McKinney-Vento Consortium Grant

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the McKinney-Vento Consortium Grant:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the acceptance of the McKinney-Vento Grant award in the annual amount of \$264,622.50 for 2025-26 on behalf of the Families in Transition Department.

RELATED INFORMATION: The McKinney-Vento Consortium is comprised of formalized partnerships among the following Local Education Agencies (LEAs): Fort Wayne Community Schools (FWCS), East Allen County Schools, MSD Southwest Allen County Schools, and MSD Steuben County Schools. Fort Wayne Community Schools serves as the Lead LEA for the consortium.

Federal funding is critical to sustaining the Families in Transition department and supporting all students eligible under the McKinney-Vento Act across Allen and Steuben Counties. During the 2024–25 school year, 1,481 students within FWCS qualified for homeless services. Across the consortium, approximately 2,000 students have been identified as eligible.

Funds are distributed as grants by the Indiana Department of Education to the Lead LEA and are utilized to establish and maintain educational programs that support student success. These funds provide tutoring and supplemental instruction, support partial staff salaries, and ensure access to hygiene items and school supplies not otherwise covered by federal, state, or local funding sources. Funding also supports professional development and training opportunities for staff members within each partner LEA. Christian Perez Mora, Families in Transition Manager, and Shenita Bolton, Chief of Family and Community Engagement and Schools of Success, were available to respond to questions.

A motion was made by Anne Duff, seconded by Jennifer Matthias, that the recommendation concerning the McKinney-Vento Consortium Grant be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Cable Fund Access Board (CFAB) Originator Grant for 2025-26

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Cable Fund Access Board (CFAB) Originator Grant for 2025-26:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the Cable Fund Access Board Originator Grant from the City of Fort Wayne. Fort Wayne receives a 5% Franchise Fee from Comcast and Frontier, of that amount 20% is sent to LTV. For the calendar year 2025 this amounted to \$142,882.43.

RELATED INFORMATION: The City of Fort Wayne provides grants for the operation of the cable access stations, which include centers at the Allen County Public Library, Purdue Fort Wayne, Government Access and LTV at Anthis Career Center. Grants are given with the stipulation that all access centers will provide training, equipment and facilities to non-profits wishing to produce programming that will air on one of the access channels. The monetary amount granted is based upon a percentage of active subscribers to Comcast and Frontier Communications.

LTV is operated by Fort Wayne Community Schools serving as the K-12 educational access channel for the entire city. The primary purpose of the cable fund is to enhance public, educational and government access television within the City of Fort Wayne through the effective use of cable television franchise fee receipts. Elizabeth Lord Cary, LTV Coordinator, was available to answer questions.

A motion was made by Julie Hollingsworth, seconded by Antonette Payne, that the recommendation concerning the Cable Fund Access Board (CFAB) Originator Grant for 2025-26 be approved. Roll Call: Ayes, unanimous; nays, none.

Cable Fund Access Board (CFAB) Non-Originator Grants for 2025-26

Dr. Daniel presented the following recommendation concerning the Cable Fund Access Board (CFAB) Non-Originator Grants for 2025-26:

RECOMMENDATION: It was recommended that the Board approve the Cable Fund Access Board Non-Originator Grants from the City of Fort Wayne for a total of \$56,273.04.

RELATED INFORMATION: The City of Fort Wayne provides grants for non-profit organizations within the city through CFAB. Grants are given to non-profits with the understanding the organizations will provide programming to one of Fort Wayne's cable access stations, including LTV. Grants cover some equipment costs for schools. Elizabeth Lord Cary, LTV Coordinator, was available to answer questions. In 2025 FWCS was notified of the award with the grant being received in February of 2026. Awarded amounts are as follows:

RELATED INFORMATION: One of the tasks for each Board member is to recommend an appointment to the FWCS Scholarship Committee. The FWCS Scholarship Committee was established by the Fort Wayne Community Schools Board of Trustees on September 24, 1984. Each spring since 1987, scholarships have been awarded to FWCS students. Gifts range from \$500 to \$1,500.

There are seven members of the scholarship committee and one honorary member, Judy Percy. Each is appointed by a Board member and has a term which coincides with the term of that Board member. Members of the Scholarship Committee, assisted by FWCS staff, administer the awarding of these scholarships by reviewing applications, interviewing candidates, and making the final recommendations.

