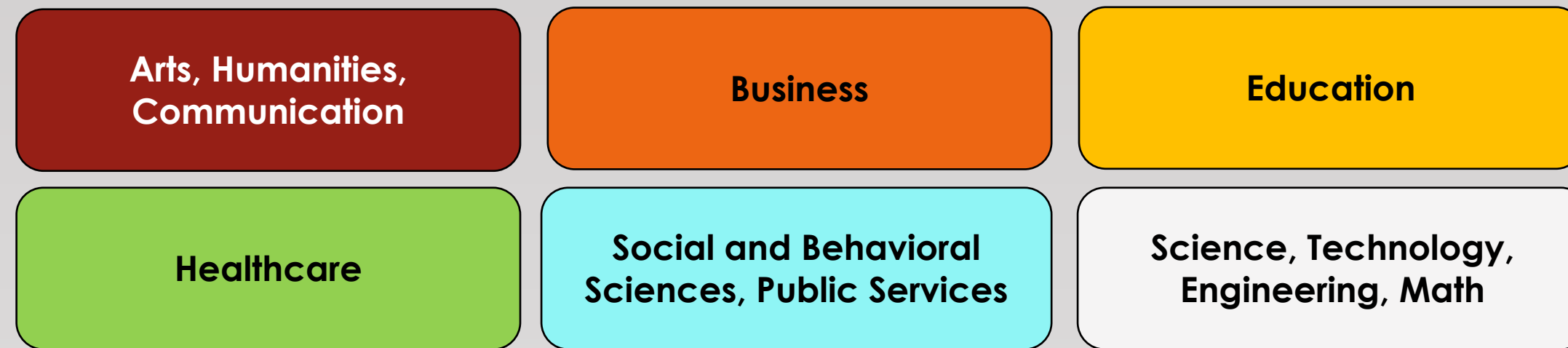
RUNNING START INFO SESSION

RUNNING START BASICS

- Dual credit program for high school juniors and seniors
 - Earn college credit while completing high school graduation requirements
 - Rising juniors (current sophomores) can begin during the summer before junior year
- Available all terms (summer, fall, winter, spring)
- Tuition paid through Running Start
 - Students responsible for fees and books
- May take up to 21 college level credits per term, 10 max for summer
- 15 credits = typical full time class load
- 1 high school credit = 5 college credits
- 100-level courses and above

