five-year period, after which they must be re-nominated if not selected.
5. All nominees to the RBC Hall of Fame must have conducted themselves in such a manner as to reflect honor upon RBC traditions and must have qualities of character and standards of conduct that are exemplary.
6. While athletic achievement is of prime importance, moral character and good citizenship during educational years and post-graduate years will be taken into consideration.
7. At the committee meeting when inductees are selected from the nominees there must be a super-majority (2/3rds) of the committee members in attendance, either in person or remotely. Nominees elected for induction to the Hall of Fame must be elected by a super-majority (2/3rds) affirmative vote of those in attendance at the meeting.

#### **E. Recognition**

1. Selected inductees shall be notified by Chairperson in writing and will be subsequently contacted by any committee member.
2. New Hall of Fame classes will be announced online after all inductees have been personally notified. Their nominations may subsequently be announced publicly at a cocktail party.
3. Each class of Hall of Fame inductees will be formally inducted at a Hall of Fame dinner or reception, attended by the inductees, family, friends, and Casey supporters.
4. A plaque will be presented to the honorees and an appropriate display or recognition will be established on campus.
5. The committee has the option to induct new Hall of Fame classes annually or bi-annually, as circumstances warrant.

#### **F. The Monsignor Casey Award**

1. As part of each class of Hall of Fame inductees the committee shall have the discretion to award the Monsignor Casey Award to an individual or organization that has demonstrated outstanding dedication to and support for RBC athletics and RBC, in the spirit of Monsignor Joseph T. Casey.
