DATES

The Summer Enrichment Program begins Tuesday, June 16 and concludes on Friday, July 17. Courses meet five days per week (with the exception of Friday, June 19 & Friday, July 3) for 150 minutes per class session.

CLASS SCHEDULE



First Bell: 7:30 a.m.

Period 1: 7:35 – 10:05

(1st period students will take a 15 minute restroom/snack break from 8:45-9:00 directly supervised by their teacher)

Break: 10:05 – 10:25

(Students taking only a 1st period class will be dismissed to the covered lunch area to be picked up from school. Students remaining on campus for a 2nd period class should sit at the covered lunch area until Period 2.)

Period 2: 10:30 – 1:00 p.m.

(2nd period students will take a 15 minute restroom/snack break from 11:40-11:55 directly supervised by their teacher)

IMPORTANT: All Summer Enrichment Program students are expected to be picked up from the covered lunch area within 15 minutes of dismissal. Please be advised there is no extended supervision of students during the summer session beyond 1:15 p.m.

ATTENDANCE

While students are expected to attend every class session, there is no rigid attendance policy for the Summer Enrichment Program as students will not be earning academic credits for coursework. However, if a student is not present, the teacher will notify the Attendance Office who will in turn contact the parent to verify the student's absence. Please be sure that you provide the school with accurate contact information at the time of registration.

DRESS CODE

Similar to what is permitted for current Bishop Amat students, the dress code for Summer Enrichment Program students will be casual, warm weather type attire with the emphasis on comfortable dress appropriate for a Catholic school environment. Students are expected to comply with the established dress code for the duration of the session as follows:

Shirts: Casual collared shirts and t-shirts with sleeves are acceptable. The following are NOT PERMITTED: plain white shirts, shirts that promote gangs, drugs or alcohol or other inappropriate material, crop tops, bare/exposed midriffs, tank tops, spaghetti straps, sleeveless shirts, team jerseys, tube tops or swim suits. Undergarments must never be visible or show through any shirt worn.

Pants: Pants are acceptable as long as they are Dockers or similar style pants, as permitted during the school year. Jeans in good condition may also be worn. All pants must be void of rips or tears and must fit at the waist. The following are NOT PERMITTED: cargo pants, jeggings/stretch pants, leggings, capris, sweats, pajama bottoms, or any type of warm ups.

Dresses/Skirts: Dresses and skirts are NOT PERMITTED during the summer session.

Shorts: Dockers brand or similar style casual shorts may be worn. The following are NOT PERMITTED: athletic shorts, jean/denim shorts (jorts) or cargo shorts

Shoes: ONLY tennis shoes or dress shoes are allowed to be worn. The following are NOT PERMITTED: flip-flops, sandals, slippers, foam runners, Crocs, Uggs, slides, high heels, open toe shoes or any type of slip-on shoe.

Hats: Hats/caps/beanies of any type/style are NOT PERMITTED.

Parents of students who come to school out of dress code will be notified immediately as students in noncompliance will NOT be permitted to attend classes.

FOOD

Hot food, snacks and drinks will be available for purchase from the Lancer Café and vending machines each day. Students will have the opportunity to purchase food during the mid-class snack/restroom breaks (1st period at 8:45 and 2nd period at 11:40). Food or drink is not allowed in the hallways or classrooms, with the exception of bottled water.

SCHEDULES and BOOKS

Your student's schedule will be mailed the first week of June. The schedule includes the course location(s) and the teacher's name for each course. Enrichment students are not required to purchase any textbooks. While all text materials are included in the tuition cost of each enrichment course, students are required to bring a pen, pencil, notebook paper or additional materials according to the course information sheets that will be provided by the teacher on the first day of classes.

ACADEMIC PROGRESS

At the end of each week, parents will be emailed an academic progress report completed by their teacher(s) for the summer session. Please note that the frequency of these reports may vary at the teacher's discretion, particularly for the weeks of June 19th and July 3rd. At the conclusion of the course, enrichment students will receive a final course evaluation (not for academic credit) and a certificate of completion to verify their participation in the Bishop Amat Summer Enrichment Program.
