Definition of special educational needs

In this plan, 'special educational needs' refers to a learning difficulty or disability that requires special educational provision.

The SEND Code of Practice 0 to 25 Years (DfE, Jan 2015) says children have a learning difficulty or disability if they:

- have significantly greater difficulty in learning than the majority of children of the same age; or
- have a disability which prevents or hinders them from making use of facilities of a kind generally provided for children of the same age in mainstream schools or post-16 institutions; and
- are under compulsory school age and are likely to

Slough and Eton C of E Business and Enterprise College has adopted this accessibility plan in line with the school's special educational needs policy and equality policy with the aim of ensuring that our school is socially and academically inclusive, that all students have access to a full curriculum, and that all students are appropriately challenged.

Whole school site	Service and review of fire systems and beacons for students with impaired hearing. Ensure step markings around the site are clear to those with visual impairment.	Weekly testing of fire alarms, half yearly servicing of systems Half termly checks and regular site monitoring
All staff	Provide the relevant training to facilitate the experience and learning of disabled students	Ongoing
Entry/Exit from the school	Ensure adequate designated disabled places are available for parking: Provide evacuation chairs/arrangements and training for all relevant staff on their use.	There are 3 disabled spaces available adjacent to Reception Lifts are available for all 1 st Floor elevations and Refuge Areas are available for all Buildings in case of emergency evacuation being required when lifts are not in use. Evacuation chairs are not used. Staff receive Annual Fire/Evacuation Training.
