3.08 **WHEREAS**, the voters of Readington passed the Referendum on November 4, 2025 in the amount of \$38,247,117.00; and

WHEREAS, the district included toilet rooms renovations and upgrades in the list of qualifying projects in the Referendum; and

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Readington Township Board of Education approves Magic Touch Construction Company, Inc. to renovate and update toilet rooms at its Three Bridges School in the amount of \$369,313.07 through state contract #MOESC Coop #289 - 24-58 Plumbing Services; and

FURTHER, the Readington Township Board of Education authorizes the Business Administrator to submit any qualifying costs to the State of New Jersey for 40% reimbursement by the State of New Jersey. (Attachment 3.08)

3.09 **WHEREAS**, on January 20, 2026 the Board of Education passed the Final Eligible Costs outlined in the attachment relating to the 2 new bathrooms at Three Bridges School funded by the Preschool ROD grant.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, the Readington Township Board of Education approves Magic Trust Construction Company, Inc. to construct 2 new bathrooms at its Three Bridges School in the amount of \$285,868.87 through state contract #MOESC Coop #289 - 24-58 Plumbing Services. (Attachment 3.09)

BE IT RESOLVED that the tentative budget be approved for the 2026-2027 school year and that the Business Administrator/Board Secretary be authorized to submit the following tentative budget to the Executive County Superintendent of Schools in accordance with N.J.S.A.18A:7F-5 and 18A:7F-6 for approval in accordance with the statutory deadline of March 27, 2026 as follows:

3.12 **Advertise Tentative Budget for Public Hearing**

BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education authorize the advertisement of the tentative budget on the district website in accordance with the form as provided by the State Department of Education and according to law and establish that the public hearing be held in the Holland Brook School, 52 Readington Road, Whitehouse, NJ on April 28, 2026 at 7:00 p.m. for the purpose of conducting a public hearing on the budget for the 2026-2027 school year.

3.13 Motion to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Readington Township Board of Education (the "Board") has established a capital reserve account pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:21-2 and N.J.S.A.18A:7G-31 in accordance with Generally Accepted Accounting Principles, which is subject to an annual audit; and

WHEREAS, the Board may use the capital reserve account to implement a capital project or referendum in the Readington Township School District's ("District") Long Range Facility Plan ("LRFP") as required pursuant to N.J.S.A. 18A:7G-4(a) and N.J.A.C. 6A:26-2; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-14.1, the Board may, by resolution, transfer funds from the capital reserve account to the line items in the capital outlay major account/fund to fund the total costs, less any excess costs, of a school facilities project; and

WHEREAS, the district plans to add 2 bathrooms to existing classrooms at Three Bridges School in conformity with a state-approved Preschool Regular Operating District (ROD) grant approved through resolution 3.05 at its board meeting in January 20, 2026 in the amount of \$208,363.20 for the state share, \$312,544.80 for local district share, totalling \$520,908.00, and;

WHEREAS, the district approved architectural fees in the amount of \$58,000.00 for the project through resolution 3.04 at its board meeting in January 20, 2026, leaving a remaining local share balance of \$254,545.00 to be appropriated for construction services for the project; and

WHEREAS, the Board directs the Business Administrator and architect of record to submit all projects listed above to the State of New Jersey for amendment and inclusion in the District's LRFP; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board authorizes in the 2026-2027 budget a capital reserve withdrawal in the amount of \$254,545.00 to fund the total costs in the Capital Projects Fund, less any excess costs, of the Projects will be returned to the capital reserve account for any unspent costs upon completion of the project.

3.14 Motion to approve the following resolution:

WHEREAS, the Readington Township Board of Education qualified for health benefit adjustments, enrollment adjustments, or utilized less than 2% of allowable tax levy in prior budget cycles; and

WHEREAS, the Readington Township Board of Education currently has an accumulated balance of \$3,820.00 from the 2023-2024 school year, and \$197,749.00 in banked cap from the 2025-2026 school year;

WHEREAS, the Readington Township Board of Education has qualified for a health benefit adjustment of \$1,435,070.00 and an enrollment adjustment of \$247,940.00, totaling \$1,683,010.00 in the 2026-2027 school year; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the Board of Education includes in the tentative budget \$678,886.00 of the qualifying adjustments to exceed the 2% tax levy for the 2026-2027 school year budget, leaving \$1,004,124.00 unutilized to remain in banked cap for future budget cycles. In accordance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23A-10.3(b), the district has fully exhausted all eligible statutory spending authority by utilizing the adjustment in health care costs. Being fiscally conservative and due to the district not raising taxes to the maximum allowable limit for the 2026-2027 school year, \$1,201,873.00 shall remain unutilized in banked cap for future budget cycles, with \$3,820.00 from 2023-2024 school year expiring in conformity with state law. The district acknowledges banked cap cannot be deferred or incrementally completed over a longer period of time than law allows, and shall utilize the adjustment for health care costs in the 2026-2027 school year by June 30, 2027.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the use of the health benefit adjustment in the budget is intended to be used to pay for the significant increased costs of health benefit premiums.
