

Information for Seniors – Class of 2026 - Final Academic Days

With the exception of AP students, the final day of regular classes for students who have completed all the conditions for graduation is Thursday, April 30th.

Though most of our students will have successfully completed all the necessary conditions to receive a diploma at graduation, some students may have not completed all the conditions for graduation. Students who have not completed all the necessary conditions to receive a diploma at graduation will be required to be present at school over the course of May 4-8 and May 11-15 or until all conditions for graduation have been successfully completed.

Important : Who will be required to be present in the week(s) prior to graduation week?

- Students with work that needs to be successfully completed (NTC) by April 30th. This includes all projects, papers, labs, presentations, reflections and assessments. Students should check their portals to confirm their status with respect to work that needs to be completed (NTC)
- Students with a failing (F) grade for the year or a failing (F) grade for a semester 1 or Semester 2 semester course
- Students with an Incomplete (I) for Term 3 or Term 4
- Students with outstanding detentions

Prior to April 30, students who are required to be present in the week(s) prior to graduation week will be provided with additional information regarding the work they are required to make up or the detentions they need to serve.

Students Taking AP Exams

- Students must attend their regularly scheduled AP class up to the day before they take the AP exam. Once the student has taken the AP exam for a particular class, they no longer must attend the class.
- On the day(s) AP students need to be in the building, they are to enter through the Main Lobby and report directly to their AP class. They may come into school earlier than the class meeting but should go to the Library to study or to an administrator/ teacher approved location. If you have a question as to where you can go, ask an administrator.
- If a student has only one AP class on a particular day, they may leave the building after the class. Students participating in extracurriculars and athletics may return to the building at dismissal.
- If a student has several AP classes in a day, they may leave the building between the classes or go to the Library for a study or to an administrator/ teacher approved location.
- Options for AP students on the day of an AP exam
 - Students taking an Advanced Placement exam in the morning session will be free to leave school at the conclusion of the exam (approximately 12:00 pm.).
 - Students taking an afternoon exam (11:30 p.m. – 3:30 p.m.) will be exempt from attending AP morning classes. Students taking a morning exam (7:30 am – 12:00pm) may choose to attend afternoon AP classes but they are not required to do so.
