2025-2026 LEAP TESTING DATES: April 29th - May 6th

All 3rd, 4th, and 5th graders must attend school on scheduled testing dates. Testing will be scheduled to start by 9:15 AM each morning after breakfast. Please be mindful of late check-ins, and early check-outs, as this will lead to a student having to make up missed sessions. Test sessions last between 45 and 90 minutes. **Testing days count as instructional days. Regular classroom instruction will continue following testing each day.**

- R** Read the question carefully, then reread the passage or the problem.
- E** Examine every answer choice before you choose your answer.
- L** Label your answer (Math)
Look for proof in the passage and underline it (ELA)
- A** Always check your work!
- X** X-out answers that you know are wrong

As LEAP testing approaches, we want all students to feel confident, calm, and ready to do their best! Families play an important role in helping children feel prepared and supported during this time. Below are a few simple ways you can help at home:

Build a Simple Study Routine

Set aside a quiet, consistent time each day for review. Even 15–30 minutes of reading, practicing math facts, or reviewing classwork can make a big difference!

Encourage Confidence

Remind your child that they are prepared and capable. Encourage them to take their time, read each question carefully, and try their best. Effort matters more than perfection!

Prioritize Rest & Nutrition

A good night's sleep and a healthy breakfast help students stay focused and energized during testing.

Talk It Out

It's normal for students to feel a little nervous. Give your child space to share their feelings and remind them that one test does not define them.

Keep It Positive

Celebrate your child's hard work! Small words of encouragement or notes in their lunchbox can go a long way in boosting their confidence.

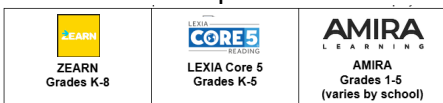
Grades K-5:

As such, all students exiting grades kindergarten through 5th are encouraged to access Lexia and Zearn throughout the summer to reinforce and strengthen their skills. Students in grades 3-5 are also encouraged to utilize Amira to strengthen literacy development. All of these programs can be accessed from any computer.

- Students in grades K-2 who were placed or retained will be provided additional resources that can be completed at home to support their academic growth.
- Third grade students at risk of being retained under ACT 422 will be invited to participate in additional summer support as they work through Lexia and/or Amira at home. Third grade students at risk of being retained under ACT 422 will be able to check out a school Chromebook if they do not have access to a home computer.

3rd Grade

We are excited to learn about Geometry, Measurement, and Data in Math. We will find ways to tell time and solve time word problems. Additionally, we will sort and describe attributes of two-dimensional figures. We will determine the perimeter of two-dimensional figures. We will solve real-world problems involving perimeter and unknown measurements. Lastly, we will collect, display, and analyze data on scaled picture graphs and related bar graphs.

We are also preparing for the 3rd grade LEAP daily by reviewing skills and strategies taught this school year. This preparation includes us learning different types of question stems such as multiple choice, multi-select, technology enhanced, evidence based selected response, and prose constructed response which will be seen on this end of the year assessment.



4TH GRADE

This month in ELA our 4th graders are beginning our next unit, The American Revolution! This unit is a non-fiction based unit that will require them to use skills related to informational texts.

In social studies, we are moving closer to home as we discuss the development of Indigenous cultures in Louisiana. Our final unit after this will be discovering the Mayan culture.

Continue to encourage your child to read on Amira nightly to help with their fluency and even comprehension skills.



5TH GRADE

Our 5th graders have been hard at work exploring big ideas across all subjects! In ELA, students are diving into the topic of immigration. By reading and analyzing a variety of texts, they are forming their own opinions about whether the American Dream was worth the sacrifices many immigrants made. This has sparked thoughtful discussions and powerful perspective writing as students step into the shoes of those arriving in a new land.

In Social Studies, we are wrapping up our unit on the Renaissance and Reformation. Students recently explored the Scientific Revolution and learned how new discoveries changed the way people understood the world. They studied influential figures such as Michelangelo, Leonardo da Vinci, Copernicus, Galileo, and Newton, gaining an appreciation for their lasting impact on art, science, and history.

In Math, we are reviewing quadrilaterals and strengthening our understanding of their properties. Next, we will begin learning about volume, where students will explore how to measure space inside three-dimensional figures.

Those results will place the student in the healthy fitness zone or let the student know that he or she has a need for improvement.
