Important Deadlines for Tuition Affordability Assistance

Education Freedom Accounts for 2026/27: Deadline June 1

The application window for Education Freedom Accounts (Tuition Vouchers) for the 2026/27 school year will remain open only through June 1, 2026. The Department of Education is encouraging families to complete the renewal process as soon as possible to help ensure their place in the program for the upcoming school year.

Students that participated this year and want to renew their application to participate next year must complete this process through their ClassWallet account. Students that are new to the program will complete their application at <http://arkansasefa.com>.

ACE Scholarships: Deadline April 15

ACE Scholarships is a privately funded program that can provide partial scholarships to attend private school and is based on a family's financial situation. Family household income may not exceed 350% of the federal poverty level for a household of their size. Standard ACE award amounts are \$3,000 for grades K-8 and \$4,000 for grades 9 – 12.

For more information, and to submit an ACE Scholarship application, go to ACE Scholarships - Arkansas. Applications will be accepted only through April 15.

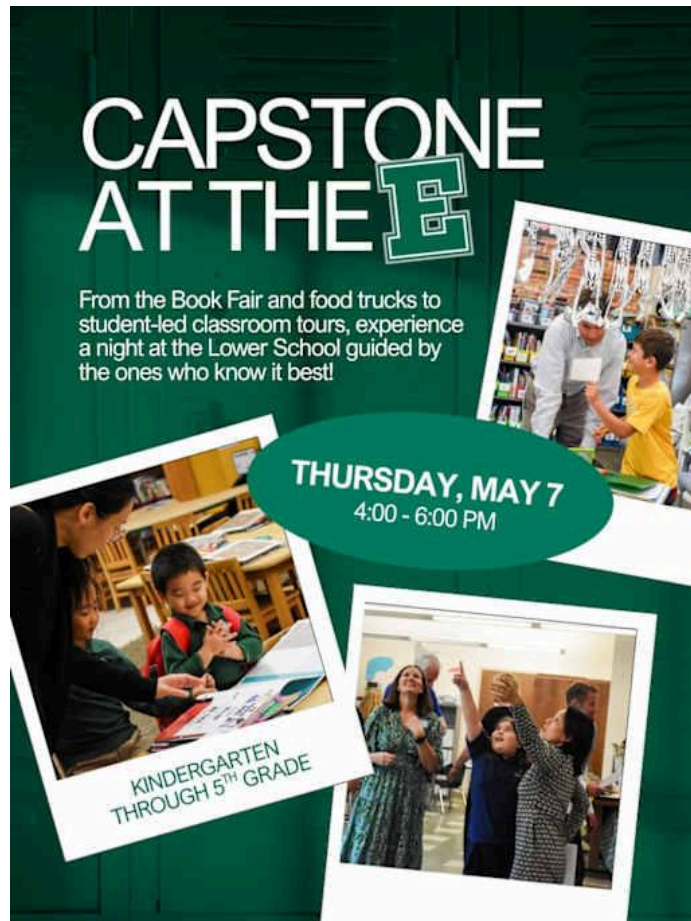

A Note from Dr. McCormick

Dear Families,

I hope that you were able to enjoy some quality time with your kids this past week! This week is Holy Week, and at Middle School Morning Meeting I encouraged students to stick with their Lenten resolutions and/or take time this week to perform charitable acts around the house or for teachers or classmates here at our school. Spring, too, seems to have arrived, and spring sports are going full tilt, with track, soccer, and lacrosse events happening virtually every day of the week. Additionally, students are preparing for the musical and end-of-year concerts. It is a busy but fun time to be at our school. Today, for instance, our percussionists are performing in Chapel, which is just one of the energizing events that we get treated to here at Episcopal Collegiate!

ERB Testing - 6th and 7th Grade Students

6th and 7th grade students will take ERB CTP-V standardized testing April 13th-15th. This testing will run from approximately 8:00am to 12:10pm each day. Please make sure students arrive to school on time and minimize appointments during those testing times. Missed testing will not be made up.

PSAT for 8th Graders

Students in grades 8-10 will take PSAT 8/9 & PSAT10 on Thursday, April 16th. This testing will run from approximately 8:00 am to 11:00. Please make sure students arrive on time on those days and minimize appointments during those testing times.

Reminder: Community Service Hours

Every middle school student needs to complete five hours of community service prior to the conclusion of each school year. These hours need to be documented on a Community Service Form (where the organization sponsor signs to verify participation) and turned in to Mrs. Britt in the Middle School office by April 15. Students who need ideas about how to complete their service hours should consult their advisors or Dr. McCormick.

7th Grade Vaccine Reminder

This is a reminder that when kids enter 7th grade they are required to have a meningococcal vaccine (Usually called Menactra, MENVEO, or MemACYW). Most students get both meningococcal and Tdap vaccines when they turn 11. If you are unsure if your kids had the vaccine, reach out to their pediatrician or Nurse Hopkins to see if they are up to date.



Reminder: Procedure for Obtaining an Excused Absence

If your child has to miss a full day of school or more, their adults need to email Dr. McCormick requesting the given time off and do so at least one week in advance. After this has been approved, the student will collect a Planned Absence Form from the Middle School Office, take it around to their teachers whose classes they will be missing for their signatures, and then bring it back to the Middle School office for Dr. McCormick's signature. They will also be given a copy to take with them.

At this visit they will get their second meningococcal (booster) dose that is required for students who are 16 years of age or older on or after September 1, 2025.
