

# At-a-Glance: Upper School Curriculum

## Lakeview Graduation Requirements

Upper School students must earn a minimum of twenty-two and one-half (22.5) credits and complete 60 hours of community service during grades 9-12 in order to graduate. Course credits must include:

**English – 4 credits**

**Mathematics – 4 credits**

**Science – 4 credits** (must include 1 credit in Biology, 1 credit in Chemistry, and 1 credit in Physics)

**Social Studies – 3 credits** (must include 1 credit in World History, 1 credit in U.S. History, .5 credit in Government, and .5 credit in Economics)

**World Language – 2+ credits** (three sequential World Language courses including a minimum of 2 World Language credits in Upper School)

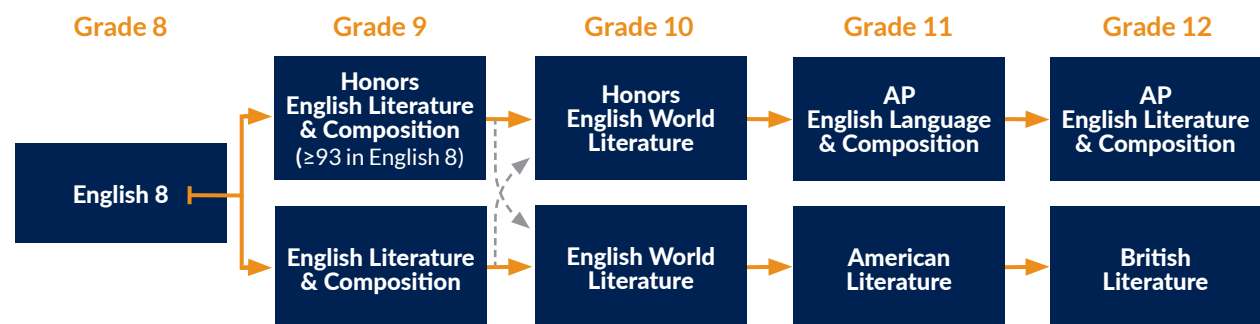
**Technology – 1 credit**

**Fine Arts – 1 credit** (can be in Performing or Visual Arts)

**Physical Education (P.E.) – 1 credit**

This chart shows the course sequencing and progression of English in Upper School. Four credits required to graduate. Check course descriptions for all prerequisites.



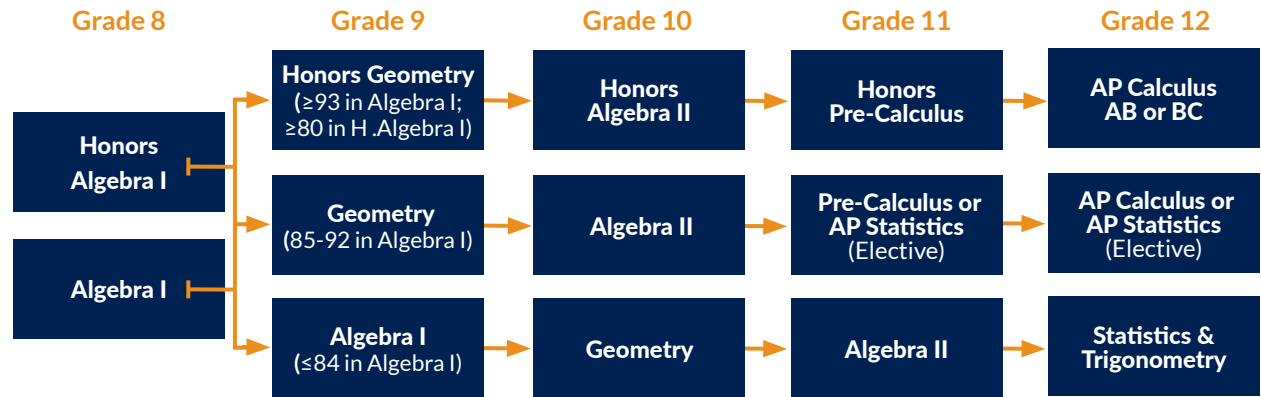

This chart shows the course sequencing and progression of Math in Upper School. Four credits required to graduate. Check course descriptions for all prerequisites.



