## 793 Plan Progress Monitoring

<p><b>Support districts in understanding and implementing computer science and digital fluency standards</b></p>	<p>Partnerships with University at Buffalo and Computer Science for New York have supported the development of a regional consortium focused on CSDF, engaging 50 participants from across the region. Each BOCES supports implementation at the school level through targeted professional development, workshops, and ongoing collaboration.</p>
<p><b>Availability of programs to support online learning</b></p>	<p>The WNY Distance Learning Consortium meets bi-monthly with representation from local BOCES. This year's work has focused on compiling and organizing the courses available through distance learning. At the state level, quarterly meetings are held to examine how distance learning can better align with and support the Portrait of a Graduate initiative. Active discussions and models are being shared</p>

	<p>On-line academy participation across the region approximately 40 course offerings with over 3000 registrations</p>
<p><b>Prepare students for college and/or careers</b></p>	<p>Several regional conversations have focused on the Portrait of a Graduate (PoG) and NY Inspires initiatives, including the sharing of rollout models across districts. A key emphasis has been on PBLA and providing professional development that supports skill development for students to better prepare them for college and career pathways.</p> <p>Additionally, each local BOCES offers career pathways through its Career and Technical Education (CTE) programming.</p>
<p><b>Access and engagement for all students</b></p>	<p>WNYRIC services provide hotspots and internet access to areas with limited connectivity.</p> <p>These efforts are also addressed within district technology plans, with a focus on increasing student engagement and ensuring 24/7 access to school curricula. Ongoing upgrades to hardware and software, along with Model Schools support from local BOCES and WNYRIC, further strengthen access and instructional integration.</p>
<p><b>Implement tech integration strategies that align with NYS learning standards</b></p>	<p>JMT professional development staff are designing and implementing professional learning that is purposeful and aligned with content standards. Educators receive training on instructional strategies and technology tools to enhance student engagement and learning. This year, a regional focus has been placed on the ethical use of AI, ensuring its integration supports responsible and effective teaching practices.</p>