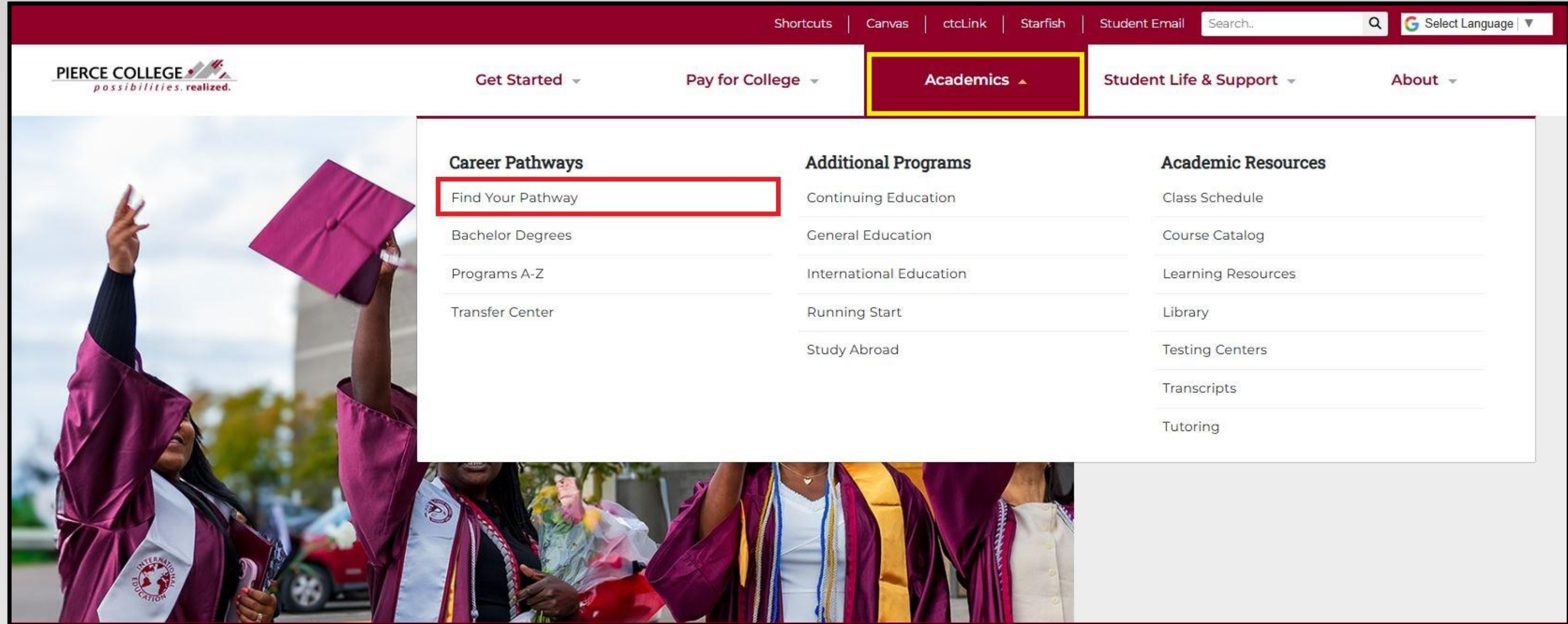

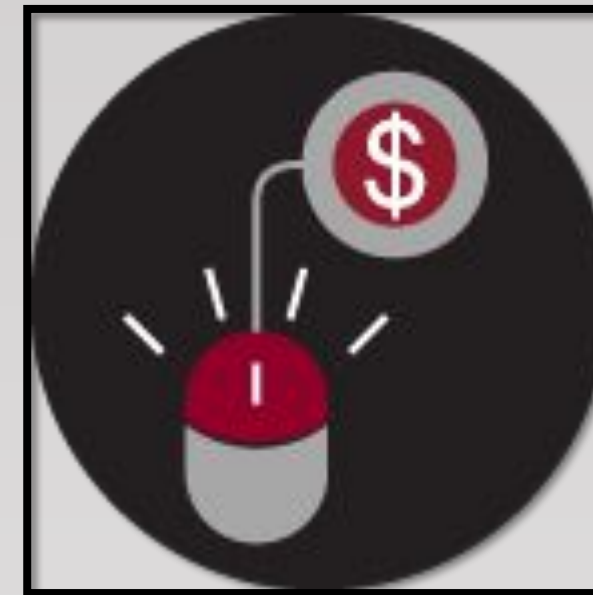

PROGRAM COSTS

Every term, students pay:

- Student fees
 - A full time course load (15 credits) can be around \$250 per term
- Course fees
- Books and required course items
 - Can be \$300 or more
- Supplies
- Transportation



Running Start fee waiver available to eligible students (e.g., free/reduced price lunch) which covers fees and provides access to Running Start book loan program.

BEING A COLLEGE STUDENT MEANS...

- Communication between college, guidance counselors, and family must comply with FERPA
- Classes move at a faster pace. Practice realistic and effective time management!
- Different holiday schedule than high school
- Grades appear on permanent college and high school transcripts
- Attendance/engagement is required to be successful
- Active partnership and communication between student, family, guidance counselor, and college is essential to student success!



BEING A COLLEGE STUDENT MEANS...

- **Be proactive!**
 - ***You*** have to practice effective communication, both in sending and receiving
 - ***You*** must regularly check on messages in your preferred email, ctcLink, and Starfish
- **Be fully engaged!**
 - ***You*** must attend class, both in person and online
 - ***You*** must reach out with questions and needed support



RECOMMENDATIONS FOR PARENTS/GUARDIANS...

- **Be fully engaged with your student's experience!**
 - ***You*** should ask a lot of questions. Remember FERPA?

I understand that:

- The student is responsible for understanding when their choice of college course and credit load will result in tuition charges. If the student enrolls for more high school and college credits than are identified in the Running Start Funding Limit Table, the student is responsible for:
 - paying all college tuition and fees associated with exceeding the college credits identified in the table; or
 - withdrawing from the excess college or high school course(s).

- Unless waived based on family income, the student is required to pay any college/lab fees charged for college classes.

- The signature below acknowledges the need to share FRPL eligibility only with the college to ensure access to tuition/fee waivers. Choosing not to disclose income status [see checkbox in "Student" section] will not affect eligibility for Running Start or free and reduced-price meals. Individuals receiving the information will not share it with any other entity or program.

- Enrollment in specific college classes cannot be guaranteed—even if the classes are needed to fulfill high school graduation requirements.

- To add/withdraw from a course, the student must complete the college Add/Drop process by the college deadline and notify the high school counselor.

- The student is responsible for ensuring that college courses completed as part of the Running Start program will meet high school graduation requirements.

- If the student plans to transfer, it is the student's responsibility to determine college admissions policies/deadlines and whether earned college credits will transfer.