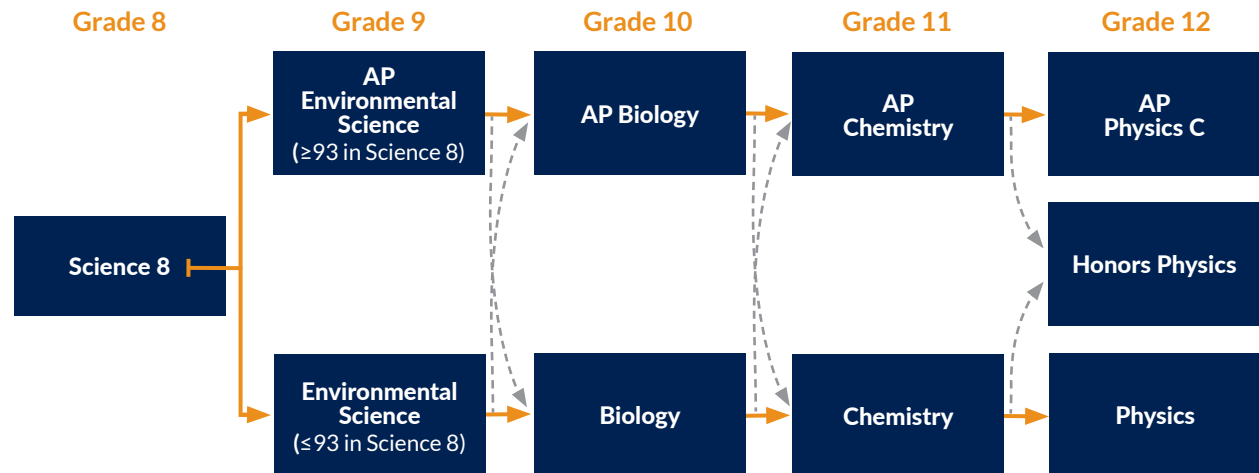

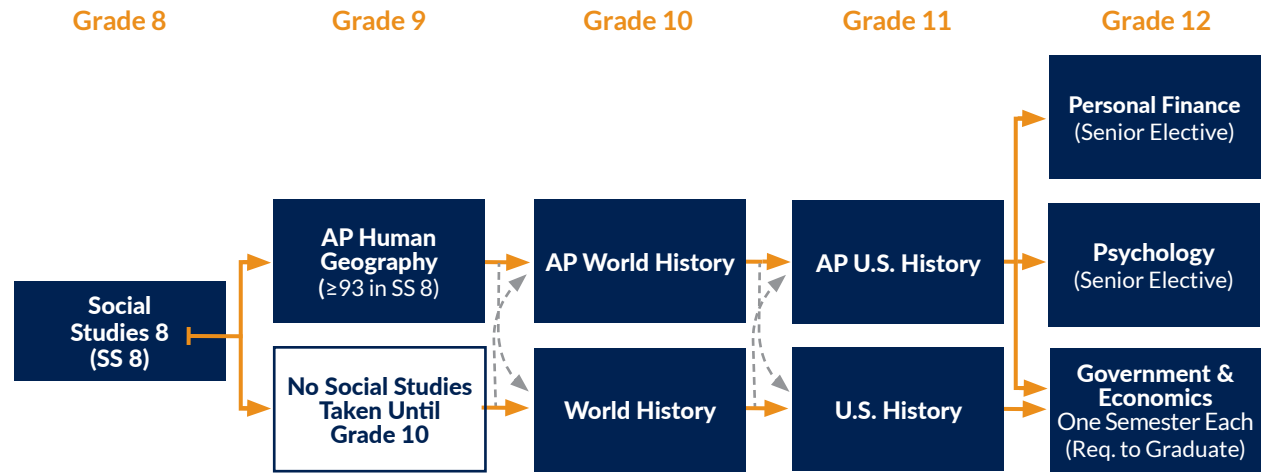

