PHS EXPANSION PROJECT GETS UNDERWAY

The Parkland School District officially kicked off construction on a transformative expansion and renovation of Parkland High School with a ceremonial groundbreaking on Friday, March 6, 2026, celebrating the district's continued investment in innovative, future-ready learning environments.

This multi-phase project will significantly expand and modernize the existing high school campus to better serve students, educators, and the broader community. The project comprises an 84,914-square-foot addition and 74,561 square feet of renovated space, increasing the school's total size from approximately 495,000 square feet to 578,696 square feet. Work is expected to be completed by December 2027.

Designed to support evolving educational needs and hands-on learning opportunities, the expansion and renovation will include:

- 30 new classrooms
- 16 new science, art, engineering, robotics, and food laboratories
- Two enclosed outdoor courtyards
- A renovated media center
- Improved building flow and circulation
- Expanded administrative offices
- An enhanced cafeteria space
- A new athletics entrance/lobby that will separate the space from the cafeteria

Speakers at the Groundbreaking included Parkland alumni who are key people working on the project including Michael Butz, General Manager, Alvin H. Butz, Inc. (Parkland Class of '07), Jamie Bortz, Senior Project Manager, Alloy5 Architecture (Parkland Class of '07) and Victor Padilla, CFO, Eshbach Masonry (Parkland Class of '15), whose company laid the brick and poured the terrazzo floors in the existing building, which opened in 1999.

The project is part of the district's long-term facilities planning efforts, aimed at accommodating enrollment growth and enhancing educational programming. For more information, visit www.parklandsd.org/vision2030.

SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

Dear Parkland Community,

As the weather finally warms up, we are excited to welcome spring and the many vibrant events that mark the conclusion of the school year. Our high school stage is currently being prepared for the upcoming production of *"How to Succeed in Business Without Really Trying,"* and our spring sports teams are finally heading outdoors. We are also looking forward to the senior class Prom at SteelStacks on May 2nd, followed by the fantastic all-night Post Prom Party at Parkland High School—an event made possible by a dedicated group of volunteers and sponsors, including the PA National Guard and the Parkland Education Foundation.

In addition to these seasonal highlights, construction is well underway at Parkland High School. This expansion project is a critical step in easing current overcrowding and preparing for future enrollment growth.

As we move into budget season, we continue to navigate a challenging fiscal landscape for public schools. While the School Board has passed a resolution committing to a tax increase of no more than 3.5% (the State's Act 1 Index threshold for Parkland), we remain concerned about rising costs in health insurance, special education, and cyber charter tuition. In response to these fiscal pressures, we are closely examining all expenditures with the School Board for the 2026-27 Budget. Our primary goal remains to protect our students' educational experiences while ensuring responsible fiscal management of our community's resources.

We understand there may be questions about proceeding with the PHS expansion during such an uncertain economic time. This project has been in the planning stages for three years and is essential to manage both current crowding and projected enrollment growth based on local new home construction timelines. It is important to note that the construction is funded through carefully planned, long-term debt service, which is distinct from the general fund budget used for daily school operations. We are focused on reducing expenses within that operating budget wherever possible without disrupting vital student programs.

Another key initiative is our focus on student and staff screen time. With national discussions and potential state legislation regarding "bell-to-bell" cell phone bans, we are proactively researching this issue. Following our parent workshops in January and March, we are now collecting feedback through student, staff, and parent surveys to find a healthy, community-supported balance for technology use.

Finally, I am thrilled to share the nomination form for the Superintendent's Parkland Pride Award. I invite you to nominate any staff member who has gone above and beyond for your family this year. I am incredibly proud that Parkland has been recognized with the *Morning Call* Top Workplace Award for the ninth time this spring—a testament to the dedication of our entire team.

I hope to see you at one of our many spring arts, athletic, or academic events. I also invite you to join me for an informal "Coffee with the Superintendent" event at the Hometown Diner in Breinigsville on Friday, May 8, at 11:30 AM.

PHS STUDENT Kate Gilchrist has been selected as a featured fashion artist in this year's Access/VSA Emerging Young Artists Program.

This national career development program shines a spotlight on the work of young artists with disabilities (ages 16–25) across the United States. As one of only fifteen artists selected, Kate will receive a \$3,000 financial stipend, participate in professional development activities at the Kennedy Center, and have her submitted work featured in a national exhibition that tours the country.



PHS TEACHER Christine Lerew, Veterans Memorial Music Teacher, was named the recipient of the Pennsylvania Music Educators Association (PMEA) District 10 Citation of Excellence. This distinguished honor is awarded annually to one exceptional educator in recognition of outstanding excellence, dedication, and impact in music education. Christine's commitment to her students and the advancement of music in our schools exemplifies the highest professional standards. She will be formally recognized at the 2026 PMEA State Conference Awards Breakfast. We proudly celebrate this well-deserved achievement and her remarkable contributions.



PHS SOPHOMORE Darío Artau Cruz was one of only 116 young people selected nationwide to attend the Tourette Association of America's (TAA) Ambassador training in Washington, D.C.

During his time in Washington, Darío met with key legislators, including Congressman Ryan Mackenzie and Legislative Assistants for Senators John Fetterman and David McCormick, State Representative Scott Perry, and Legislative Correspondent to State Representative Summer Lee. He successfully advocated for greater support for people living with Tourette Syndrome and other Tic Disorders.

PHS INDOOR TRACK season was historic, with the team breaking an impressive 10 school records. This feat is particularly remarkable given that only the top 20 individuals in an event across the entire state qualify for the State meet.

SMALL STEPS, BIG IMPACT: PARKLAND'S DISTRICT-WIDE FOOD RESCUE

In addition to Parkland's Annual District-wide Food Drive in February—where more than 22,000 items were donated to the three secondary school food pantries to support families in need and help provide holiday meal boxes over Spring Break—we are excited to highlight another meaningful initiative happening in our cafeterias: food share tables.

What began as a visionary pilot program at the high school, led by dedicated PHS teachers Laura Kowalski and Vince Fugazzotto, has grown into a district-wide movement. Today, all 12 Parkland schools are proudly participating in this food rescue effort in partnership with iHave iNeed.

How "Share Tables" Work

Every day, our students are becoming "hunger heroes." Unopened and unused breakfast and lunch items are placed on Share Tables for classmates to take what they need. At the end of the week, the remaining items are consolidated for a special delivery to local nonprofits.

This program's success is fueled by the dedication of our staff, including Food Service Staff & Cafeteria Aides who manage daily collections and encourage students to donate. Our Facilities & Operations drivers help coordinate the weekly logistics to bring everything to our central District hub.

This partnership ensures that nutritious food feeds families instead of filling landfills. Beyond the numbers, our students are learning firsthand about empathy, sustainability, and caring for their neighbors—a lesson that will last a lifetime.

As of February 20, 2026, 9,300+ pounds have been donated by Parkland schools this year.
