FARGO PUBLIC SCHOOLS ANNOUNCES ADMINISTRATION ASSIGNMENTS

Fargo Public Schools announces two administrative assignments within the District.



Lindsay Seelig has been named Fargo Public Schools assistant director of teaching and learning. She will assume the position for the 2026-27 school year.

Seelig has been the FPS coordinator of PreK-12 Literacy since January of 2021. She began her career in education as an educator at Crossroads Learning Center from 2002-06. She was an English language arts teacher at South High School Campus II and Davies High School from 2006-2020. She served as an advisor to Key Club, student council, and Philanthropy & Youth.

Seelig holds a Bachelor of Science in Secondary English Education from Minnesota State University Moorhead; a Master of Education in Teacher Leadership from North Dakota State University; and a North Dakota secondary principal credential. She is currently completing her doctorate at NDSU.

For the 2026-27 school year, the Standards Based Instruction Department will be renamed the Teaching and Learning Department. The assistant director of the Teaching and Learning Department position is part of a reorganization of the department and job duties. The assistant director will focus on the District's receipt and use of federal funding, including Title I, Title II, Title III, and Title IV, ensuring all guidelines and regulations are followed. With the complexity involved in title funding, the assistant director will engage in continuous program evaluation to ensure the funding is utilized in a manner that achieves positive student outcomes. The position will also provide leadership for the coordination of instructional coaches and curriculum alignment in the District.



Brad Johnson has been named Fargo Public Schools coordinator of transportation. He will assume the position for the 2026-27 school year from Chris Pinkney, who is retiring.

Johnson has served as a marketing teacher at North High School since 2023 and as a bus driver for Valley Bus since 2022. He is a Red Cross first aid instructor and created and implemented in-house first aid and CPR classes at Valley Bus, certifying more than 200 employees since 2023. He began his career in education as a paraprofessional at Ben Franklin Elementary School in Grand Forks, where he worked from 2016-17. He was a grades 7-12 business teacher at North Border Public School in Walhalla, N.D. from 2017-22, and was a freshmen academic interventionist for FPS from

2022-23. He has also served as an assistant girls swimming coach, an assistant girls track and field coach, and an assistant DECA advisor.

Johnson holds a Bachelor of Arts in Business Administration from the University of North Dakota; a Bachelor of Arts in Business Education from Valley City State University; and a Master of Science in Educational Leadership from Minnesota State University Moorhead.

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