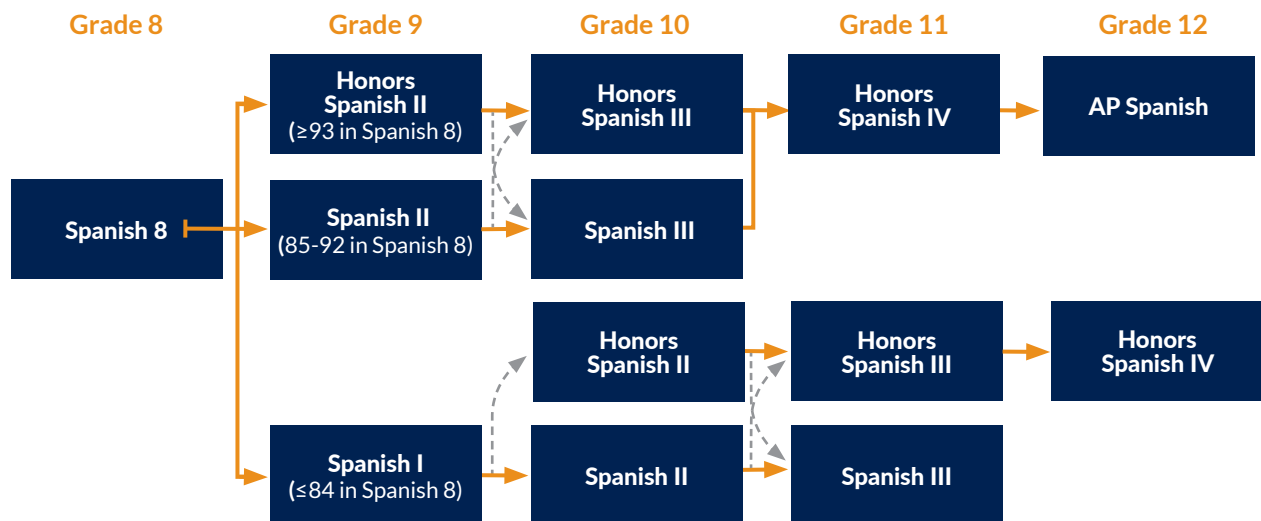

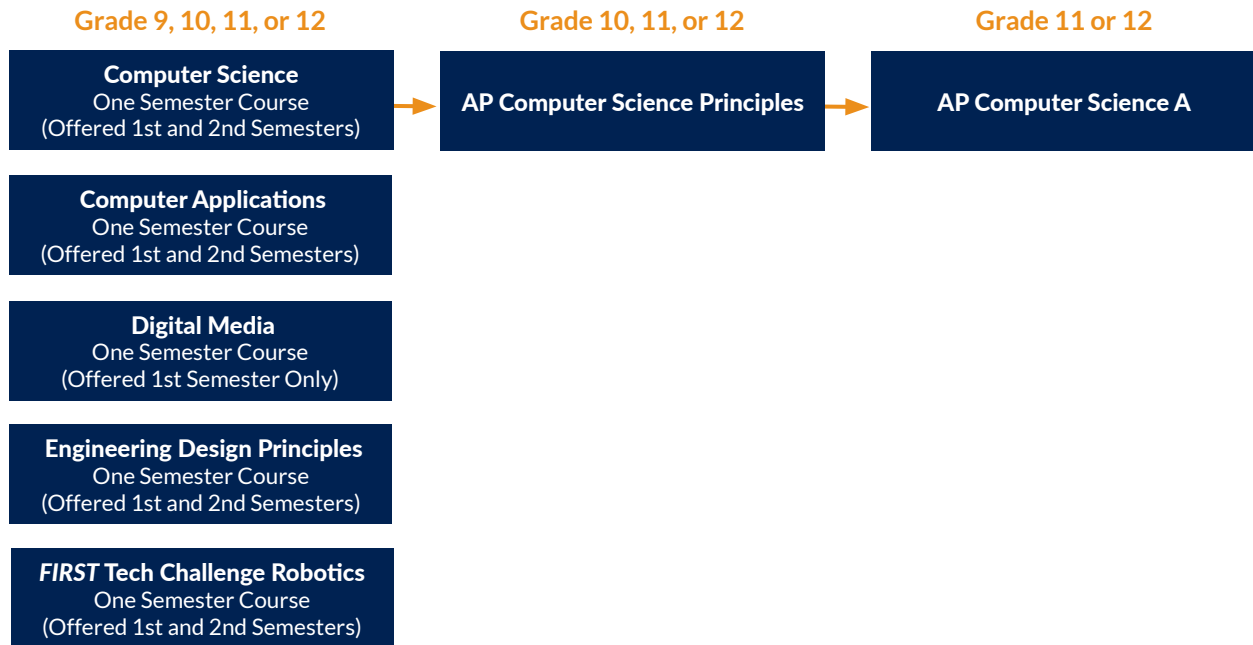

