A. Rules for Use of Optical Scan Voting Machines

NOTICE IS HEREBY GIVEN that at a meeting of the Board of Education of the Sweet Home Central School District the following rules were adopted:

Rules for use of Optical Scan Voting Machines and the Submission of Questions or Propositions to be Placed Thereon:

1. The form of ballot and the voting procedure shall conform substantially with the operational requirements of the optical scan voting machines to be used by the District, and with any requirements prescribed by the Election Law of the State of New York for use of optical scan voting machines applicable to school districts.
2. The optical scan voting machines shall be those supplied by the Erie County Board of Elections, but if voting machines are not available from that source, voting machines may be obtained from some other source satisfactory to the Board of Education.
3. For each optical scan voting machine used, two (2) qualified voters of the District shall be appointed by the Board of Education to act as Election Inspectors.
4. The Board of Education shall pay all expenses necessary or incidental to the use or rental, as the case may be, of optical scan voting machines, including but not limited to the operation, calibration, maintenance and securing thereof and the training of the Election Inspectors in the use thereof.
5. Immediately before any optical scan voting machine is used at meetings, elections or votes, annual, special or however otherwise denominated or designated, the Election Inspectors shall examine and calibrate it and see that the machine is, in all respects, in proper condition for use. The Election Inspectors shall also ensure that the configuration of the voting area provides for voter privacy.
6. Each optical scan voting machine shall remain locked against voting, and the paper ballots cast through the optical scan voting machine shall be secured and retained, for the period of thirty days following the meeting, election or vote at which same has been used and as much longer as may be necessary or advisable because of existing or threatened contest over the result of the meeting, election or vote, except as otherwise provided by the Education Law of the State of New York.
7. Any proposition to be voted upon, when presented other than by the Board of Education, must be set forth in such manner as to conform to the requirements of the Education Law of the State of New York, and must be presented in a petition bearing the signatures of twenty-five (25) qualified voters, or 5% of the number of qualified voters voting in the previous annual vote - whichever is greater, of the School District (except where the number of signatures is specified in said Education Law in which case the provisions of the Education Law shall apply) and filed with the Board of Education not less than sixty (60) days before the meeting, election or vote, unless otherwise prescribed by law.

NEW BUSINESS-continued...**A. Rules for Use of Optical Scan Voting Machines**

8. Any question or proposition to be presented by the Board of Education must be set forth in a resolution adopted at a meeting of the Board not less than fourteen (14) days prior to the meeting, election or vote, except as to a question or proposition required by law to be stated in the published notice of the meeting, election or vote, in which event such resolution must be adopted at a meeting of the Board not less than fifty (50) days before the meeting, election or vote, except that the fifty (50) day time limitation shall not apply to a special meetings called under the provisions of Section 2007 subdivision 3, paragraph a. of the Education Law of the State of New York.
9. In the event that any question or proposition to be voted upon is too lengthy to be placed upon the ballot to be used in conjunction with the optical scan voting machines, an abstract of such question or proposition shall be placed thereon in such form as may be prescribed by the Board of Education of the District, concisely stating the purpose and effect and setting forth and indicating generally and briefly the subject matter of the question or proposition. Wherever the question is excessively lengthy as above described, a sufficient number of copies thereof shall be available at the voting place in order that each voter may be furnished with a copy thereof before voting.
10. Except as may be otherwise required by law, the District Clerk shall have sole discretion in determining when optical scan voting machines shall be used. Paper ballots may be used if so determined by the District Clerk, including under circumstances where optical scan voting machines are unavailable or not operational, in which case the use of paper ballots shall be consistent with applicable legal requirements, as well as consistent with these Rules to the extent practicable as determined by the District Clerk.

RESOLVED, that the basic budget for the Sweet Home Central School District of Amherst and Tonawanda (“the District”) for the fiscal year commencing July 1, 2026 and ending June 30, 2027, as presented by the Board of Education, is hereby approved and adopted, and the required funds therefor are hereby appropriated and the necessary real property taxes required shall be raised by a tax on the taxable property in the District to be levied and collected as required by law.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE, that applications for absentee ballots may be obtained from the Office of the School District Clerk, 1901 Sweet Home Road, Amherst, New York, or on the District website at www.sweethomeschools.org. A list of persons to whom absentee ballots have been issued will be available in the Office of the School District Clerk on each of the five days prior to the election during regular office hours Monday through Friday, 8:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. Completed applications for absentee ballots must be received by the School District Clerk’s Office on or before May 12, 2026 if the absentee ballot is to be mailed to the voter for completion. Applications may be filed on or before May 18, 2026 if the absentee ballot is to be picked up by the voter at the District Clerk’s Office. Completed absentee ballots must be received by the District Clerk’s Office by 5:00 p.m. on the day of the vote.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE, that military voters who are qualified voters of the School District may apply for a military ballot by requesting an application from the District Clerk or via the District website, www.sweethomeschools.org. For a military voter to be issued a military ballot, the District Clerk must have received a valid ballot application no later than 4:00 pm on April 23, 2026. In a request for a military ballot application or ballot, the military voter may indicate their preference for receiving the application or ballot by mail, facsimile transmission or electronic mail.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE, that the petitions nominating candidates for the office of member of the Board of Education must be filed with the Clerk of the District between the hours of 8:00 a.m. (EDST) and 5:00 p.m. (EDST) no later than Monday, April 20, 2026. Each petition shall be signed by at least twenty-five (25) qualified voters of the District, or 2% of the number of qualified voters voting in the 2025 annual vote - whichever is greater, and shall state the name and residence of the candidate, and shall state the residence of each signer.

TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that optical scan voting machines will be used to record the votes on the Board election, the budget, and the other proposition(s) presented, pursuant to the District’s Rules for the Use of Voting Machines and the Submission of Questions of Propositions to be Placed Thereon. Printed copies of the Rules are available at the Office of the District Clerk located at 1901 Sweet Home Road, Amherst, New York.

INFORMATIONAL ITEMS

J. Coleman: With March being Women's History Month, Summer and I put together a wall in front of the senior lounge titled, "Who Runs the World? Girls", a play on Beyoncé's song. There are multiple influential women of all races, with a quote from them listed about the power and strength women possess. The SpongeBob musical was last week. The cast has been rehearsing since November, and it was a great show to see. We actually have four members in Student Government who performed. They all did a great job. Since about January, select seniors and juniors, with many being involved in student government, have been going to the middle school twice a month for the peer mentoring program. We have lunch with some students from each grade and play games, discuss goals, and check up on their progress. I feel it's very beneficial for middle school students to have someone older to talk to and guide them toward the right direction for their education. It's also been great for us to see improvements some students are making already and how they're destined to do better. The next time we'll be over there is actually Thursday the 19th. Last week, members of the Student ACT Committee went over to Daemen College for the regional Challenge 2 Change event hosted there, along with other schools. I got to spend time with them, talk with the kids, work with the kids on a few things, and then after that Dr. Ginestre and Danyelle Anthon joined me, and we took a tour of the school and talked to a lot of the staff. It was a great use of our time.

A. Battaglia: Just two quick notes for me. I was able to pop over to the Challenge 2 Change at Daemen. They're getting ready for board member elections that are coming up. They had some students there from their leadership team who did a presentation. They were so cute. They did a presentation requesting funds to help them put on their leadership day. They did a really great job. They were going to talk about that amongst themselves in terms of the PTA. The Northtown Community Center was there. They have so many great programs. They're just trying to get the word out. They're meeting with all the different PTAs and just really talking it up. D. Rabenold: I was able to attend the Heritage Heights PTA meeting a week or so ago. A lot of the meeting focused on parents in the classroom, and that led to, for me at least, an understanding of what the BLT and the PLT have to do with any of that and the kind of relationships between the PTA and those other groups. So again, that took up a good hour worth of conversation. I think we ended up with what is the policy, and we'll adhere to the policy, and if there are some exceptions, that should go back through the building principal, and again, he participated in that and wants to have a follow-up conversation with me. A good part of the meeting was centered around their multicultural night and the many things they've got planned which is beyond just food and drinks and various people coming in and discussing their cultures, and so I was very happy to hear that. So, thank you for that. I had a little bit of hesitation earlier because I don't appreciate the fact that this (personnel addition) was given to us at the last minute, and I did have a little discussion with Michael. So, we see eye to eye on that. I also wanted to understand a little bit more about the candidate and her new position, her strengths, and her ability to push back on some of the junk that comes out of Albany and State Ed. I'm pretty satisfied with that. So, I think I can move on and vote in the affirmative here.

B. Laible: I attended the finance committee for the Erie County Association of School Boards, where David (Lowrey) was there, and we reviewed the budget. I think the one thing I want to mention to the Board here is that it's been 12 years now without an increase in dues. Kudos to Dave and his team for being able to put on such great programming and maintaining the cost. We know how things have gone up, and so they've done a real good job of being efficient, and being able to maintain, and have such good programming. I did attend the High School Musical. I was not overly familiar with SpongeBob, but I have a new appreciation for the cartoon and I was really impressed with the students, the music, all that. It was just outstanding. I thought the theme really was a good one as well, and it was a very positive story of working together and kind of fitting in with some of the ideas of diversity and inclusion in that. I also attended the athletic committee meeting this month. We began initial discussion and looked at plans for the baseball and softball fields at very early stages. What's impressive about that is we had coaches and members of that committee that are providing feedback that is very practical, down to things like foul balls and where they get hit and netting and those kinds of things, so that the architects can put together an initial draft of some renderings and that. So, I think it was a good first start for that committee. And again, this just focused on softball and baseball. Obviously, there are other fields that we'll be looking at down the road and ultimately come to the board for review and discussion.

P. Bellanti: I attended the Athletic Council meeting as well. Brian pretty much summed it all up. I did attend the play on Sunday afternoon. It's always fun to watch when, you know, you have kids in high school and watch their friends perform. So, very brave souls up there in front of everybody.