Arlington STEM
Elementary

An update on the Arlington STEM Elementary School was shared, highlighting curriculum enhancements, enrollment trends, and early impact on students and families following the school's STEM focus. Dr. Derek Leininger, Principal, and Dr. Caroline Rosado, Assistant Principal, were available to answer questions.

Comments

Board Member Steve Corona is surprised and concerned regarding a recent charter school application. What are they going to do for out of classroom experiences, can they match what we do? We are doing several really good things. He will be attending and commenting at their upcoming hearing.

Board Member Maria Norman attended last week's 3DE Arby's Case Challenge and heard really great ideas from the students who participated. Her son was also a qualifier. From speaking to students, some may feel that the work they do or the ideas that they have don't matter, but they do. Member Norman gave kudos to the launch teachers and those involved. The students designed printed material, apps and so much more, goes to show the amount of support and encouragement makes all of this come full circle. These students are making an impact. Ms. Norman also did a shout out to South Side's boys basketball team for being the SAC Champions, for the first time since 1997. She wishes good luck to all teams for the remaining week of regular play and then sectionals start.

Board Member Julie Hollingsworth also attended the 3DE Challenge and said that even though students were nervous and there were some technical difficulties, they handled it all with ease and learned valuable skills. Their presentation skills were impressive, especially for freshman students. Member Hollingsworth is also going to next week's charter school hearing. It is hard to believe that they'll be able to match what FWCS is doing, especially after hearing more about FWCS student's guaranteed experiences during the Work Session held earlier this evening.

Board Member Antonette Payne commented that we started tonight's meeting celebrating Public Schools Week and there are so many amazing things happening at our schools with the help of

community partners. If another Charter is in the area, this will cause more strain on resources. Hooray to our public schools.

Board Member Jennifer Matthias was also very impressed with 9th grader 3DE presentations. Her own son, who is a current senior, did not have the opportunity to have a 3DE experience and this past weekend, he had to present in front of an audience, and he didn't have that leg up that our 3DE students have. Member Matthias has shared her passion: issues with funding, vouchers and charters. When these things happen in our community, public schools suffer. When resources are diminished and knocked down, we will stand strong to the opposition. We want to provide students with a high-quality education.

Board Member Anne Duff also attended the 3DE event and she was impressed with the three judges, as they only gave the students positive feedback. Students were encouraged due to their response, and it showed on their faces.

Superintendent Dr. Mark Daniel commented that FWCS is the first Ford NGL District in the country to have scheduled PreK-12 purposeful and executed guaranteed experiences. How do we get better, better, better? Resources are becoming scarce, why saturate a market and how will this be sustained? Many other organizations have tried, and students have come back to us further behind than those that stayed. We are challenged every single year. Legislators are wrapping up the session. We are going to be left behind, we must be aggressive in the three Rs – Recruit, Retain and Reputation. How do we create more neighborhood schools? Fifty years ago, there was a reason not to have neighborhood schools, today they want neighborhood schools. During Rotary earlier today, they heard that people are proud of the communities where they live. They want grocery stores, laundromats and good schools. We must be better than other organizations.

Board President Noah Smith is doubling down on his support for the incredible work happening across FWCS. The 3DE and JA teams, along with our teachers, are doing phenomenal work. This year, ten teams competed, two from each school, and five are advancing to Nationals. One of the judges was a senior Arby's executive who oversees operations across three states. What an extraordinary opportunity for our students to present their ideas and gain feedback from a leader at that level. With nearly 100 adults and 50–60 students in attendance, our students truly knocked it out of the park. Opportunities like this require resources, which require funding. President Smith referenced *The Right Stuff* book. Money isn't the ultimate driver of success, but it does provide the tools and support necessary to help our students thrive. We are not perfect, but we are committed to being our best. This Board and Cabinet include many proud FWCS graduates who care deeply about this community. It is disheartening to see our district continually chipped away. An Evansville-based higher education institution is sponsoring this proposed charter. Have they spent time here? This charter is not locally governed, and the decision-makers are not elected by our community. Please attend March 5 at 6:00 p.m. for the public hearing to support FWCS. With unavoidable financial pressures, we must cut \$10 million this year and more in the future. We need your support.