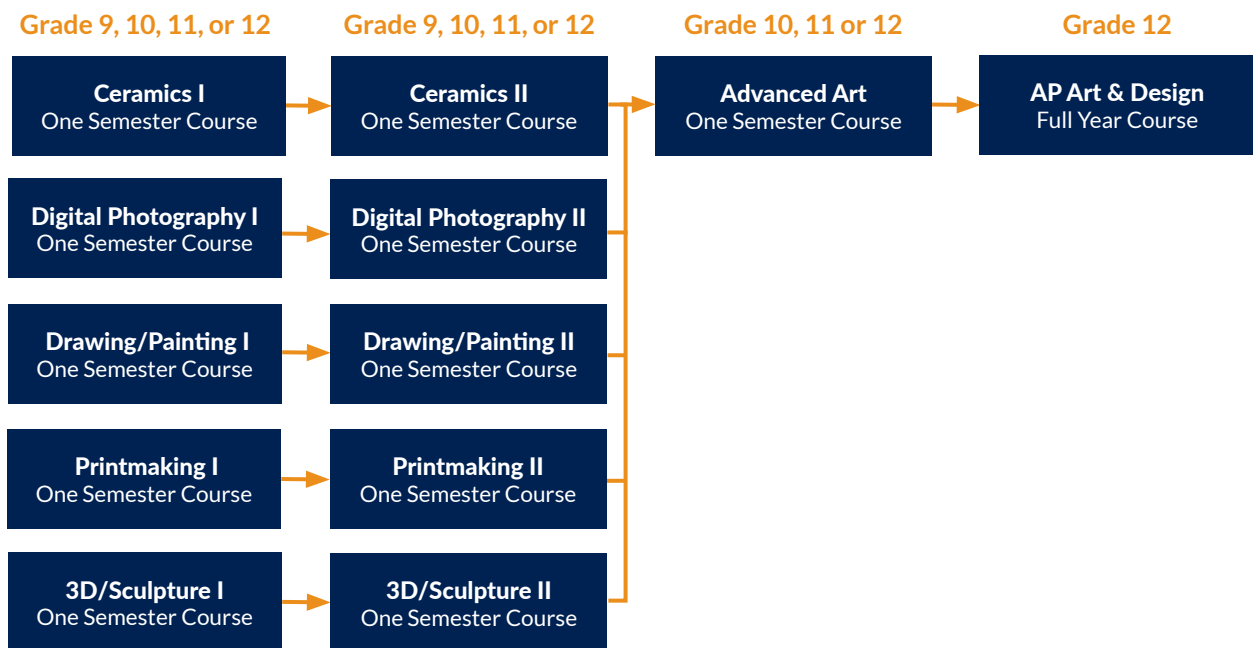
# Technology