- After completing their college coursework, students are responsible for requesting official college transcripts through the college's registrar's office.

Per the U.S. Department of Education, "If a student is attending a postsecondary institution - at any age - the rights under FERPA have transferred to the student. However, in a situation where a student is enrolled in both a high school and a postsecondary institution, the two schools may exchange information on that student. If the student is under 18, the parent[s] [or guardian(s)] still retain the rights under FERPA of the high school and may inspect and review any records sent by the postsecondary institution to the high school. Additionally, the postsecondary institution may disclose personally identifiable information from the student's education records to the parent[s] [or guardian(s)], without the consent of the eligible student, if the student is a dependent for tax purposes under the IRS rules."

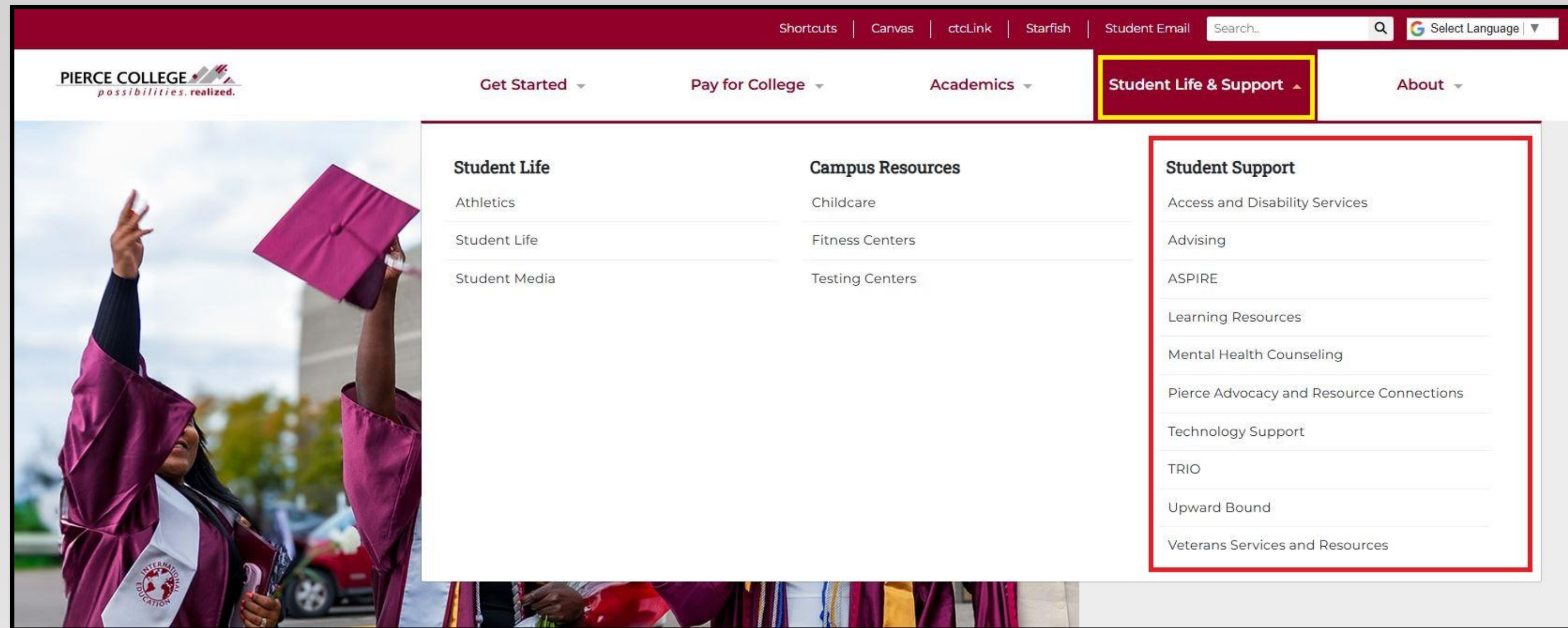
ANNUAL ENROLLMENT & FINAL NOTES

- ❑ Know your resources!

