VI. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

1. Intermunicipal Agreement GVBOCES/Dr. Chenaille spoke about the resolution to approve the GVBOCES IMA. She stated that voting to approve the IMA was not a vote to authorize the GVBOCES capital project, but that the resolution allows Cal-Mum to have some autonomy over financing the project. Dr. Chenaille also mentioned that eventually we would need to decide if we are going to be a polling place for the vote for the GVBOCES capital project.

VIII. NEW BUSINESS

1. Budget Presentation #2 of the Proposed 2026-2027 Annual School Budget/Dr. Chenaille and Mr. Colwell shared the second budget presentation which included the Instructional Budget and the Capital Outlay Project
2. Approval of Intermunicipal Agreement
Motion by Bickford seconded by McNear the Resolution of the Caledonia-Mumford Central School District Board of Education, whereas, Genesee Valley BOCES is proposing a “Capital Improvement Project” to include additions, alterations, and improvements at the Batavia and Mount Morris campuses, and may include the purchase and/or donation of real property; and whereas, the funding for the \$42,885,649.39 capital improvement project is proposed to be secured through an intermunicipal agreement (IMA) between Genesee Valley BOCES and its twenty-two (22) component districts and, whereas, the Caledonia-Mumford Central School District wishes to enter into the IMA to fund their share of the project and, now, therefore, be it resolved, that Caledonia-Mumford Central School District, approves the IMA for its share of \$1,721,173.00 of the total projected project cost of \$42,885,649.39. Further, it is understood the IMA shall be circulated to the twenty-two (22) component districts for their consideration. Should a district not vote in favor of the IMA, the BOCES will pursue financing through the Dormitory Authority of the State of New York via a resolution that will be put up for public vote and must be approved by the majority of total voters for the project and the financing to be approved. Be it further resolved that Caledonia-Mumford Central School District Board President is authorized to sign the IMA.

Motion by McNear seconded by Roll that the Board of Education, whereas, Education Law Section 3012-d and Subpart 30-2 of the regulations of the commissioner of Education require that administrators receive specific training as a condition of performing teacher and principal evaluations pursuant to that section and subpart, and whereas, administrators so trained are eligible to be designated by this Board as “Evaluators” and “Lead Evaluators,” thereby authorizing the performance of evaluations pursuant to that section and subpart, and whereas, certain Partnership administrators have received the required training, now therefore be it hereby resolved, pursuant to Education Law Section 3012-c and Sections 30-2.2 and 30-2.9 of the regulations of the Commissioner, that the following Partnership administrators are certified as “Evaluators” and “Lead Evaluators,”
