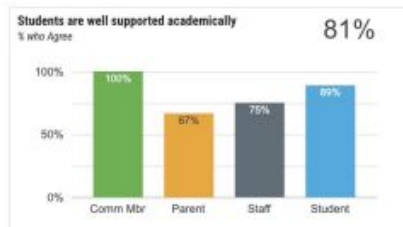
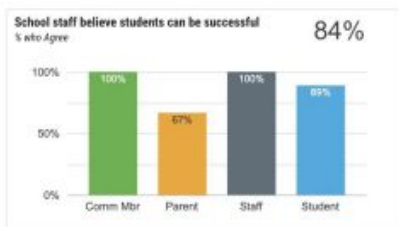


Parent and family engagement received the lowest score in this area



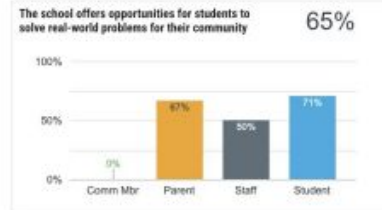
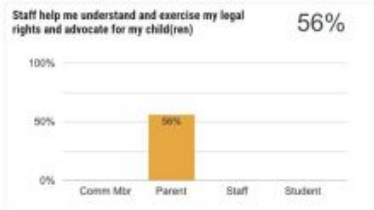

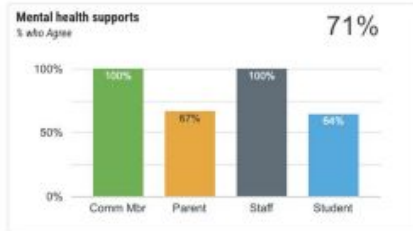

Getting along well with others and bullying and harassment are the lowest



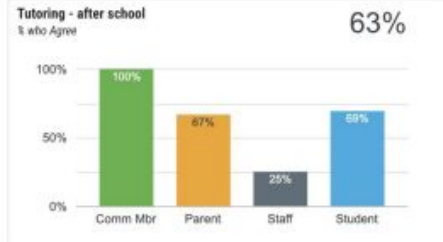
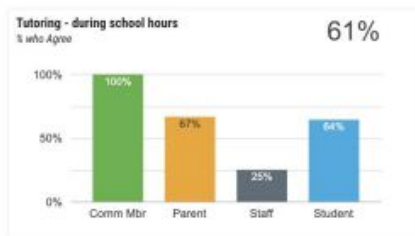


Supports for Students