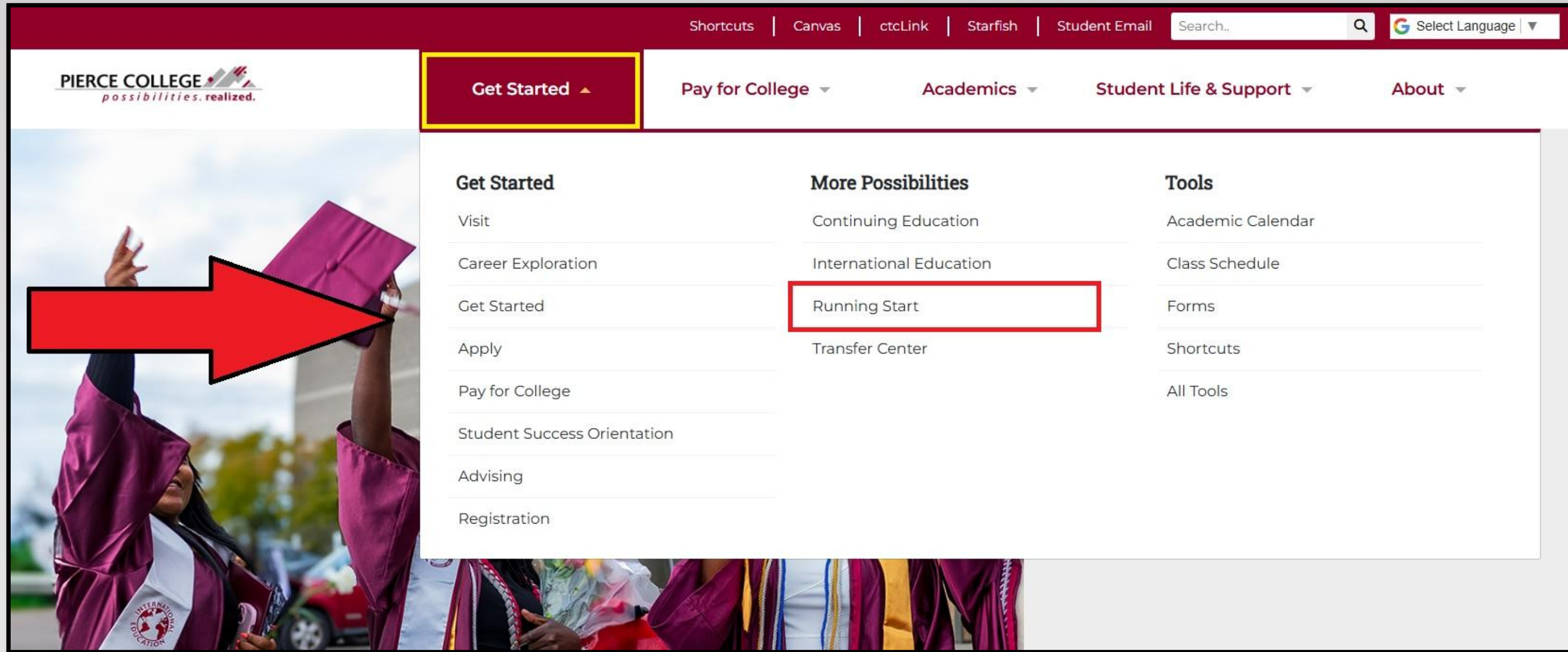

RUNNING START PROS

- EARN COLLEGE CREDIT WITHOUT PAYING TUITION
 - YOU MUST PAY FOR FEES AND BOOKS, AND PROVIDE YOUR OWN TRANSPORTATION
 - FEES CAN RUN ABOVE \$200 PER QUARTER AND BOOKS CAN RANGE FROM \$100-\$300 PER QUARTER
- EARN HIGH SCHOOL CREDIT VIA COLLEGE CLASSES (dual enrollment)
- EXPERIENCE A COLLEGE SETTING WHILE STILL IN HIGH SCHOOL
- MAY TAKE CLASSES NOT OFFERED AT THE HIGH SCHOOL
- DIVERSE CLASS DISCUSSIONS (average student age is 32)
- ONLINE AND HYBRID COURSES - EASY TO ACCOMMODATE WORK SCHEDULE

RUNNING START CONS

- FASTER-PACED INSTRUCTION AND GREATER AMOUNT OF HOMEWORK (10 weeks/quarter instead of 20+ weeks/semester) We strongly recommend taking in-person classes.
- MUST PAY TUITION IF EXCEED STATE ALLOWED CREDITS
- IF A STUDENT FAILS A CLASS, IT'S TRANSCRIBED ONTO **BOTH** THEIR **COLLEGE AND HIGH SCHOOL PERMANENT TRANSCRIPT**
 - THIS CAN LOWER STUDENTS' OVERALL GPA WHICH CAN AFFECT FUTURE COLLEGE SCHOLARSHIP OPPORTUNITIES AND COLLEGE ADMISSIONS
- STUDENTS MAY ALSO HAVE TO PAY TUITION FOR FAILED CLASSES
- CLASS CHOICE CAN BE LIMITED

CONS CONT.

