Napa, California, located approximately 50 miles from San Francisco, serves as the economic and cultural hub of the globally famous Napa Valley wine region. With a total estimated population of approximately 76,900 residents, the city maintains a unique blend of sophisticated urban amenities and scenic natural beauty along the Napa River.

The demographic composition is notably diverse, with the two largest ethnic groups being White (Non-Hispanic) at roughly 50% and Hispanic or Latino at about 42%, reflecting the community's varied influences and workforce. The median age in Napa is approximately 41.2 years, indicating a mature population base, and the city is composed of roughly 40,136 households, underscoring its established residential character within Northern California's thriving economy.

New Technology High School in Napa, California is the founding school of the New Tech Network system of schools. There are now over 180 of these schools across the United States and on two other continents that are modeled after our program.

Classes at New Tech require students to master both content and 21st century skills through project-based learning. Students are asked to solve complex real-world problems and present or display their findings to a public audience. All project work is tied directly to developing student learning outcomes and these outcomes are assessed using detailed rubrics.

In partnership with Napa Valley College, students at New Technology High School are expected to complete college classes as part of their graduation requirements. In 2023, New Technology High School was awarded an Early College and Middle College (MCEC) Grant. With this grant will come increased communication, articulation, opportunity between New Technology High School and Napa Valley College, as well as support for all students enrolled at New Tech High.

Early College High School

New Tech's early high school program integrates college coursework into the high school curriculum, allowing students to earn both a high school diploma and college credits simultaneously. This program is offered in partnership with Napa Valley College to help students get a head start on college and career goals

Additional Graduation Requirements

All NTHS students complete Community Service, School Service and a 60-hour Internship.

Special Programs: Seal of Biliteracy, Early College High School in partnership with Napa Valley College (NVC)

Leadership: ASB Student Leadership, and peer tutoring program, NVC Ambassadors Program

Counseling & Wellness: School counselor, social worker and full-time Wellness Center

Graduation and College Enrollment: The graduation rate stands at 100%, with 48% meeting the A-G requirements for UC or CSU admission.
