Presentations:

- **Recommended 2026-27 Comprehensive Pre-K - 12 School Operating Budget:** Mr. Lilleck presented the recommended Budget to the Board. Mr. Lilleck stated that the budget reflects a commitment to strategic resource allocation, examining every investment through a critical lens to ensure maximum impact for students, while fiscal responsibility remains paramount. The budget supports the following:
 - Equitable elementary class sizes across all buildings
 - Classroom equity—same opportunities for all students
 - Maintaining class size guidelines
 - Equity in supplies and equipment across buildings
 - Full integration of Pre-K in home buildings

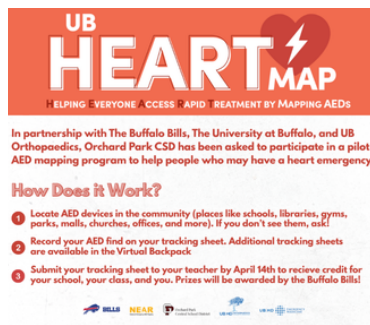
- **Presentation - Erie 2 BOCES Capital Project:** Mr. Lilleck shared the information on the proposed Erie 2 BOCES Capital Project. As a component district of Erie 2 BOCES, BOCES is an extension of our classrooms and Orchard Park students go to E2CCB programs every day for Career & Technical Education, Special Education, P-TECH, and Alternative Education. The project is prioritizing only the highest-risk items like roofs, mechanical systems, and safety. The estimated yearly cost in Orchard Park future budgets, after state aid is approximately \$200,000. Reports:

- **Student Ex-Officio Report:** Ms. Sydney Dobmeier, student ex officio member, reported on STAP-Comm. She shared that STAP-Comm is working on projects, including a blanket-making event where all proceeds benefit Haven House. On March 15, students attended the WNY Leadership conference and participated in workshops to work on leadership skills. Staff appreciation will be held on May 26 to thank teachers and staff at the high school. She also recently organized the first northeast student meeting for the National School Board Member Association.

Action:

- Approved all Consensus Items.
- Accepted donations from, Quaker Athletic Booster club if a Lat Pulldown machine from Pacillo's for the Middle School Fitness Center (\$1,399 value), miscellaneous training equipment for the baseball program (\$902.22 value) and an XC training system for JV and Varsity XC teams (\$495 value).
- Declared freshman boys basketball and girls modified volleyball uniforms as surplus. The uniforms will be replaced in accordance with the athletic uniform replacement schedule.
- Approved the Corrective Action Plans - Internal Auditors' Testing Results - June 30, 2024 and for June 30, 2025
- Approved the recommended 26-27 Budget and placed it as Proposition I on the May 19, 2026 Ballot for vote.