- **BREAKS ARE OFTEN DIFFERENT TIMES**
- **PARENTS AND HIGH SCHOOL OFFICIALS DO NOT** HAVE ACCESS TO STUDENT GRADES OR ATTENDANCE
- HIGH SCHOOLS ARE NOT TYPICALLY NOTIFIED IF A STUDENT IS FAILING CLASSES OR DROPS A COLLEGE CLASS
- THERE MAY BE CONFLICTS BETWEEN HIGH SCHOOL AND COLLEGE SCHEDULING
 - REQUIRED HIGH SCHOOL CLASSES COME FIRST
- COLLEGE IS ON A QUARTER SYSTEM, HIGH SCHOOL IS ON SEMESTERS
- COULD POTENTIALLY LOSE ATHLETIC ELIGIBILITY IF CLASS(ES) ARE FAILED
- ONLINE AND HYBRID CLASSES: NOT AS MUCH SUPPORT FOR STUDENTS WHO FALL BEHIND AS ACCESS TO INSTRUCTOR IS LIMITED

COMMON ISSUES

- STUDENTS MUST BE ENROLLED FULL-TIME BETWEEN BOTH THE HIGH SCHOOL AND THE COLLEGE

WHAT DOES THIS MEAN?

- IF A STUDENT IS ELIGIBLE TO TAKE UP TO 15 CREDITS, BUT ENROLLS AT THE COLLEGE FOR LESS THAN 12 CREDITS, THEY WILL NEED TO ATTEND CLASSES AT THE HIGH SCHOOL TO MEET FULL-TIME ENROLLMENT REQUIREMENTS
 - SEE PAGE 11 OF THE HANDBOOK LOCATED ON THE OHS COUNSELING WEBSITE

COMMON ISSUES CONT.

- STUDENTS MUST SUBMIT AN **ENROLLMENT VERIFICATION FORM** (EVF) TO THE COLLEGE **BEFORE** THE START OF EACH QUARTER- THEY GET THIS FROM MS. FREY VIA EMAIL
 - IF THEY FORGET TO DO THIS, THEY MAY BE DROPPED FROM CLASSES AND/OR BE CHARGED TUITION
- OFTEN STUDENTS DON'T READ THE EVF- THIS IS AN ISSUE BECAUSE THEIR RECOMMENDED OHS-REQUIRED CLASSES ARE NOTED ON THE EVF
- STUDENTS ARE RESPONSIBLE FOR KNOWING DEADLINES FOR COLLEGE REGISTRATION AND CLASS START AND END DATES
- MANY STUDENTS REGISTER LATE AND HAVE DIFFICULTY FINDING OPEN CLASSES THAT COUNT FOR OHS REQUIREMENTS

IMPORTANT-

IF A STUDENT IS NOT REGISTERED FOR COLLEGE CLASSES BY THE START OF THE OHS SCHOOL YEAR, THEY WILL HAVE A FULL SCHEDULE AT OHS AND BE REQUIRED TO ATTEND HIGH SCHOOL

COMMON ISSUES CONT.

SENIORS - CLASS OF 2027

- It is the student's responsibility to stay up to date with Orting High School events, should they wish to participate and stay involved.
- Information on student events, such as senior picture dates, spirit weeks, assemblies, cap & gown pics up dates, etc. will be posted in the Senior Class of 2027 Google Classroom and the Running Start Google Classroom.
- Student's should also be in consistent contact (at least once a quarter) with Ms. Frey on course progress and high school graduation requirements.

COMMON MISCONCEPTIONS

RUNNING START IS FREE

- **FALSE-** TUITION IS COVERED UP TO THE APPROVED ENROLLMENT PERCENTAGE, THERE ARE COSTS ASSOCIATED WITH THE PROGRAM
 - FEES, BOOKS, TRANSPORTATION (AS NOTED BEFORE)

ALL STUDENTS IN RUNNING START EARN AN AA

- **FALSE-** MANY STUDENTS WHO BEGIN RUNNING START, DO NOT EARN AN AA DEGREE

STEPS FOR PIERCE RS ENROLLMENT

1. APPLY ONLINE TO PIERCE COLLEGE **ASAP**- CHOOSE “RUNNING START/PUYALLUP” ON THE APPLICATION
2. AFTER RECEIVING YOUR **PIERCE ID NUMBER VIA EMAIL**, TAKE THEIR **GUIDED SELF-PLACEMENT (GSP)** TO FIND OUT COURSE ELIGIBILITY/LEVEL
 - SEND A SCREENSHOT OF GSP RESULTS TO MS. FREY
